As you probably already know, this industry is incredibly difficult, and following through with your personal commitment to yourself is fundamental, including staying determined in times that are challenging. Throughout my journey as an actor so far, I have identified two key areas that I have found to be particularly important in order to fulfill my commitments to your acting career. It is imperative to focus on how kindly you treat and how confident you are. Sharing kindness is always important. Unfortunately, actors don't always really support themselves, and some even consider themselves less talented - or less deserving of success than they really are. It is often said that you are the worst critic, and it is true that many of us are too tough on ourselves. Requiring the best from yourself is not a bad thing. However, being too critical of yourself can be a problem if you are constantly beating yourself up and not treating yourself with kindness. It is important to recognize how you talk to yourself, and it is equally important to be honest about how you perceive yourself. Are you kind to yourself and you see yourself as an exceptionally talented person that you are? Do you consider yourself a success - or a failure? Are you confident in your abilities as an actor or are you consumed by uncertainty? Perception plays a key role in how you see yourself and how others see you. If you don't believe that you're successful or talented, most others won't see you as a success either. In order to perform with an intense commitment to an acting career, seeing yourself as a success and being good to yourself are essential in order not to become discouraged. Believe in yourself and be sure! It is very important that you perceive yourself as a success that you are already in this industry. Committing yourself well after to the end with an acting career will require that you have a lot of self-confidence. Building your confidence begins with faith and being kind to yourself. If you don't believe in yourself, who else will believe in you? Now it is quite clear that whether you are completely new to the business or have been here for quite some time, it can be difficult to feel confident. If you are just starting out as an actor, you may feel intimidated. And if you've been an actor for a while, you've probably experienced a fair share of rejection - which can also be very discouraging. But remember, most people around you don't know if you're brand new or very experienced in Hollywood. All he or she will see is whether you are confident in your abilities and in yourself. If you fully believe in yourself, confidence will shine through everything you do in your career - and in your life! Think about the last time you watched someone audition, perform, or even give a speech, for example. When a person, give a performance, looks nervous, the audience immediately recognizes that nervousness too. However, when a performer projects confidence, confidence is exactly what will be perceived by the audience. Working as an actor requires a lot of energy and there are many ups and downs. If you fully devoting yourself to this career, one of the most important areas to commit to is to treat yourself with kindness. If you're familiar with the story or you've seen any of the other countless adaptations, you'll know the dognapped hero goes through a series of human-sidekicking adventures in Yukon - pulling sleighs, dodging avalanches and face-down grizzly bears before tussling with his wolf-like wild side. The curveball in this version is that it's not exactly a live action. Bar a couple of goats, all the animals thrown turns in CGI, while our dog hero is performed by motion capture expert Terry Notary (Rise of the Planet of the Apes). The results are, at best, mixed. While director Chris Sanders (How to Teach a Dragon) is able to pull off action set-pieces and human-dog interactions that would be great to ask for even the most versatile canine performer, Buck has a slightly fake look and lacks the material reach of the out-and-pat charm of an actual dog. This supernatural (or uncanine-y?) valley is the order of the great. Fortunately, Ford is his usual charismatic (and totally non-CG) self as a kindly grouchy border guard. Janusz Kaminsky's lush cinematography is also a significant compensation.
