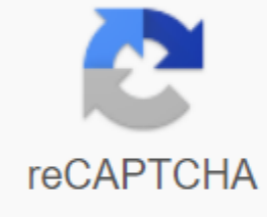

Opened in 1954, it is the oldest remaining high school in Virginia Beach, Virginia, United States. Named after the now extinct Princess Anne County, Virginia (named itself after the British monarch, Queen Anne, entitled at the time and before the ascension, princess of Denmark) was annexed with the founding of Virginia Beach. The origins of history built the school during a period of rapid expansion in the then-Princess Anne County. The cost of construction and equipment was \$3,500,000, which included approximately \$1,000,000 in federal funds. The school was first occupied in September 1954. Many schools have already been built and are still in use today, however, they have been converted into smaller middle or primary schools in order to address inflated classroom sizes. In 1963, Princess Anne County was integrated into the newly formed Virginia Beach City, thus becoming the oldest remaining high school in the system. [3] September 1, 1995, a fire four days before the school opened in September 1995, destroyed nearly a third of the building. The fire started in the library and destroyed many valuable records, including the full collection of PA annals before 1995 and many printed and digital materials for courses collected by teachers throughout their careers. The exact cause of the fire has never been announced. Throughout the 1995-1996 school year, and in the 1996-1997 semester, classes were held in a vacant nearby shopping centre known as the Celebration Station, which has since been demolished. In the aftermath of the fire, a large part of the school was completely rebuilt. As a result, the PA Library now maintains one of the most comprehensive and up-to-date media collections of any Virginia Beach high school. A new pavilion has been added to art classes and studios. The school reopened in January 1997, with the official celebration of its rededication on 4 May 1997. [4] The School Academy is part of a Virginia Beach School system, which receives a reputation for being the good in the Hampton Rhodes area. Princess Anne maintained her status as virginia's highest-ranking high school and hampton roads on Newsweek's list of America's best high schools, continuing to be placed on the list annually (#451 in 2012, #263 in 2011, #123 in 2010, #167 in 2008 #213 2007). [5] In 2012, The Washington Post released its list of America's most challenging high school, and all u.S. Virginia Beach City High School was in the top 1,900, but Princess Anne ranked highby a large margin in #250. [6] Virginia Beach High School's only international baccalaureate program in PA, attracting talented students from all over Virginia Beach. The school has excelled in VHSL academic competitions, with many tournaments in forensics and debate. At GreatSchools, the overall rating of the school is 7/10; [7] In addition to special programs serving regular students and the International Baccalaureate Program, the school hosts the Virginia Beach Center for Students with Moderate to Severe Disabilities (located inside the West Building) and is used to host a citywide center for pregnant teenagers (PA Center), which is now located in the Renaissance Academy. Princess Anne is also one of the few high schools in Virginia Beach with njrotc program. Princess Anne Athletics has won 27 VHSL State Team Sports Championships and 19 State Individual Sports Championships. Twenty-two of the team's titles have come since 1999. PA students participate in the following sports, according to the Virginia High School Association (VHSL): Autumn Girls Sports: Encouragement, Golf, Cross-Country, Field Hockey, Volleyball For Boys: Football, Golf, Cross-Country, Volleyball Winter Games Girls: Basketball, Gymnastics, Indoor Track, Swimming and Diving Boys : Basketball, wrestling, at home, swimming and diving spring sports girls: softball, football, track and field boys: baseball, tennis, football, track and field team won Princess Anne's golf team in Virginia at the Virginia Golf Championship in 1971 and 1972. Princess Anne's women's basketball team has won the VHSL State Championship six years in a row (2015-19), which has never been accomplished before. The team has won 10 championships, all since 2002. Princess Anne's men's volleyball team won the VHSL State Championship three years in a row from 2013-2015. Princess Anne's women's volleyball team won the 2018 Vesal State Championship. The sports club including lacrosse and crew has recently been established, since the Virginia Beach School system is not officially involved. It is common to hold competitions outside informal cultures between other local clubs and special enterprise teams. A long-term club of sports coaches allows students to help local team coaches and doctors voluntarily.
