Frequently asked questions Visitors to historic Southport who want to make a beach escape, or Carolina Beach travelers who need a simple but scenic route to the south, will find the Southport / Fort Fisher ferry a convenient yet unique way to explore southern coast of North Carolina. Although only a short 35-minute drive from the mainland to Pleasure Island (home to Fort Fisher State Park, Carolina Beach and Kure Beach), this ferry ride still offers passengers an exceptional view of the Cape Fear River and an incredible history to take home. The Southport / Fort Fisher Ferry is one of seven North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) ferries serving the state's easily inland communities and barrier islands. Southport and Fort Fisher are actually the southernmost terminals of the ferry connections and offer a valuable service to both the residents of Carolina Beach and the visitors. The ferry connects Pleasure Island to the mainland and can save Fort Fisher or Southport visitors a lot of travel time by bypassing the vehicle route that leads up the coast, crossing the Wrightsville Beach Bridge (or US 74) in the town of Wilmington, and then heading south to the respective destination for Southport or southern barrier island. Instead, the ferry offers virtually a direct shot over the wide Cape Fear River, which connects the two remote communities and gives fans in southern North Carolina easy access to the stunning coastlines of Fort Fisher, Kure Beach and even Carolina Beach. The ferry can be reached in Southport via Route 211 and Fort Fisher by following 421 south until it ends. Both terminals have public toilets, concessions and a lot of information from the area for newcomers in the area. Reservations are not required, but a small fee is charged for both passengers and vehicles wishing to board. The prices are cheap and range from 1 to 15 dollars. Learn more about tariffs here. The ferry timetable varies depending on the season, but usually runs all year round from 5.30 a.m. to 7 p.m.m, depending on the ferry terminal. From the end of September to the end of March, the ferry has about 14 crossings during the day, so that each terminal every 45 minutes or so, and in the summer season from April to shortly after labor day, the slopes easily rise to about 16 crossings per day. Reservations are not required, but travelers are advised to pay attention to popular Prime times when the lines can be long, and a waiting time is expected. Summer weekends are particularly popular, as are long weekend breaks and morning arrivals to Fort Fisher or late afternoon departures back to Southport. Visitors who want to be ahead of traffic should target a day of the week when the ferry traffic is significantly lower, or try to be an early rush and the 8:30 a.m., 7:45a.m. even 7:00 a.m. Departure to catch if the ferry traffic is minimal. The trip to and from Fort Fisher is a fun aspect of a Carolina Beach vacation in its own right, with incredible far-flung views of the shores of the Cape Fear River, dozens if it Hundreds of gulls following the stern of the boat begging for handouts, and miles of open water in virtually all directions. Cameras are a must for this adventure, and the ferries offer plenty of space along the outdoor decks to enjoy the view, as well as an expansive, climate-controlled passenger lounge at the top level of the ship to take a bird's-eye view. Toilets and water fountains are also available, and visitors can disembark their vehicles and explore the ferry in their free time. Pets are also allowed, if they are otherwise, visitors to the N.D., but visitors should note that no one is allowed to smoke or drink alcohol anywhere on board. Ferry passengers will also enjoy a fantastic treat around the sunset as the Cape Fear River glows in orange, pink and purple tones, adding passing schools of fish and migratory birds to the inspiring nature scene. Essentially, the view of the river in this part of the southern NC is incomparable, and the short 35-minute journey will illuminate this region of the coast and represent a completely new perspective of the Cape Fear River for rare visitors and longtime residents alike. A less congested way to explore the coast, and an often welcome getaway from the car for long-distance travelers, the Southport/Fort Fisher Ferry is easily the most picturesque way to reach the beach. Relaxing, courteous and overall a fantastic way to explore the vast, open expanse of the Cape Fear River, a quick trip on the Southport/Fort Fisher Ferry will surely become a popular reminder of any Carolina Beach, Kure Beach or Fort Fisher vacation. Arrive early with the sunrise, or catch an evening sunset, and make your journey to or from Pleasure Island an undisputed part of the fun and overall coastal experience. FAQ What is the Southport - Fort Fisher ferry? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is a ferry that connects the city of Southport with the barrier island of Fort Fisher at the southern end of Pleasure Island. Who runs the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is managed by the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Ferry System and is one of seven ferries managed by NCDOT in the state. Where is the Southport - Fort Fisher ferry? The Fort Fisher Terminal of the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is located at the southern end of Fort Fisher, just behind the North Carolina Aquarium. The Southport Terminal is located on the appropriately named Ferry Road, which is located just north of the historic downtown of Southport. How much is the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The fare to the Southport Crossing Fort Fisher Ferry depends on the type of vehicle. Vehicles under 20 feet are typically less than 10 dollars, while pedestrians and cyclists are 1-2 dollars per intersection. How long does it take to drive Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Ferry? The total crossing time for the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is about 35 minutes each way. Are there motels near The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? There are motels and hotels near the Southport ferry terminal in the city centre and in the wider Southport region. Near fort Fisher Terminal there are a number of hotels, motels and vacation rentals in the cities of Kure Beach and Carolina Beach. What are the attractions near The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The Fort Fisher Terminal of the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is located next to the North Carolina Aquarium in Fort Fisher, the Fort Fisher State Park and Historic Site and the Zeke's Island Reserve. The Southport Terminal is beautifully located near the city centre, known for its historic sights, restaurants, antique shops and shopping, and its small coastal atmosphere. Can you take pets with you on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Pets are allowed on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry and can explore the deck, but must be on a leash when they leave the vehicle. Owners should be aware that the decks for dog paws can get hot in summer, and should exercise caution if necessary. Can you board the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Pedestrians are welcome on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry for a small fee in the range of 1 dollar. Can you ride a Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry bike? Cyclists are allowed on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry for a small fee of about 2 USD. Please note that there are no bike racks on board the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry. Can you take a vehicle on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferries are designed as vehicle ferries, so licensed vehicles of all sizes that are legal on the highway are allowed on board. Please note that the crossing fee may be slightly more expensive for vehicles over 20 metres. Should you make a reservation for the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry does not accept reservations. What are the busiest days for the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The busiest days for the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry tend to change through the season, but usually, weekends can have a steady line of traffic due to day trippers as well as people who arrive for their vacation, especially in the summer months. When is the best time of day to drive on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Depending on the season, early morning and evening crossings are traditionally the less crowded journeys aboard the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry Are there toilets on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? There are public toilets on board the - Fort Fisher Ferry located on the main deck. Can you smoke on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? On board the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry, which covers the passenger lounge, outdoor decks and the interior of a vehicle. Can you drink alcoholic beverages at Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Open alcoholic beverages are not allowed on board The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry, which includes decks, lounges and individual vehicles. Can you fish in front of the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Fishing is not allowed from the decks of Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry. How many vehicles can the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry transport? The number of vehicles that can fit on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry depends on the type of vehicle and the individual ferry, but about 30-40 vehicles can fit on each ship. Are there vending machines or groceries on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? There are no vending machines or drinks available on board the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry, but there is a water fountain for passengers. Vending machines with snacks and drinks are also available at the Southport - Fort Fisher ferry terminals. Is the Southport - Fort Fisher ferry air-conditioned? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry has a passenger lounge on the second level of the ship, which is climate-controlled and therefore air-conditioned in the summer months and extends in the winter months. Is there a passenger lounge on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The Southport - Fort Fisher Route ferries have climate-controlled passenger lounges on the second level of the ships. Is there internet access on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Some of the ferries serving the seven ferry services in North Carolina may have limited Wi-Fi. Can you get off your cars on the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Visitors can disembark their vehicle and explore the first and second level decks and passenger lounge while boarding the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry. Visitors should not leave the vehicle until the ferry has left the docks and the crossing has begun. Can you feed seagulls in front of the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? Visitors should not feed seagulls from the back of The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry. How fast before departure does The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry arrive? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry usually enters about 10 minutes before the scheduled departure time. All visitors should be in their vehicles and board about 15 minutes before their ferry is sent off. What happens if you miss the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry runs all day, so the vehicles can wait until the next ferry becomes available in about 45 minutes, depending on the season and time of day. Visitors can also drive through Carolina Beach and Wilmington to reach Southport or Fort Fisher. What time does the Southport - Fort Fisher ferry depart? Last crossing for the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry from Southport Terminal is 18:15 p.m. The last fort Fisher Terminal is 19 .m. How early does the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry run? From Monday to Friday, the first crossing from Southport Terminal is at 5:30 .m., while the first crossing from Fort Fisher Terminal is at 6:15 a.m. .m. On weekends, the first crossing from Southport Terminal is at 7 .m, while the first crossing from Fort Fisher Terminal is .m at 7:45 a.m. How often does the Southport - Fort Fisher ferry depart? From morning to late afternoon, the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry usually runs every 45 minutes from both terminals. In the early morning hours and evenings, the ferry runs about every 90 minutes. Is the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry running in storms or hurricanes? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is not used for hurricanes, storms and weather events with high sustained wind speeds and gusts for safety reasons. Where are the docks for the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry? The docks for the Southport Terminal are located along Ferry Road, north of downtown and on the edge of the Cape Fear River. The docks for Fort Fisher Terminal are located near the end of US 421, next to Federal Point. How far is the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry from the Fort Fisher Aquarium? The Fort Fisher Terminal of the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry Route is about 75 km from the North Carolina Aquarium in Fort Fisher. How far is the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry from downtown Southport? The Southport Terminal of the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry Route is about 1.9 miles from the heart of downtown Southport. How far is the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry from the beaches of Fort Fisher State Park? Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry is less than 1 mile from the beaches of Fort Fisher State Park. Does the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry work all year round? The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry runs all year round, but has slightly fewer crossings per day during the off-season months or usually from the beginning of September to the end of March. Can you go to Fort Fisher? Visitors can drive from Southport to Fort Fisher instead of taking the Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry. The Southport - Fort Fisher Ferry junction is about 35 minutes, while the journey is just over an hour, depending on traffic. Traffic.

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
