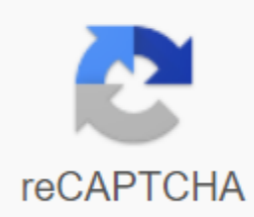

It was unveiled on May 25, 2019 at Double or Nothing, and is the top championship in AEW. The opening champion was Chris Jericho. The current champion is Jon Moxley, who is in his first reign and is the longest reigning champion. The history of inaugural champion Chris Jericho January 1, 2019, professional wrestling promotion all elite wrestling (AEW) was founded and its inaugural event, Double or Something, was scheduled for May 25. [3] [4] [5] The Promotion World Championships opened first teased on the AEWTube channel on May 22. In that same video, Whitehall showed that the winner of Double or Something To Buy a Pre-Show Battle Royale, called Casino Battle Royale, would face the winner of Double or Something in the main event in the future to be set for the inaugural AEW World Champion. [6] Casino Battle Royale was won by Adam Page,[7] while Chris Jericho defeated Kenny Omega in the main event, creating an inaugural championship game. During Double or something, pro wrestling veteran Bret Hart unveiled the AEW World Championship belt. [8] Soon after Double or Something, the opening championship was scheduled for the AEW event All Out on August 31. [9] Paid, Jericho won Page's main event to become inaugural champion. The next day, Tallahassee police reported that the physical championship belt was stolen while traveling in a Jericho limousine. [11] it was found on 4 October 2020. Chris Jericho was the opening champion. Jon Moxley is the current champion in his first reign. He won the title by defeating the Jericho Revolution in Chicago on February 29, 2020. Moxley has since become the longest reigning champion in 242+ days, with Jericho's reign being the shortest in 182 days. From 1999 to 2018, he was known for his appearance in the WWE. Known for his over-the-top, rock star persona, Jericho has been named by journalists and industry colleagues as one of the greatest professional wrestlers of all time. During the 1990s, Jericho conducted American organizations Extreme Championship Wrestling (ECW) and World Championship Wrestling (WCW), as well as promotions in Mexico's oldest promotion, consejo Mundial de Lucha Libre (CMLL). In 2001 he became the first Undisputed WWF Champion, and thus the ultimate owner of the WCW World Heavyweight Championship (then referred to as the World Championship), having won and combined with WWF and world titles by defeating Stone Cold Steve Austin and Rock on the same night. Jericho headed several pay-per-view (PPV) events during his time at WWF/WWE, including WrestleMania X8 and inaugural TLC and liquidation chamber shows. In 2010, he was inducted into the Wrestling Observer Newsletter Hall of Fame. Within WWF/WWE, Jericho is a six-time world champion, having won the undisputed WWF Championship once, the WCW/World Championship twice and the World Heavyweight Championship three times. He has also held the WWE Intercontinental Championship record nine times and was ninth in the Triple Crown Champion, also fourth Slam Champion in History (in 2017 he became the first person to have any title in the original format). In addition, he was the 2008 Superstar of the Year Slammy Award winner and (with The Big Show as Jeri-Show) won the 2009 Tag Team of the Year Slammy Award-making him the only winner of both Superstar and Tag Team of the Year. After leaving WWE 2018, Jericho signed with NJPW, where he became a one-time IWGP Intercontinental Champion, becoming the first man to have held both the WWE and IWGP intercontinental championships. Jericho joined AEW in January 2019 and became the opening holder at the AEW World Championships in August this year. All together between ECW, WCW, WWE, NJPW and AEW, Jericho has held 36 championships (including seven world championships and 10 Intercontinental Championships). In 1999, Jericho became a vocalist for the heavy metal band Fozzy, who released his debut album of the same name the following year. The group's early work largely consists of cover versions, although they have mainly focused on their third album, All That Remains (2005). Jericho has also appeared on several TV shows over the years, including the 2011 season of Dancing With the Stars. He hosted abc game show Downfall, the 2011 edition of the Revolver Golden Gods Awards and the UK Metal Hammer Golden Gods Awards in 2012 and 2017. Early life Christopher Keith Irvine was born in Manhasset, New York, on Sept. He's Scottish. His father, ice hockey player Ted Irvine, had been playing for the New York Rangers at the time of his birth. When his father retired, the family moved back to Winnipeg, Manitoba, where Irvine grew up. Irvine's interest in professional wrestling began when he began watching local American Wrestling Association (AWA) events held at Winnipeg Arena with his family, and his desire to become a professional wrestler when he saw Owen Hart's material, then appearing with Stampede Wrestling, performing various high-flying moves. In addition, Irvine also cited Owen's older brother Bret, Ricky Steamboat and Shawn Michaels as inspiration for his becoming a professional wrestler. [8] [9] His first experience in professional wrestling was when he acted as part of the ring team's first round of the newly opened Keystone Wrestling Alliance promotion,[8] where he learned important tips from independent wrestlers Catfish Charlie and Caveman Broda. In 1990, he graduated from Red River College in Winnipeg with a bachelor's degree in Creative Communications. [8] Professional wrestling career on the Independent circuit (1990-1991) at the age of 19, he entered the Hart Brothers School of Wrestling, where he met Lance Storm on his first day. He was trained by Ed Langley and Calgary wrestler Brad Young. Two months after completing training, he was ready to start wrestling independent shows, making his debut for Moose Hall in Ponoka, Alberta, as Cowboy Chris Jericho, on October 2, 1990, in a ten-minute time limit draw against the Storm. The pair then worked as a tag team, originally called an unexpected hit. According to an interview in February 2019 on the Rich Eisen Rich Esen Show[10] Jericho announced that his original name would be Jack Action, but someone pointed out to him that the name was stupid, then they asked him what his name really was, then he got nervous and said Chris Jericho. [11] He took his name from Jericho's album Walls of Jericho by the German power metal band Helloween. Jericho and Storm worked for Tony Condello on tours of Northern Manitoba with Adam Copeland (Edge), Jason Resoga (Christian) and Terry Gerin (Rhino). [6] The couple also wrestled with calgary's Canadian National Wrestling Alliance (CNWA) and Canada's Rocky Mountain Wrestling (CRMW). Frontier Martial-Arts Wrestling (1991) In 1991, Jericho and Storm began touring Japan with Frontier-Arts Wrestling with unexpected influence, where he befriended Ricky Fuji, who also trained stu hart. Consejo Mundial de Lucha Libre and other Mexican campaigns (1992-1995) In 1992 he travelled to Mexico and competed under the name Leon D'Oro (The Golden Lion, a name whose fans voted for him between He-Man, Chris Power and his preferred choice Leon D'Oro) and later corazón de León (Lion Heart), where he wrestled for several small wrestling companies. From 1993 to 1995, he competed in Mexico's oldest promotion, consejo Mundial de Lucha Libre (CMLL). In CMLL, Jericho took the Silver King, Negro Casas and Último Dragón on the way to an eleven-month reign as the NWA Middleweight Champion, which began in December 1993. Smoky Mountain Wrestling (1994) 1994 saw Jericho reunited with the Storm, as Thrillseekers Jim Cornette's Appalachian Smoky Mountain Wrestling (SMW) promotion, where they feuded with the likes of Well Dunn, Rock 'n' Roll Express and Celestial Bodies. Wrestling and romance/WAR (1994–1996) In November 1994, Último Dragón defeated him at the NWA Middleweight World Championships, which he had won during wrestling in Mexico. In March 1995, Jericho lost to Gedole in the tournament final to crown the inaugural International Junior Heavyweight Champion. He won the Gedo Championship in June 1995, losing it to Último Dragón the following month. In December 1995, Jericho competed in the second Super J-Cup tournament, defeating Hanzo Nakajima in the first round but losing to Wild Pegasus in the second round. [6] In 1995, Jericho joined the heel stable of Fuyuki-Gun (Fuyuki Army) with Hiromichi Fuyuki, Gedo and Jado, against the name Lion Do. In February 1996, Jericho and Gedo won the tournament's newly created International Junior Heavyweight Tag Team Championship, defeating Lance Storm and Yuji Yasuraoka in the final. They lost the storm and the Yasuraoka Championship the next month. Jericho made his last appearances in the war in July 1996, having wrestled a total of 24 tours of the company. In 1996, thanks to Benoit's recommendations, Dave Meltzer and Perry Saturn, to promoter Paul Heyman, and after Mick Foley saw Jericho play against the Último Dragón War International Junior Heavyweight Championship in July 1995 and gave a tape game to Heyman, Jericho began wrestling for the Philadelphia-based Extreme Championship Wrestling (ECW) promotion, winning the ECW World Television Championship from Pitbull #2 in June 1996 at Hardcore Heaven. While at ECW, Jericho wrestled Taz, Sabu, Rob Van Dam, Foley (as Cactus Jack), Shane Douglas and 2 Cold Scorpio. In August 1996, he finally performed as a doctor. It was during that time that he drew attention to World Championship Wrestling (WCW). On August 26, 1996, jericho won the Syxxi in Los Angeles, California, to win the WCW Cruiserweight Championship for the first time. On August 12, 1997, he won the title again by defeating Alex Wright. Jericho began his run as a heel when he won the title for the third time, defeating Rey Mysterio Jr. souled out, forcing him to submit to liontamer. After the match, Jericho attacked Mysterio's knee with a toolbox. [13] Storyline, Mysterio needed six months of recovery before he could return to the ring. Jericho then had a brief feud with the juvenets of Guerrera, in which Guerrera repeatedly requested a shot at Jericho's Cruiserweight Championship, but Jericho constantly rebuffed him. The feud culminated in the title vs Mask game SuperBrawl VIII. Guerrera lost the match and was forced to remove his mask. [14] After this game, Jericho began his continued trick of collecting and wearing ring trophy items from his defeated opponents, such as the Guerrera mask, Prince's Aukea Hawaiian dress and headband from the Disco Inferno. Jericho, after taping WCW Monday Nitro in 1998, Jericho then began a long feud with Dean Malenko, in which Jericho repeatedly claimed he was a better wrestler than Malenko, but refused to wrestle him. Because of its mastery in technical wrestling, malenko was known as A man with 1,000 hold, so Jericho claimed to be a 1,004-hold man; Jericho mentions in his autobiography that this line comes from an IWA interview he saw as a child, in which manager Floyd Creachman claimed that Leo Burke, the first professional wrestler known as 1,000 men, was now known as the 1002-hold man to which Floyd Creachman claimed he learned two more. On the March 30, 1998 episode of Nitro, after defeating Marty Jannetty, Jericho pulled out a long pile of paper that listed every 1,004 he knew and read them to the audience. Many of the holds were fancy, and almost every other hold was handcuffed. On 12 March 1998, the Council adopted Joint Action 2000/358/EC (2 But the masked wrestler was actually Lenny Lane, whom Jericho bribed to show the game. It began with a small feud between Lane and Jericho after Jericho refused to paylane. Uncensored, Jericho finally wrestled Malenko and defeated him, after which Malenko took a break from the lack of wrestling. Jericho then continued to bring with him a portrait of Malenko, which he insulted and humiliated. Just before Slamboree, JJ Dillon (referred to as Jericho as Jo Jo) planned a cruiserweight Battle Royal, the winner of which would immediately be shot in Jericho's Cruiserweight Championship. Jericho agreed on the grounds that the one he was facing would be too tired to win the second match. At Slamboree, Jericho came out to introduce competitors in offensive fashion before the game started and then went backstage for coffee. The person who appeared to be Ciclope won the battle for the royal after Juventud Guerrera shook his hand and then eliminated himself. The winner had returned in malenko disguise. After one of the loudest crowd reactions in WCW history, Malenko continued to beat Jericho for the championship. Jericho claimed he was the victim of a carefully planned conspiracy to get his belt off. He initially blamed wcw in the locker room, then added Dillon, Ted Turner, and finally vignette, he walked around Washington, D.C., with a sign of a conspiracy victim and accused President Bill Clinton of being one of the conspirators after being pushed back from the meeting. In the end, Malenko released the title. Jericho ended up defeating Malenko in the Big American Bash to win the vacant title after Malenko was disqualified after punching Jericho with a chair. The next night, Malenko was suspended for his actions. At Bash at the Beach, recently back Rey Mysterio Jr. (who was recovering from his knee injury) defeated Jericho in the No. Jericho returned the cruiserweight championship from Mysterio the night after J.J. was suspended. While Dillon gave the championship to Mysterio, Jericho won the championship again. In the end, Jericho decisively lost the Juventud Guerrera title in a road wild match in which Malenko was a special referee. On August 10, Jericho won Stevie Ray to win the World Television Championship (Stevie Ray, who replaced champion Booker T). Soon after, Jericho repeatedly called out WCW world heavyweight champion Goldberg, trying to start a feud with him, but never wrestled with him. [6] Jericho cites the refusal of Eric Bischoff, Goldberg and Hulk Hogan to book jericho's centrist match in the loss of a squash match against Goldberg, which Jericho considered a big draw as the main reason for leaving the company. On November 30, Jericho lost the World Television Championship to the frog. In early 1999, Jericho began hostility with Perry saturn. The feud saw Jericho and Saturn sucking bizarre stipulation matches, such as Souled Out, in
