It was launched on January 11, 2011 as Eleven. It is owned by ElevenCo, which was established as a joint venture between Ten Network Holdings and ViacomCBS Domestic Media Networks; the latter will eventually acquire Network Ten in 2017. The channel focuses primarily on programming aimed at young adult audiences and is the current home of Neighbours, the longest-running drama series on Australian television. Before the launch of 10 Shake in September 2020, the channel also broadcast children's programs. History Prior to the launch of Ten Network Holdings, then an independent company, formed a joint venture called ElevenCo with international distributor CBS Studios International. Ten held two-thirds of the shares in the company, and CBS held the remaining stake. Under the agreement, Eleven gained access to programming from the CBS catalog back. Ten Network Holdings went into administration in 2017 and was subsequently acquired by CBS, ultimately giving CBS full ownership of Eleven. CBS eventually merged with Viacom, making 10 Peach Sisters chains MTV and Nickelodeon. On October 31, 2018, the channel was renamed 10 Peach as part of a larger rebranding of Network Ten. The new name is designed to provide clearer coverage for channel programming; Network 10 chief content officer Beverly McGarvey bizarrely described Peach as feeling relaxed and almost guilty of fun for viewers, with programs such as Neighbours, Supernatural, This Is Us, and Will and Grace, and would try to represent all that peachy fruit itself stood. Programming 10 Peach offers catch-up and encore presentations from Channel 10. It includes a mix of recurring old shows, new shows for Australian television, and shows that will make their debut on Australian free-to-air television. of the ten shows aimed at the young demographic, primarily the neighbors, were moved to eleven eleven launching a new channel. This was part of Theon's rebranding aimed at the elderly. The decision to move Neighbours and other shows was also to take place for the new current affairs show at 17:00-7:00 p.m. time slot. In 2015, Neighbours was Eleven's highest-rated program and Australia's number one regular on digital multichannels, with an average of 278,000 viewers. On February 27, 2012, Toasted TV was moved from Ten to Eleven due to a number of changes to their morning line-up that included the launch of Breakfast. On November 4, 2013, wake up and Studio 10, more Ten shows were rescheduled, including Totally Wild, Scope, Wurrawhy and Mako: Island of Secrets. Another first launch of Australian content on 10 Peach includes Couch Time, Loop and Bondi Ink Tattoo. On April 6, 2020, Nickelodeon's six-hour children's content program unit was added to the network, which was broadcast under the Toasted TV branding. That was until September 27, when children's programming was completely moved to 10 Shake. Toasted TV has been canceled, with its final episode airing On September 18. The channel was available to high-definition digital viewers through a network of 10 owned and operated stations. Multi-channel live broadcast of sports, entertainment, movies, documentaries, science fiction and news. The channel ceased broadcasting on March 25, 2009, and the next day was replaced by one (now known as 10 Bold). Following the government's decision to lift the SD Primary Channel restrictions, the channel returned as HD simultaneous on March 2, 2016 on Channel 13 and then on Channels 1 and 15 after adding 10 Shake from September 27, 2020. To make room for this, 10 Bold's HD channel is closed and 10 Bold has been reduced to two standard definitions (SD) channels. History Origins From 2002, it

was interspersed with a loop of high-definition demonstration material during working hours, for viewing in the salons of television retailers, at the end of the equivalent service Network Ten. The Breakaway era of Ten HD was officially announced on September 14, 2007, to replace the network with ten existing high definition services, simultaneous with its standard definition and analog services, through an amendment to the Broadcasting Services Act 1992 in 2006. An amendment to the Broadcasting (Digital Television) Act 2006 allowed television networks to run digital multi-channel channels, provided that they were broadcast exclusively in high-definition formats. Although it was originally supposed to be the first free commercial television channel introduced in megacities since 1988, the unexpected launch of Seven Media Group's HD offering, 7HD, on October 15, 2007, two months before the broadcast, meant that Ten HD was launched as the second multi-channel high-definition channel in Australia. On September 27, PBL Media announced the creation of a similar multichannel 9HD, which was launched on March 17, 2008. Ten's parent company, and shareholder of ozTAM's capital rating system, Ten Network Holdings Limited, have begun negotiations with the ratings system operator to have digital multi-channel channels such as 10HD and ABC Comedy included in the television ratings for the first time on September 17, 2007. In addition, on the same day it was announced that 10 News First will be 10 to ten HD, an hour delayed at 6pm to directly compete with seven news and nine news. This would see 10 news first officially broadcast at 6pm for the first time since 1992, 9 however, the timeslot was later changed to 5.30pm. In preparation for the launch of 10 HD, the Ten Digital Ground Channels lineup was updated on November 19, 2007, with changes consisting of LCN1 redirecting network 10 to the current high-definition simultaneous. After that, on November 21, 2007, Ten Network Holdings Limited announced that it would launch the channel on December 16, 2007 at 5 p.m., with the first program, Totally Wild. The opening night of Ten HD officially began broadcasting on December 16, 2007 with five metropolitan stations in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide and Perth. Before the official launch, at 5 p.m., the first program, Totally Wild, was shown. After that, for the first time since 1992, 9 10 News First and Sports Tonight were broadcast live with Seven News and Nine News, temporarily over time for thirty minutes until 5:30 p.m. and 6 p.m., respectively. The first official program on the night of launch began at 20:30, in 2001 the film Black Hawk Down. This was followed by bon jovi's Lost Highway Tour at 11:30 p.m. and Video Hits Presents: The Music of Supernatural at 12.25pm. Video of Hits Up-Late marked the end of the first night of transmission for 10HD at 12:50 a.m. Ahead of the premiere, the channel promised up to eleven hours of programming from ten o'clock in addition to fifty hours of exclusive programs that included live sports, entertainment, movies, documentaries, science fiction and news. It consisted of six films a week, in addition to National Geographic documentaries in the afternoon, from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., to music-oriented programs after the Sunday Night Movie, along with a prime-time break schedule on Thursdays and from 10:30 p.m. to 11:30 p.m. Monday through Wednesday. In addition to high-definition broadcasting on the first channel, Channel 11 introduced the 10HD version of high definition 10HD along with the standard definition of simultaneous broadcasting on Channel 11 as Ten SD2. The full simultaneous and launch of 10 Bold Since 2009 commercial networks in Australia have been allowed to broadcast the standard sub-channel definition. Instead of introducing a new digital service, Ten decided to relaunch Ten HD as a sports channel to be called One HD (now 10 Bold), and use its standard definition simultaneously on Channel 11 to broadcast the standard definition of the simultaneous name One SD. and only showed high-definition broadcasting of the existing ten digital services, along with several sports breakaway programs. Ten HD officially closed March 25 With one HD (now 10 bold) launch the next day. 2016 revival After the Nine Network resumed broadcasting 9HD in November 2015, 10 confirmed that it was working on a rebroadcast of Ten HD. However, they did not set a timeline, saying they were going through some technical and rights issues. On February 11, 2016, some smart TVs began receiving 10HD notifications through a ghost broadcast that soon disappeared. Ten later resumed simultaneous high-definition talks on March 2, 2016 on Channel 13 from 3pm, just in time for the 2016 Supercars season. As a result, One was reduced to a standard definition, broadcast on both Channel One and Channel 12. Ten uses MPEG-4 technology to broadcast Ten HD. Since September 21, 2016, NRN in north NSW has been transporting 10HD to South Cross property. The station will be sold at WIN until May 31, 2017, keeping 10 branding until play-out and transfers have been transferred to the WIN MediaHub facility next September, Programming Additional information: A list of programs broadcast by Network 10 Ten HD broadcast programming consisting of news, live sporting events, entertainment, movies, documentaries and science fiction. In addition to this, thematic programming lineups were broadcast on certain days, including Sci-Fi Saturday. The channel provided fifty hours of exclusive content per week, including up to eleven hours of time-shifted programming from Ten, as well as additional programs from popular ten franchises such as Australian Idol, The Biggest Loser and So You Think You Can Dance. Overseas programs on Ten HD included; Psycho, Battlestar Galactica, Cane, Condemnation, Eureka, Friday Night Lights, Traveler, One Tree Hill, There, Smallville, 4400, Bold and Beautiful, Shield and Veronica Mars. Late in the evening, exclusive series, movies and encore shows were broadcast. The late night broadcast series included X-Files, Charmed, JAG, Buffy the Vampire Slayer, Angel, NYPD Blue and Sex in the City. In addition to this, high-definition documentaries from National Geographic Channel and Granada Television are shown on weekdays from 3pm to 5pm News Additional information: 10 News First compete directly with seven news and nine news, ten HD broadcasts of local editions of Ten News, timeshifted on half an hour, weekdays at 5.30pm, allowing half of the second newsletter to compete with offers from other commercial networks. On weekends, the national bulletin was delayed by half an hour at 5:30 p.m., and Sports Today Ten HD at the same time as the early news and morning news, 6am and 11am respectively. In addition to this, the Australian Football League was simultaneous on the channel, with all of Ten's games filmed in high definition. Formula One and MotoGP races were televised on 10HD, usually on the tape of delays. Most of the 10HD sports content was retained after it was renewed as 10 Bold. Availability Of The Original Channel In its former beginning, Ten HD was available exclusively in 1080i high definition from a network of five metropolitan owned and operated stations, TEN Sydney, ATV Melbourne, TWW Brisbane, ADS Adelaide, and new Perth. The breakaway programs have never been available outside the metropolis, although Southern Cross Ten has planned to rebroadcast the service since mid-2009: instead, it launched the One service. Foxtel added the channel to its line-up for cable customers in June 2008, when the television subscription provider launched its Foxtel HD service. The Ten HD Revival Channel is only available in 1080i high-definition format. After its revival on March 2, 2016, Ten HD returned to 1080i50 high definition, but was broadcast in MPEG-4 as opposed to the standard MPEG-2 format. Ten HD covers all ten owned metropolitan stations as well as the Gold Coast (covered by its Brisbane station). It is also available to regional viewers via WIN Television on Channel 80 for Southern NSW, Regional Victoria, Regional NSW, Tasmania, Regional SA, Regional WA and Channel 50 for North NSW and the Gold Coast. On September 16, 2020 in the metropolitan areas, 10 HD moved from Channel 13 to Channel 15 due to the upcoming launch of the third digital channel of Network 10 10 Shake.
