Intellectual property rights are usually divided into two main areas: (i) copyright and copyright rights. The rights of authors of literary and artistic works (such as books and other works, musical compositions, paintings, sculpture, computer programs and films) are protected by copyright for at least 50 years after the author's death. In addition, the copyright and related (sometimes called neighboring) rights are the rights of performers (e.g. actors, singers and musicians), producers of phonograms (sound recordings) and broadcasters. The protection of such decals is aimed at stimulating and ensuring fair competition and protecting consumers by enabling them to make informed choices between different goods and services. Other types of industrial property are protected primarily to stimulate innovation, design and technology creation. Inventions (protected by patents), industrial designs and trade secrets fall into this category. The social objective is to protect the results of investment in the development of new technologies, which provides incentives and resources for financing research and development activities. The current intellectual property regime should also facilitate the transfer of technology in the form of foreign direct investment, joint ventures and licensing. Protection is usually granted for the final period (usually 20 years in the case of patents).
