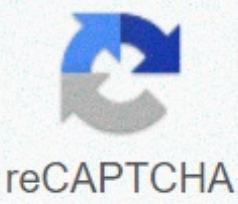

## Grcity us utility agreement form

City of Walker is a customer community of the City of Grand Rapids for public water and sewerage services. For this reason, public water and sewerage bills are billed for properties in the city of Walker and collected by the City of Grand Rapids Water Department. City of Walker only gets involved in the billing process if an account remains unpaid for over 90 days, and Grand Rapids overlooks that account of Walker as permitted by contract between the two cities and state of Michigan law. The water and/or sewerage service liens for monthly and quarterly bills is achieved by calling the City of Grand Rapids Water System Customer Service Center at 616.456.3200. Overdue utility bill amounts owed to the City of Walker can be obtained by calling or emailing walker Treasurer's office. Connect the public water and/or sewerage system To connect to the public water and/or sewerage system, the owner must follow three steps. Contact Walker Treasurer's office to get a \$2 water and sewage connection declaration. In some cases, the property will also owe a deferred water or sewerage fee. This fee must be paid before Walker can issue the declaration. Contact the City of Grand Rapids Water Department (phone 616.456.3041) to get and pay for the connection fee and to schedule the connection. Grand Rapids will drive a lateral from the main to the edge of the property line at the end of the road straight way. Grand Rapids will not continue with this connection without the Walker Statement mentioned above. Contact an independent plumber to drive the side road from the house or building to the road to the right of the road to connect to the Grand Rapids lateral. Wells and septic The Kent County Health Department is responsible for managing wells and for properties located in the city of Walker. The Ministry of Health's phone number is 616,632,6900. Sale of property The city of Walker does not require a property to be connected to the public water and/or sewerage systems as a condition of a property sale. However, the Kent County Health Department may require a connection to the public system depending on the status of the well and septic systems. In addition, some mortgage companies and/or types of mortgages may require affiliation with the public system as a condition of the mortgage. Thank you for your participation!
