

For countless children - and smart adults - SpongeBob square pants were more than just cartoon sponges; he is an iconic and beloved character who advocated the relentless power of being unabashedly blunt. And with the passing of Stephen Hillenborg, you may finally want to show your child the slightly absurd world of Bikini Bottom, particularly the sponge that lives in pineapple. Fortunately, the first four seasons are available to stream on Amazon Prime Video for free, so we've selected 10 episodes that will perfectly introduce your child to the sea nonsense SpongeBob SquarePants. (Note all the following Amazon Prime links, but if you don't have an Amazon Prime account, individual SpongeBob episodes are available for purchase on YouTube as well.)

Bubblestand (Season 1, Episode 2) Most of the show needed at least a dozen episodes to find its footing, but from the beginning, it was clear SpongeBob was special. Virtually all the early episodes of bonafide classics are worth rewatching but Bubblestand stands out as he introduced us to the show's most consistently hilarious formula: SpongeBob and Patrick annoying the crap out of Squidward with their boundless and ignorant enthusiasm. When SpongeBob and Patrick learn of their favorite crime-fighting duo, Mermaid Man and Barnacle Boy (clearly modeled after Batman and Robin), live in a nursing home nearby, they go to meet their now geriatric idols to try to get them back and once again serve vigilante justice. SpongeBob and Patrick succeed by being big enough to convince Mermaid Man and Barnacle Boy to use their powers to get their biggest fans as far away from them as possible. Imitation Krabs (Season 2, Episode 4) Plankton has one goal in life: steal Crabbie Patty's Formula To Chum Bucket, his empty restaurant will finally get customers. And perhaps his most brilliant plan is when he builds a robot clone of Mr. Crabs to try to trick SpongeBob into giving him a formula. The plan almost works as Plankton manages to trick SpongeBob, but he ends up greatly underestimating how many tests are set in place before SpongeBob gives him the formula. Squidville (Season 2, Episode 6) Approximately 60 percent of the early episodes of SpongeBob revolve around Squidward being pushed to his mental tipping point because of his immediate neighbors, so it was only a matter of time before he would try to leave Bikini Bottom for the green pastures. But when Squidward finally moves on to tentacle Acres, a community filled with clarinet games, canned bread-loving octopuses, he finds himself bored and missing a baby SpongeBob and Patrick. It's a brilliant twist that shows Deep down, Squidward loves to live between these two mannequins. Frankendoodle (Season 2, Episode 14) When an artist throws a pencil while drawing on a boat, SpongeBob and Patrick discover that foreign utensils can be used to create living art. SpongeBob draws a Doodlebob animated version of herself that quickly begins wreaking havoc through Bikini Bottom. The two believe they have erased the bizarro creation into oblivion, but one of his hands remains and The Doodlebob is able to return to full force as soon as he gets to hold the magic pencil. Doodlebob then tries to destroy SpongeBob, who must find a way to defeat his creation or cease to exist. Cemetery Shift (Season 2, Episode 16) Mr. Crabs decides that Krusty Krab will be open 24 hours a day, meaning that SpongeBob and Squidward, only two employees, will work there 24 hours a day. When Squidward discovers that SpongeBob is afraid of the dark, he tells him the story of Hash-slinging Slasher, a former fry cook-turned-ghost who haunts the staff of Krusty Krab at night. Squidward manages to horror SpongeBob, but he can't explain when his makeup story suddenly becomes real. At its core, SpongeBob is a tribute to the power of optimism, and that is never displayed more clearly than in this episode, where SpongeBob and Patrick form a club that blindly follows Magic Conch, which is essentially a magical 8-ball that has the shape of a sink instead. Squidward mocks the two, but of course when the three end up stranded in the desert, their faith in Magic Conch provides them with food and shelter, while the doubt squidward leaves him cold, hungry, and alone. EVERYONE WELCOMES THE MAGIC END! Idiot Box (Season 3, Episode 4) With SpongeBob, sometimes the simplest episodes turn out to be the best. Example: SpongeBob and Patrick use their imagination by playing with a cardboard box, to the horror of Squidward. Soon, Squidward makes sure there must be more than a field of two giving further, and he tries to catch them in the act. But just as Squidward learns that no amount of technology can defeat the power of imaginaaaaaation, things predictably turn on it. As seen on TV (Season 3, Episode 7) When SpongeBob's hand briefly appears in a Krabby Patty commercial that airs at 3:28 a.m., he quickly lets the defunct fame go to his head and starts acting as a celebrity list, suggesting that every customer is looking for an autograph instead of a meal. The episode is a masterclass in the blunt sense of the show's absurdism, culminating in SpongeBob's rendition of a song called Striped Sweater to a confused, angry patrons. Mr. Crabs decides to turn Krusty Krab into a hotel with one simple rule: We will never refuse a guest even in the funniest request. It is immediately put to the test when Patrick registers and start one idiotic request after another. Squidward eventually goes away and tries to turn the situation in his favor by becoming a guest at Krusty Towers. Things predictably don't work for him. He may live in pineapple underwater, but, this December, SpongeBob SquarePants finds a new home on the Broadway stage. SpongeBob SquarePants - The new musical takes Nickelodeon O.G. Animalia Porifera and plops him and his friends into a marine pointless play. And, if you're wondering how it's going to translate, the answer is pretty good: the show debuted last June in Chicago and received rave reviews for its creative history, strong action, and above all, the killer soundtrack. Although it closed after a short run, the show is now finding new life in New York and will open at the Palace Theatre in early December. To prepare for the debut, the producers released a song from the show, and it seems just as whacky and clever as the source material. SpongeBob Broadway (Just A) The Simple Sponge, which Entertainment Weekly posted, is an emotional power ballad that hits all the right notes, featuring strangely jaded, anthropomorphic sponges having to look deep inside of themselves to get what he really wants in life. He also has a patented SpongeBob of the Absurd, tossing in nonsequiturs about saving the world and playing with his nose like a whistle. Panic frontman Brendan seemed pretty jazzed up to be a part of the show, telling EW, I'm so happy that I was able to bring the song to life that marries two of my favorite things for spongebo SquarePants Broadway musical. The musical may have one of the most stacked songwriting lineups in musical history. Along with the popular emo pop punk band, several huge names have contributed to songwriting for the show, including T.I., John Legend, Cyndi Lauper, Sarah Barei, Aerosmith, They Can Be Giants, and more. The Broadway Hamilton-led pop culture revival probably contributed to

celebrity interest in the soundtrack, but one thing's for sure: SpongeBob fans roll deep. SpongeBob SquarePants characters are silly, eccentric and cute. Mr. Crabs is voiced by Clancy Brown (Lightning). Plankton. Nickelodeon Plankton is an evil, tiny enemy who owns a failing restaurant called Chum Bucket. He is relentlessly trying to steal Crabby Patty's recipe. He strives to rule all Bikini Bottom. His schemes included disguise himself as Mr Crabs, a friendship with SpongeBob and switching lives with Mr Crabs. Plankton is voiced by Mr. Lawrence. SpongeBob SquarePants - Where's Gary. Nickelodeon Gary - Bob Sponge's favorite snail, which meows like a cat. He sleeps on the paper next to SpongeBob's bed. It has been shown more than once that Gary is an intellectual, knowing how to tie his shoes and dreams of browsing the library. One day Gary ran away when SpongeBob forgot to feed him for days. She also taught SpongeBob everything about Sandy's Christmas voiced by Carolyn Lawrence (Jimmy Neutron). Flying Dutchman. Nickelodeon Flying Dutchman ghost wary of Bikini Bottom residents. He had blanks with SpongeBob, Patrick and Mr. Crabs, sometimes involving his ghost ship and socks. The flying Dutchman is voiced by Brian Doyle-Murray (Groundhog Day). He lifts weights and often enters into competitions with Sandy. Larry voices Mr. Lawrence. Lawrence.
