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Fountas and Pinnell Reading Levels (commonly referred to as Pinnell's Fountas) is a reading level system developed by Irene Fountas and Gay Su Pinnell to support their managed reading method. Reading text is classified by different parameters, such as the number of words, the number of different words, the number of high-frequency words, the length of the sentence, the complexity of the sentence, the repetition of words, the support of illustrations, etc. Although the classification is guided by these parameters, the type of syllable, which is an important factor at the beginning of reading, is not considered as part of the alignment system. Small books containing a combination of text and illustration are then given to teachers for each level. While young children demonstrate a wide spread of reading skills, each level is pre-linked to the school class. Some schools accept targeted reading levels for their students. This is a class equivalency chart recommended by Fountas and Pinnell. Evaluation provides valuable information about reading accuracy, understanding, fluency and more. This is just one tool used to identify your child's strengths and weaknesses. They read a combination of fiction and non-fiction books, recorded errors, and asked questions to assess the understanding of the text. Students should be able to verbalize their thoughts for this type of assessment. Expected growth for 1 year may be hundredths of 3-4 levels; so if they fail to make these gains each year they will have extreme difficulties in reaching the level of expectation assessment. These levels have been tracked for several years; so it's unrealistic to think that they can catch up with a level class in one year if they start the year reading several levels below the grade level. Part of the understanding includes 3 types of questions, and students can score from 1-3 in each area: In the text-retell or summarize the story and identify the problem. In addition to text, it indicates your child's ability to connect to their own experiences with the story and draw conclusions about characters or events. Self-correcting self-correction rate 1:4 means that the student corrects approximately 1 out of every 4 errors made during reading. If a student has a score of 1:4 or less, it means that he/she controls or corrects his reading on his own. This lets you know that they are very knowledgeable about their reading abilities. The fluency of fluency is how smoothly your child reads with expression and meaning. Precision Speed This is a percentage of words to read correctly or accurately. The level of accuracy of training can fall between 90-100%. We also take note of the assessment of fluency in determining the overall level. For example, if a student read A level J with an accuracy of 94 percent and had a satisfactory understanding (estimate 5), then we would determine that the student is a J level.
