In fact, anchoring a ship can be more dangerous than landing an airplane. Why would I do that? Before being able to dock your ship safely, the skipper must avoid all dangers in each port. It should take into account the underwater arus, trying not to collide with other vessels. It must also bypass shoals, corals or sunken ships hidden in the water. And, even harder, that port he does not yet know. To help solve these problems, a wise skipper can use the services of a ship's guide or pilot, well known to local waters. The guide will stand next to the skipper on the bridge and provide trusted briefings. Together they pay attention to the dangers and direct the ship along a narrow path to the port. The very valuable briefing from the guide illustrates the valuable help available to young Christians in wading through this difficult life. What is this form of help? Why do teenagers need it? Let's continue the illustration of the ship. As a teenager, you were like a skipper because you finally had to take responsibility for your life. And, your parents behave like guides because they are trying to guide you through the most difficult situations you are going to face in life. However, in this adolescence, you may find it hard to take advice from your parents. Why would I do that? The problem often lies in the heart. Your heart may encourage you to crave the taboo or protest against the restrictions given to you. The inclination of the human heart, says the Bible, has been evil since its youth. (Genesis 8:21) Jehovah explains that you will face a very difficult task. He warned: The heart is the most cunning in the world and reckless. (Jeremiah 17:9) In addition to harboring false desires, the heart can fool a teenager into thinking that he knows better than his actual parents much more experienced. However, there are good reasons to seek help from parents while wading through a difficult adolescence. Why obey your parents? The main reason the newbie's family, Jehovah, tells you that you should listen to your parents' briefings. By appointing parents to take care of you, God gave you this advice: Children! As followers of Christ, obey your parents because that is what you should do. James, despite his adult life, realized that he had to follow his father's orders not to marry women who were not Jehovah's Faiths. Of course, Jacob also noticed that his brother's decision to marry the unbelievers Kanan had caused his parents heartache. -Genesis 27:46. In addition to God's duty to guide you, Christian parents are by far the most qualified be your counselor, especially since they know you very well and must have shown their unselfish love over the years. As a guide, they speak based on experience. They themselves experienced different desires related to youth. And as true Christians, they already see the benefits of following biblical principles. -2 Timothy 2:22. With the help of such an experienced person near you, you are helped to successfully cope with the most difficult situations. For example, about your relationship with the opposite sex. But loving parents will protect you from oving with young children who do not respect God's standards. Laura admits that curiosity can deter teens from seeing danger. When my classmates told me they went to a disco all night with the cool guys, they described it as an unforgettable experience. I know they are often exaggerating, but I'm still curious and think I missed a lot of fun. Although I knew that my parents' ban on travel to these places was correct, I still felt tempted. Caroline recalls the difficulties she had a few years ago: Since the age of 13, my friends have had boyfriends, and for a few years I have been under constant pressure to emulate them. For hours he listened to me, exchanged thoughts with me, and helped me see the need to put off with a girlfriend until I got older. Like Caroline's mother, your parents may feel obligated to warn you against the pressure of a friend or even to prevent you from doing certain activities or playing with certain friends. Nathan remembers conflicting with his parents on these issues several times. Friends often invite me to go with them, he explains, but my parents don't let me socialize with a lot of young people and not go to big, uncontrollable parties. At the time I didn't understand why other parents were softer than my parents. However, Nathan later realized. I know that stupidity is related to the hearts of boys like me,' he said. This stupidity can easily occur if the boys get together. One child is more of a joker, and the third child will be a much bigger prankster. Soon everyone came together. Even young people who claim to serve Jehovah may fall in this loop. -Proverbs 10:15 p.m. Both Nathan and Maria Jose are in an internal war when their parents do not allow the invitation of friends. (1 King 18:21; 1 John 2:15) Why would that be? Because we have a penchant for sin. Our imperfect desires can become stronger if we continue to follow them. The heart will ask and ask again. (Jeremiah 17:9) As soon as we begin to drift spiritually, the influence of this world will be greater on us. (Heb. 2:1) Maybe you don't realize that you are spiritually oblique, but most likely Christian parents can see it. Sure, your parents may not be as guick as you are at learning computer programs, but they know a lot more than you do about reckless hearts. And they want to help you lead your heart along the path that can lead to life. -Proverbs 23:19. Of course, you can't expect your parents to have the perfect focus when they need to provide guidance on complex issues such as music, entertainment and makeup. Your parents may not be as wise as Solomon, or like lov. As boat guides, they can sometimes go wrong and be too careful. However, their guidance will go a long way if you pay attention to your father's discipline and don't waive your mother's law. -Parables 1:8, 9. Other young children can humiliate their parents. However, if your parents work hard to follow the Bible, they are by your side in the e-er, times, and adversity.
