Media Downloader is a malware threat that disguises itself as a legitimate application, sneaks its way into your Mac and then displays adware and steals data. Everything you need to know about Media Downloader Media Downloader isn't a virus. But this is a type of malware known as a potentially unwanted program (PUP). As you can probably guess from the name, it disguises itself as a media player and downloader for a Mac. Like other malware apps of this type, Media Downloader worries itself about seemingly legitimate apps to download without realizing that you've done it. When downloaded and installed, Media Downloader displays an intrusive ad layer over your web browser window without obscuring some of the contents of that window and intruding on your web browsing session. Ads are designed to be difficult to close and stay on screen for as long as possible. It also steals data such as your IP address and search queries and sends them back to the central server. To avoid downloading Media Downloader, you should be vigilant about the apps you choose to download on your Mac. Make sure the app you want to

download is the one you chose to download. Also never click on the link in the window that claims your Mac is outdated or that your Mac is at risk. And of course, never click on a link in an email or or message unless you are absolutely sure where it leads and who sent it to you. Did you know? The latest versions of macOS include a tool called GateKeeper that prevents apps from being installed on your Mac unless they are downloaded from the Mac App Store or trusted developer. To install any other app, you must manually override the GateKeeper system preferences. How to remove Media Downloader from your Mac 1.Delete application Go to your Applications folder and search for all applications you have not intentionally installed. When it's found, drag it to the Recycle Bin and empty it. Tip: Dragging an app to the trash and emptying it doesn't completely uninstall it. There may still be files scattered around your hard disk. You can use the CleanMyMac X.2 uninstallation program to completely uninstall the app. Check for logon item Sometimes malware installs the logon item to run automatically when you reboot your Mac. Click your user name, and then click the Logon Items tab. Search for all logon items that you don't recognize and press - to disable them. 3. Remove browser extensions Media Downloader can install extensions in your web browser to display ads. The process of removing them depends on which web browser you're using. Follow these steps in your browser: Safari Click on the safari menu and choose Preferences.Select the Extensions tab and look for any extensions that look suspicious. If you find it, click it and choose Uninstall. Chrome launch Chrome and the address bar chrome://extensions Type chrome://extensions. Look for extensions that seem suspicious. Press Remove next to a suspicious extension. Firefox Launch Firefox and click on three lines to the right of the toolbar. Choose Add-ins from the menu. Click Extensions and search for any unfamiliar extensions. Press Uninstall. You may also need to reset your browser's home page and default search engine. To do this in Safari, choose the General tab under System Preferences. In Chrome, type chrome://setting and scroll down. And in Firefox, select Options instead of add-ons at step 2 above. Use cleanmymac X power In addition to uninstalling apps, CleanMyMac X can also help you delete login items and browser extensions, and remove all files that may have been inserted into your Mac. CleanMyMac X is also a malicious software removal tool that can scan your Mac for well-known viruses and threats. If it finds something, you can remove it by clicking the button. Try it— there are dozens of tools in the app to make your Mac faster, cleaner, and safer. Media Downloader isn't a virus. When infected with Media Downloader common symptoms include: Ad banners are entered by the webpages you visit. Random web page text is converted to hyperlinks. Browser windows appear that recommend fake updates or other software. Other unwanted adware programs may be installed without the user's knowledge. How does media downloader got on my computer? Media Downloader is an adware program that is usually bundled with other free programs that you download off of the Internet. Unfortunately, some free downloads do not properly detect that other software will be installed and you may find that you have installed the Media Downloader without your knowledge. Most often Media Downloader is bundled with installers from Cnet, Softonic or other similar custom third-party installers. When installing software, you should always pay attention, as often the software installer includes optional installations, such as this Media Downloader adware. Be very careful what you agree to install. Always choose custom installation and deselect something that is not familiar, especially the optional software that you never wanted to download and install in the first place. To uninstall Media Downloader from Windows XP, Windows Vista, or Windows 7, click the Start button, and then click control panel menu options. If you're using Windows 8, just drag the mouse pointer to the right edge of the screen, select Search from the list, and search for Control Panel. Or you can right-click on the lower left hot corner (formerly known as the Start button) and select Control Panel from there. When the Control Panel window opens, click Uninstall a program in the Options category in the Programs category. This option appears with the arrow in the picture. If you're using Classic View in Control Panel, double-click the Programs and Features icon instead. When the Programs and Features screen or The Uninstall a program screen appears, scroll through the list of currently installed programs and uninstall Media Downloader version 1.5. To view recently installed programs, you can click the Installed column to sort the program by installation date. Scroll through the list and uninstall any unwanted or unknown apps. To remove the Media Downloader malicious files that were discovered in the previous step, please click the Clean button. AdwCleaner will now ask you to save all open files or documents because the program will need to reboot your computer. Please do it, and then click the OK button. Click the Activate Free License button to start a free 30-day trial and remove all malicious files from your computer. (Optional) STEP 5: Reset Internet Explorer, Firefox or Google Chrome settings to prevent Media Downloader ads If you still encounter problems with Media Downloader ads in Internet Explorer, Firefox or Chrome, we will need to reset your browser to its default settings. This step is only if your problems are not solved by previous steps. You can reset Internet Explorer settings to the state they were when Internet Explorer was first installed on your computer. Open Internet Explorer, click the gear icon at the top right of the browser, and then click Internet Options again. In the Internet Options dialog box, click the Advanced tab, and then click the Reset button. Under Reset Internet Explorer settings, select the Delete personal settings check box, and then click the Reset button. When Internet Explorer finishes its task, click the Close button in the confirmation dialog box. You now need to close your browser, and then open Internet Explorer again. If you're having problems with Firefox, resetting it can help. The reset feature fixes many problems by restoring Firefox to a factory default while maintaining your essential information, such as bookmarks, passwords, web form autofill information, browsing history, and open tabs. In the upper-right corner of the Firefox window, click the Firefox menu button (☰), click the Help button. Choose Troubleshooting from the Help menu. On the Troubleshooting information page, click the Reset Firefox button in the upper-right corner. To continue, click the Reset Firefox button in the new confirmation window that opens. Firefox will close itself and return to the default settings. When you do this, the window will list the information that you imported. Click Finish. Note: Your old Firefox profile will be placed on the desktop in a folder called Old Firefox Data.
