Penn state library database

Penn State Alumni Association members have free access to the following content and licensed databases. The use of external search engines or robots to systematically copy or copy unreatably large amounts of data from these products is prohibited. For access, use your Penn State Alumni Association 10-digit member ID and last name as the password to log in to the site. Join the Alumni Association. Need help checking in? Adam Matthew publishes unique primary resource collections from archives around the world. The collections cover a wide range of topics in the humanities and social sciences. The themes mentioned are Field Studies, Cultural Studies, Empire and Globalism, Ethnic Studies, Gender and Sexuality, History, Literature, Politics, Theatre, War and Conflict. Search all of Penn State's collections through the AMexplorer search box or browse the list of links. The first contact with the civil rights movement of the twentieth century is a digital collection that provides ideas about American Indians and European/American relations. Primary source materials including manuscripts, artwork, photographs, interactive maps, printed materials and newspapers. The original documents were exchanged between the governors of the British colonies of North America and the Caribbean and the Colonial Office in England. Among the correspondence are di di di di di di dimes, maps, broad sides, laws, public warnings, newspaper clips and more covering all aspects of seventeenth- and eighteenth-century American history. Most documents are handwritten and the keyword is not searchable. Searchable by date, name, region, and topics; early settlement, Indians, Trade, Wars, Slavery and slave trade. Penn State has access to a reference source for its research into Module 1: Early Settlement, Expansion and Competition, and Module 2: The American government toward revolution, politics, history, public policy and current affairs. Academic Search Complete is a comprehensive scientific, multidisciplinary full-text database with more than 5,300 full-text periodic publications, including 4,400 peer-reviewed journals. In addition to full text, this database offers indexing and summaries for a total of 10,900 publications, including more than 9,300 journals and monographs, reports, conference papers, etc. Most PDF content and full-text titles dating back to 1865 are in local (searchable) PDF format in the database. The database is provided by pennsylvania state university libraries and the PSU Alumni Association (50/50 divided funding). Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center, 17. About 60,000 images of original sources (mana mana and printed materials) documenting the history of exploration, cultural contact and colonialism. Topics include class and economic aspects of empire, religion, art and empire. These old limited British government documents provide unprecedented levels of detail on one of the most turbulent periods in Chinese history: all British Foreign Office files related to China, Hong Kong and Taiwan between 1919 and 1948. JSTOR is a non-profit organization with a dual mission to create and maintain a reliable archive of important scientific journals and to gain as widespread access to them as possible. The content at JSTOR covers many disciplines, especially humanities and social sciences. Database provided by Pennsylvania State University Libraries. Mergent Archives is an online database with access to more than 180,000 collections of enterprise and industry-related documents, including Annual Reports. This collection is primarily useful for historical research and also includes the Mergent Patent Archives, a collection of 9.2 million patents going back to the mid-1800s. The database also includes the Country Report module: DnB Country Risk Profile, DnB Country Risk Line Report, and Mergent Country Profile. It also includes D&B Industry Norms and Key Business Rates that provides data on more than 100 million private companies. Basic Business Rates on the Web provide access to the industry's financial norms and rates. These industry criteria are compiled from Dun & Bradstreet's database of public and private companies. MergentOnline (formerly FISonline) is a subscription-based service that provides information on more than 15,000 U.S. government companies and 30,000 non-U.S. companies. public companies. MergentOnline is manufactured by Mergent, Inc., formerly known as Moody's. Mergent/Moody's has been a publisher of detailed job descriptions, company his hisdies and financial statements since 1900. This investment research database provides information about stocks, mutual funds and foreign exchange trading funds. Subscription stocks and mutual funds include access to Morningstar Analysts Reports. Focusing on important collections of original archival material (manoema, typewriter and ephemera) from major libraries in the UK and America, Adam Matthew provides the basic resources to allow students and academics to examine these issues thoroughly and firsthand: Changing Lifestyles, 1950-1975 Youth Culture, Student Protests, Mai '68, Popular Culture; TV; Music; Movies, Civil Rights; Women's Liberation; Minority Groups, Space Race. Consumerism; Credit Credit Computers, Vietnam War, Nuclear Disarmament. Search hundreds of scientific journals for full-text articles in humanities, arts and social sciences journals. More than 1,000 high-level business publications-keyword search or full-text articles in news, feature articles and in-depth analysis from newspapers, commercial publications, journals and scientific journals. The database is provided by pennsylvania state university libraries and the PSU Alumni Association (50/50 divided funding). Located at Fisk University from 1943 to 1970, the Department of Racial Relations and its annual Institute were established by the American Association of Missionaries to investigate problem areas in race relations and to educate communities and develop methods to prevent conflicts. Johnson, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Thurgood Marshall. Sage Business Researcher is a collection of original in-depth reports on timely topics in business and management. Reports are published every two weeks. Provides full-text access to more than 730 Sage logs. It's a gateway to SAGE reference publications (encyclopedias and manuals) and EBooks penn state has purchased. It also contains a Collection of CQ Historical Documents. It is a research methods tool created to assist researchers, faculty and students in research projects. SAGE Research Methods connects SAGE's famous book, magazine and reference content to more than 100,000 pages with truly advanced search and discovery tools. Job Statistics provides access to historical, current and projected demographic and industry hands at the state, county, zip code and metropolitan statistical area level. Data is especially useful for business plan projects and market research assignments. Current and past news articles from four of the most respected national newspapers: The New York Times (including The Magazine and Book Review), The Washington Post, The Los Angeles Times and The Christian Science Monitor.
