Family Records 2.3.1, better known as PAF for Macs, is perhaps the most widely used Family History app for Mac. It was created in the 1980s, but no longer appears to be available. It allowed users to enter names, dates, appointments, and source information into a database, and sort and search for genealogical data, print forms and charts, and share files with other users in GEDCOM format. PAF also linked images and other media files to individual records. History The history of PAF ran in parallel with the evolution of GEDCOM.[4] the de facto specification for Genealogy Data Communication or exchange. Version 2.3.1, released in 1994, was the latest version written specifically for the Macintosh operating system,[5] although PAF 5.2.18, written for Windows, can be installed on Apple Mac OS X using CrossOver Mac. In 2004 there was speculation about the realization of open source PAF. [6] The 5.2.18.0 began with an adaptation of Incline Software's Ancestral Quest program.[7] written by Gaylon Findlay. [8] Findlay has been involved in PAF updates. [5] Ancestral Quest has been developed separately, although it retains much of PAF's basic visual design and file structure.
