WhatsApp users on Android finally have biometric authentication. Provided that your smartphone has a fingerprint sensor, you can finally use your fingerprint to keep your chats safe. iPhone users received a feature in February that allowed them to use TouchID and FaceID to open the app. Although the face unlock feature for the app has not yet reached Android, users can expect WhatsApp to make it available after all. Android users can choose to protect the app with their fingerprints. When enabled, the app will only be unlocked once users' fingerprints are authenticated. Even if users use their fingerprints to unlock the phone, the app will authenticate their fingerprints again when open. To enable fingerprint locking on Android: 1. Open settings in WhatsApp 2. Go to the Privacy menu in Account 3. Select the fingerprint lock option and turn it on. 4. Once you turn on the fingerprint lock, confirm your fingerprint. It can be either in 1 minute or even after 30 minutes. WhatsApp also allows users to choose whether they want to see text messages received in notifications when the app is blocked. What is WhatsApp? WhatsApp is a free chat app that began at the dawn of the smartphone era back in 2009. It also has all-to-end encryption, so you can be sure that your messages are private and secure. In addition to standard one-on-one and group chats, you can also make voice or video calls for free, even internationally. Is WhatsApp safe and secure? With every message and call encrypted by default, WhatsApp is perfectly secure for almost all purposes. This level of encryption means that even WhatsApp (or its parent company Facebook) can't see the contents of your messages. However, you should be wary of phishing attempts. Never share your personal information with someone you don't know, and don't be afraid to block or report to people you think are trying to trick you. For an additional layer of security, you can also set up privacy settings in the app to hide your profile picture from non-contacts or turn off read receipts. WhatsApp also supports a two-step check in the form of a six-digit PIN. How to install WhatsApp First step in learning how to use WhatsApp is installing an app and it can be finished in just a few minutes. As mentioned above, the app is completely free and only requires a phone number to register. How to install WhatsApp: Install an app from the Play Store (Android) or App Store (iPhones). Start the app and approve the permissions requested. Enter your phone number and click Confirm. Enter verification code obtained via SMS (WhatsApp can do so automatically). Import existing contacts into the app (optional). That's all there is to it! Now you are ready to start communicating with any of your contacts that have WhatsApp installed. You can also manually add contacts to WhatsApp if you don't want to import the entire contact list. How to set up your WhatsApp profile Before you start chatting, there is another step that you can take. Creating a profile will help your contacts know who you are, even if they don't have your number saved in their contacts. You can add an image, a name, and a short biography. How to set up your WhatsApp profile: Click on the three dots in the top right corner of the app and tap Settings. Tap your name at the top of the screen. To change the image, tap the camera icon and select the photo. To change your name, click the pencil icon next to Name. Enter or adjust your biography by clicking on the pencil icon next to About. You can also change your phone number from that screen, and the process is the same as when you first set up the account. will send the verification code via SMS, and as soon as it is confirmed, all your chats and contacts will be transferred to this number. As you start the chat Now that your profile is set, it's time to get to the task at hand: chatting! When you first open the app, you won't have open chats, but you you Start a new chat by clicking on the chat bubble in the bottom right corner. From there, just choose the contact you want to communicate with from the list. If you already have a previous chat with this contact, it will open that instead of a new chat. All that's left now is to enter the message at the bottom of the screen. After typing, click on the arrow icon that appears next to the text box to send it. You can also send photos or files on WhatsApp by clicking on a clip or camera icons at the bottom of the screen. WhatsApp has a built-in camera app, but it's best to use the usual camera app to take a picture and select it in the gallery to send. You can also send photos or files to WhatsApp by clicking on a paper clip or a camera icon. To start a group chat, tap the same chat bubble as before, and then click New Group. Then you can choose the members you want to invite, enter the name of the group and start chatting! How to use GIFs on WhatsApp Sending GIFs in WhatsApp should be a simple task, but the exact steps are far from obvious. To make matters worse, they differ between iPhones and Android phones! To send a GIF to Android, you first need to open a chat and click on the emoji next to the text box. Then click the gif text at the bottom of the screen to see a selection of the most popular GIFs at the moment. To find more GIFs, click on the magnifying glass in the bottom left corner and enter the keywords. Once you have found and selected the GIF, all that is left is to click the send. It's worth noting that the process can be easier depending on what brand of phone you have, or if you have another keyboard installed. Often you can just click the gif text over the keyboard rather than the complicated process above. To send a GIF to your iPhone, open the chat and tap the plus icon in the bottom left corner. How to call with WhatsApp One of the most useful features when using WhatsApp internationally is the ability to make phone calls. Unlike standard international voice calls, WhatsApp calls use an internet connection rather than a phone line, so they are completely free. To start a phone call on WhatsApp, all you have to do is open the chat window and tap the phone icon in the top right direction. If it's a group, you can even choose a few people to call at the same time. The steps for making a video call on WhatsApp are almost identical. Just tap the video camera icon next to the phone icon. It's a great alternative to Facetime, especially for Android users! How to use WhatsApp on your computer If you are the type of person who prefers to type on the keyboard (or just don't like looking at your phone all day), you can also use WhatsApp from your computer. You will need to keep your phone nearby, but this can be a very convenient way to communicate or send files from your computer or Mac. How to use WhatsApp on your computer: On your computer browser, go to web.whatsapp.com. Open WhatsApp on your phone, click three dots in the top right, then WhatsApp. Tap plus the icon in the top right. Put your phone's camera on the QR code on your computer screen. WhatsApp should instantly log in on your computer. If you don't want to use a browser, you can also install a WhatsApp PC client directly on your computer. If you think someone is using WhatsApp Web without your permission, you can delete access from your phone by following the first two steps above. How to use WhatsApp on iPad or Android tablet With iPadOS, adding tons of new features each year that make it more and more like a computer, it may be a surprise to learn that using WhatsApp on your iPad is quite difficult. You can install the app directly, but then you have to remove it from your phone, which obviously isn't ideal. Even then, there is an additional step associated with accessing the site from a mobile browser. The trick here is to request a desktop version of the web.whatsapp.com. This will tell WhatsApp that you are using a computer instead of a mobile device, and will allow you to connect your phone with the same steps above. How exactly you request the desktop version will depend on which browser you use, but we've mapped out steps for Safari below. How to use WhatsApp on iPad: Open the Safari browser and go to web.whatsapp.com. Tap three points next to the URL, and then click Desktop Site. Open WhatsApp on your phone, click Settings in the top right option, then WhatsApp Web. Tap plus icon in top option. Give your phone's camera a QR code on your iPad screen. WhatsApp should instantly log in on your iPad. Note that this trick works with both Android tablets and iPads of all sizes and they can be paired with android android and iPhones in any combination. Other frequently asked questions: Are WhatsApp calls free? What about the video call? A: Both calls and video calls are free, but will use the data if they are not connected to Wi-Fi. Be careful not to exceed mobile data limits, especially when making a video call. What is WhatsApp Plus? Is it safe? A: WhatsApp Plus is an app developed using stolen code from the official WhatsApp app. This allows for a few extra features, but needs to be downloaded and sideloaded to work. However, it is not safe to use, and can cause your WhatsApp account to be banned, or worse, your information has been stolen. In: Does WhatsApp belong to Facebook? Answer: Yes, WhatsApp was acquired by Facebook in February 2014. A: While some may consider it a social media app, it is generally considered an instant messaging app. However, as more business features are added it can tip further into social media territory.
