Choosing a Preview text doesn't allow you to change the text of the PDF document, but you can select the text in that document, copy it and paste it elsewhere. If you don't have another tool than the choice of text chosen, it's simple. Let's say I want to insert text from the PDF file into textEdit. In Preview, I select text and click Command-V to insert that text. (The best choice is to tap The Shift-Option-Command-V, which is equivalent to a zgt; and match style. Typical text choice. But let's say you want to copy the text in columns. For example, you can copy the entire text that appears in the first column under the sidebar. There is a trick to avoid this. Hold the Option key and drag the text you want to copy, even if it covers multiple columns. When you release the mouse/trackpad, the text has just been selected, And while we're on the issue of choosing blocks of text, let's look at the rectangular selection tool that is to the right of the text selection tool. You use this tool to draw a rectangle of choice around what you want to capture on the PDF page. Then you can copy this choice. In most cases, when you enter the selection will appear as editable PDF text. Microsoft Word also offers the option of accepting selected text as an image or a PDF fragment.
