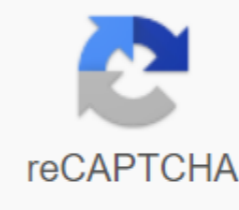

Electrolux is also designed to heat, extract moisture from the air and filter the air should you suffer from allergies. It's fair to say this is an all-in-one solution. But is it good? Despite being pitched as a portable unit, with wheels to help when moving it, Electrolux isn't really all that portable. The device itself is large, standing 760mm long, and while it's not immensely deep, it doesn't have vents and piping at the back to add to its overall footprint. Pocket-lintBut the main reason it is not portable is the way it handles waste. As you undoubtedly know, air conditioners generate a lot of heat, partly it's the heat they extract from the room, and in part it's the electronics and machines within. This heat has to go somewhere, or it destroys the goal that Conditioning. So you're going to get the exhaust pipe that you need to point out. It's good if you're happy to drill a hole in your wall, or if there's a window you can open nearby, but if you can't take advantage of these options, you're broken. Which is what we think about it, that it's not really portable. And of course, as part of the cooling room involves removing moisture - and thus reducing humidity, that's why you get dry lips when sleeping in air-conditioned rooms night at night - you'll also need to pipe the water out of nowhere. We thought there wouldn't be that much water. We were wrong. There's a hell of a lot of water. At first we just stuck a hose in a pint glass, but it ended badly, and very quickly. In the end we used an empty squash bottle, but still kept forgetting to empty and then ended up with damp floors. Oops.The ideal solution is to pipe both hot air and water outside and deal with them properly. But because it's a portable unit, we don't really see that as appropriate. If you want a fixed air conditioner, surely you just get one on the wall to mount? If electrolux's simple design is easy to use. On top of the unit you will find control that is really simple and well set. We've seen other air conditioners that went out of their way to be as distracted as possible. Not so here - everything is easy to understand. There are fan speed regulators, temperature, mode selector buttons with lights to make it clear what is selected and the timer button. The Pocket-lintA remote control is supplied too, which is incredibly convenient if you're too hot to move, or just too lazy, and you want to flick Electrolux at higher power or turn on the baffle, which makes it feel like the air is blown into space. Pretty much everyone knows that air conditioners can cool down. And in all likelihood, if you buy an air conditioner rather than a heater, you're probably most interested in how Electrolux performs in the bay department. Or you want to avoid the significant cost of gas or electric heating and its hot-to-touch panels. Once you turn it on, you'll hear the insides of Electrolux on fire. It's not a hugely quiet machine because there's quite a bit going on here - several fans that make it work to produce a pretty loud blowing sound when it's activated. Pocket ribbon At the top of the machine is a rising folding cap that you can either repair or move.
