Since the beginning of the new millennium, it has been in a wave of radical transformation. For auto majors, it is no longer about pursuing sales growth and higher margins due to scale, international expansion and outsourcing. A federal grand jury is looking into possible Medicare and investor fraud at the Woburn, Massachusetts-based firm, and there is a possibility that criminal charges will be brought against the company and at least some of its senior officials. jury to several people close to the company. However, PolyMedica PolyMedica Founder and CEO Lee insists: No one contacted us. No one has accused us of any wrongdoing. PolyMedica, through its Liberty Medical division, sells diabetes testing equipment and other medical supplies, mostly by direct mail and mainly to Medicare patients. The company's commercial representative, actor Wilfred Brimley, can be heard hawking his glucose test strips on television and radio hundreds of times a day, noticing that Medicare or your insurance carrier will be billed directly. People close to the matter say the FBI has contacted 20 to 30 current and former PolyMedica employees in the past few months. Some of the people contacted by the FBI have accepted immunity from prosecution in exchange for their testimony. The agency confirms it is investigating. The Securities and Exchange Commission also asks questions about PolyMedica and collects documents. People with knowledge of the company say that the U.S. Postal Service is involved as well, regarding possible mail fraud. The news of the PolyMedica investigation should not surprise Barron's readers. Last fall, we broke a story about an FBI probe into alleged Medicare fraud (Diagnosis pending, November 20). Since then, the company's shares have fallen to 30.59 from 52 - a decline of 41%, although they have risen by 80% from a low of 17 in March. Interviews with people close to the investigation say that the FBI told them potential charges against PolyMedica could be criminal, and that they centered around company billing and general business practices. Eighty percent of PolyMedica's revenue comes from Medicare, a balance from major insurers like Aetna. Warren C. Trowbridge, who manages Liberty Medical, the company's largest division, and is one of PolyMedica's most senior officers, has had Medicare fraud brushes before. Between December 1997 and February 1999, just before he joined Liberty, Trowbridge was president of Transworld Healthcare, an American company that has a large diabetic unit, MK Diabetes Support Services. Trowbridge managed MK from November 1994 to December 1997. In August 2000, Transworld agreed to pay \$10 million to the federal government to settle a lawsuit that was filed by a whistleblower under the False Claims Act in 1997, alleging Medicare fraud. The case alleged that Transworld engaged in the systematic deception of Medicare and other government-funded health insurance programs, claiming and causing excessive reimbursement as part of a nationwide marketing scheme. One person questioned by the FBI recalls that the agency asked specifically: Do you know Trowbridge has been involved in Medicare fraud in the past? Contacted by Barron, Trowbridge said he had nothing to do with the suit and that he never had conversations with regulators. In fact, he says he changed the system of commissions for the sale of Transworld Transworld bring it into line with Medicare. PolyMedica's problems are broader in scope than transworld. Customers often supplied products they didn't order, people say. Indeed, several people told Barron that orders were even sent to people who are known to have died. I know they're going to go to dead people,' says one. And while these products often come back, another person says: More than 90% of returns are not returned by Medicare. As an explanation, Lee says, If you deliver 120,000 units a month, you'll be delivered to someone who's dead, because no one will call you and say, I'm going to die on Tuesday. Lee adds that PolyMedica had some problems with Medicare refunds, but only because its computer systems were more advanced than those used to handle Medicare refunds: We were always ready, willing, and able to return the money. We've been waiting for them to accept it. Employees tried time and time again to inform Lee, Trowbridge and others of inappropriate activities at the company. These reports and criticisms, some of which were reviewed by Barron, were sometimes met with silence or reprimand. One of the reasons that billing and return problems are so rampant, insiders say, is that PolyMedica's computer systems can be easily manipulated to create fake orders. Usually the last 10% or so to give or take from the sale of each month were for people who have never ordered a product, one person claims, and others close to the matter confirm. Let me tell you this way one person explains. Their target last month was like 100,000 orders. There were 10,000 orders on Friday. But magically, and curiously by the end of the day on Saturday, they have these 10,000 orders. Asked if it was possible that 10,000 orders could be booked in one day, the person replied: It's almost physically impossible. Typically, the company orders 3,500 orders a day, the person said. In addition, some witnesses say that the company sometimes loads trucks with products from its warehouses, only for trucks to sit in the warehouse parking lot. These steps, they say, allow the company to achieve certain sales and delivery goals. They booked sales in the previous month, says an insider. They do it all the time. Lee and Trowbridge both deny that PolyMedica's book sales are wrong. According to estimates of a number of current and former employees of PolyMedica, up to 15% of the company's business is fraudulent. The problems, they say, are perpetuated in part because the sales team should not return commissions for returned sales. While sellers were once allowed to keep some of their commissions on returned sales, Lee says the practice has stopped. This is highly ethical, he adds.
