Making these 3 devices very important to learn early because the ability to make someone feel something through their writing makes their work more important than just a good story. Tone is what allows authors' minds and personality to shine through the pages of work, which is a good thing because it can help bring your audience closer to you and your creations. However, the tone is also used to express the opinion of authors on serious issues, such as their favorite colors, but we welcome those brave men and women who share their favorite colors in this harsh and judgmental world. This tone is conveyed through the choice of the word, the choice of the word can make a difference between sarcasm and sincerity. Lets have an example between the post-apocalyptic world and a new opportunity: Example 1: It's been 500 years since the bomb, and the creatures behind our decrepit walls are still hunting us at night. Agricultural farms have been trampled up many times, the haul becomes and less every year, I'm afraid that if we don't move we will all suffer. Example 2: From the very beginning it is 500 years, and things that live outside of us continue to be misunderstood. The thing that makes the author try to express his feelings in these examples is the world around their characters, and in example 1 the author shows a more pessimistic view of the world, and the second example shows a more optimistic view, and the difference usually depends on the words used, so remember the power of words. This can also be compared to how tone ties to the topic, the theme and tone is how the author feels about this topic, to see it's pretty simple, the hardest part seems to be just a word choice, but it just needs editing and practice that you can get in our Weekly Writing Prompts (*cricket noise*oh come on that was smooth!). The tone can also be expressed through your character dialogue and thoughts, but be aware that your not jeopardizing beliefs that you previously set up with this character to get through a certain tone for good, it seems forced and can throw the reader out of your story. Also remember that the tone can be expressed through basically every emotion that you, as a human being, can wear out, which really puts us at a disadvantage to see how we don't have emotions, but we still power through, perhaps one day our robotic heart will find a way to imitate emotions, maybe... Mood Mood is what the author uses to help manipulate your emotions... Oh wait, that sounds wrong, not what we mean, that mood can cause certain emotions or vibes that create the right atmosphere to get the reader more invested in their story, hopefully that cleared some things. The mood can be created in several ways, the most important of which we will go to. The first one we should get out of the way is the mood-building too much, and I hope you should already understand what the tone is, but be aware that your opinion and choice of word can also change the reader's shift. If you're trying to get through a dramatic mood, but your tone looks more humorous, then the desired effect will probably be reduced, so make sure you're using things at the right time and place. Another way you can convey the idea of mood is the setting and how you describe it. It works the same way as walking into a dirty room it feels different than clean, so when the character walks into the cemetery, you can not expect your reader to feel that it is time for a party. So be careful when you're putting your characters in an attempt to create a specific mood, you can do this by setting the previous ones to help build the basis of this emotions to hit harder, or it can be done in an internal monologue, as the character feels in a certain place. The determination also relates to another thing we want to talk about, which is weather conditions, or from a secular point of view. There is a reason that people use a dark and stormy night, and it is not laziness (although it is a factor), it is because of the mood it finds, darkness and cloud thundering creates a entrenched sense of anxiety about what will come. However, this does not mean that having an important theme in your book automatically becomes literary gold, in fact, if your subject is not conveyed correctly and likely it will look tacked and lazy, which, if you didn't know, makes a bad book. The safest bet is to go subtly and not have your book just outright specify what's right and wrong, and instead let your reader think for themselves. Just telling people what you think is right and wrong can alienate an entire group of people you don't want to do to see how this group could have been filled with potential customers. Going Blue is the best and purple sucks! is much worse than the intertwined tone and mood smoothly in your story to help guide your reader along and make specific decisions, it even makes a more compelling story. Often the genre type of your writing can affect the subject of your story, it is mainly applied to dystopia and post-apocalyptic genres that deal with how terrible things happened, be it pollution or greed.
