On the other hand, Ellora Caves happen to be younger and have their own history, dating back to the 5th and 10th centuries AD, Ellora Caves are divided into three parts: Hindu caves, Jaina caves and Buddhist caves. The site of Ajant's caves was later abandoned and covered with dense forest until 1819, when a British officer rediscovered it. However, Ellora's caves have always had the attention it deserves. Today, ajant caves Ellora is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, which was announced in 1983. From June to September (monsoon) the region receives an average of a lot of rain showers that make the exploration experience a delight. While the temperature drops moderately between November and February. The summer months (March to May) can actually get hot, especially during the daytime. So try to avoid this season if you plan to visit the caves of Ajant and Ellora. Distance: Both caves are 100 km apart. Ajant Caves are 104 km from Aurangabad and Ellora Caves are 29 km from Aurangaabad 2. Form: Ajanta Caves are carved into a rock in the shape of a horse. Ellora Caves are scattered randomly 3. Construction period: Ajant Caves were built between 200 BC and 680 AD On the other hand, the Ellora Caves are much younger and were built between the 5th and 10th centuries of the 4th century. The purpose of creation: Ajant Caves have vihari and Buddhist monasteries. Ellora Caves consist of religious centers for Hindus, Buddhists and Jain 5. With support: Funds for the construction of Ajanta caves were provided by various rulers, mainly the Wakata dynasty and the Satwahan dynasty. Ellor Caves were built mainly under the rulers of Chalukya, Kalachuri and Rashtrakut. Cave 4: This is one of the largest monasteries in Ajant and still sparks magic despite being an incomplete creation. Ellora Caves Obviously, back in the past, there was harmony between Hindus, Buddhists and Jains, given the proximity of their religious buildings. Ellora Caves have 34 caves, each of which has its own speciality. If time is limited, then you should make it a point to visit at least Cave 1, Cave 2 and Cave 16. Cave 1: The cave is a simple vihara and has 8 monastic cells Cave 2: Cave 2 has 12 richly square pillars. The Lord Buddha, sitting on a lion, is another attraction. The doorway depicts an impressive carving of Buddha's Poirteyra, as well as Padmapani holding a lotus. Cave 16: One of the brightest caves of Ellora, Cave 16 or The Temple of Kailash also happens to be an important place of pilgrimage for followers of Lord Shiva. The hopurams of this architectural marvel denote Mount Kailash, the abode of Lord Shiva. Cave 15 (Dashavatara) in Ellora depicts ten avatars of Lord Vishnu Cave 29 (Dhumar Lena) has a similar design, As Elephanta Caves Style painting found in Ajanta Caves is believed to have inspired the style of painting in Tibet and Sri Lanka carving caves are made in such a way that they somehow look like wooden structures The main objects of painting found in the caves of Jataa Caves of Ajanta have been excavated in the rock surface that looks like a horse shoe shaped cave more than two thousand years old, but the statues are about 600 years younger since they were added later Ajanta Caves were abandoned after the end of the reign of Harisena. Later the sign was covered with dense forest. Buddha was always against painting or carving his images as he preached a lesson to rise above materialistic desires. But after his death, his followers realized the need for his sculptures and paintings, so they had something to see.
