Android only: Creating folders on your home screen and then finding and dragging apps into them, not fast and accurate. The app organizer and his broader cousin Folder Organizer make it much easier to create and access packages of apps, contacts, and bookmarks. Instead of creating a folder and doing a lot of scrolling and dragging to fill it out, Apps Organizer lets you create Labels, which you can then add apps from one list of your device's apps. The organizer comes with multiple labels pre-loaded, but you'll probably want to create your own, give them a unique icon (from stock selection or own images), and place an icon where you want from shortcuts or menu widgets.
