To create a more positive atmosphere, Instagram now allows you to pin up to three comments at the top of your posts- choose a few good ones, we ask you. Pinned comments can be your own, or from other followers/commentators. Once the comment is pinned, it will live on top of the comment stream, no matter when it was posted. This will be a featured comment that users see when scrolling through their feed, and the first comment they will see when they open the thread. While Instagram promotes this as a way to curate a conversation, pinned comments can also be used to add follow-up information to the post. For example, you can post and pin up an update to declare the winner a giveaway (provided you do this kind of thing on Instagram). The feature is rolling out now for iOS and Android users. I also checked if it was available in the desktop version of the browser, but haven't seen it yet; it's likely it won't appear because many of Instagram's mobile features don't make it onto a desktop website, at least not for some time. To pin Instagram comments: Open the Instagram app and go to one of your posts. Scroll through the comments until you find the one you want to show at the top. Swipe left on the comment and then tap the thumbtack icon. Instagram will give you a brief look at how pinned comments work and ask if you want to pin a comment. Click Pin Comment. The comment will now be at the top of the thread. You can repeat this for up to three pinned comments. If you want to unstuck a comment, just swipe again, tap the thumbtack icon, and remove it. This does not remove or hide a comment from other places in the thread, however. Delete Instagram's iPhone and Android Start comment by opening the Instagram app on your iPhone or Android device, and then finding the Instagram post in question. Once you open the Instagram app, you can go to the Notifications section to find the latest comments left on your post. When you're looking at a message, on the Comments icon (speech bubble icon) to view every comment associated with the message. Here, find a comment (your own or someone else's) that you want to delete. If you're using an iPhone, swipe left on the comment to reveal the settings. Click here on the Trash icon can delete the comment. If If Using an Android smartphone, click and hold a comment to select it. Then click on the Trash Can icon found in the top toolbar to remove the comment. You will see a banner at the top of the screen informing you that the comment has been removed. Attached comments (up to three) will remain at the top of all your Instagram comments, even after new ones are added to your posts. Where is it? Lifewire has found and tested the feature on iOS, but has yet to find it on Android. How can I pin: The feature is a bit hidden but still easy to use. On Instagram on iOS, you put your finger on the comment and slide left to reveal several menu options, including Delete, Report, Response, and a new Pin that looks like a pushpin. When you first use Pinned Comments, you'll see a short explanation screen. Then, as soon as you choose the pushpin, the comment is attached to the top of your comments. You can't control the order. Whichever comment you pin is the last comment that will appear at the top. To undo the pin, slide to reveal the comments menu and select the pushpin icon again. You'll get a confirmation message. If you choose it, the comment will not be commented on. They will know: Pinning comments at the top of your channel will help push away comments you want to hide, but the action also automatically notifies the original commenter that you their comment is enough to anchor it.
