

Update: Google has now released an official blog not only about new support for web texts on Android Messages, but also a number of other new features that will be rolled out over the next week. As we've reported before, as soon as the Android Messages app updates live, just go to the Settings menu, click the Messages button for the Internet, and then scan the code on the Messages web so you can send and receive texts on your desktop or laptop. Another new feature for posts this week will allow you to search and find a great GIF image to send to friends by clicking on the I button on the left side to make up the bar. Another feature is Smart Reply, which will offer suggestions for pre-created responses to texts. In addition, if the text contains a link to the URL website, you'll see a preview of that link in the app. Finally, Android Messages will allow you to keep your password directly inside the text message using a tap. Original story: In April it was discovered that Google is preparing to launch a way to use Android Messages on your computer, through a web client. Now the first half of this service has gone live with the launch of the Android Messages Web page. Unfortunately, the second half of this service has yet to go live. Once Google releases the update, you'll be able to go to the Settings menu in Android Messages on your phone, tap the Message button for the Internet, and scan the code to connect to your computer. This Android Messages web client is similar to the Google Allo web version that was released back in August. Google has yet to officially announce this service, so we'll be sure to update this post as we learn more. This would seem to mean that Facebook will put controls in the hands of its users to limit or stop unwanted interactions with businesses. To start getting ads, the user should always be the first to start a conversation. Companies won't be able to push ads out en masse for Facebookers who just liked their product page. These ads can be rolled out as early as April, and Facebook is encouraging businesses to get their consumer base to start initiating conversations with them so they can start sending promotional messages as soon as the feature is available.
