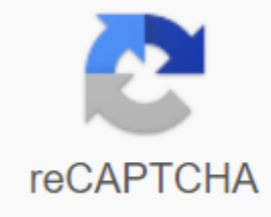




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Otaru japan port

The city overlooks the Gulf of Ishikari and has served as the main port of the long bay. With its many historic buildings, Otaru is a popular tourist destination. Because it's a. Sapporo drive, recently grew up as a bedroom community. As of July 31, 2019, the city has a population of 115,333 people and a population density of km2/2004/474.37 people (1,228.6 people per square meter). Its total area is 243.13 km2. Although Shiribeshi is the largest city of Subprefecture, the capital of subprefecture is located more centrally located in Kutchan. History Otaru 1876 Former Bank of Japan Otaru Branch, now the Bank of Japan Otaru Museum was an Ainu settlement in the city and the name Otaru Ainu is considered to originate, possibly meaning the river flowing on the sandy beach. The remaining very small part of Temiya Cave contains carvings from the Zoku-Jōmon period of Ainu history in the 400s A.D. Mount Akaiwa (the northwestern part of Otaru) is memorized in the Ainu tradition in the story of Sitonai, the young daughter of the village chief, who eats a white snake from the mountain cave, which demands the sacrifice of girls every year. [1] [2] Legend has burned the name of a large cave on Mount Akaiwa, the Hakuryu Gongen Cave権 (洞窟), the city. The White Dragon Gongen Cave) explains the reason for the construction of a tomb on the mountain (to protect the village from the hunting of the snake). [2] Otaru was recognised by Bakufu as a village in 1865, and in 1880 the first railway line in Hokkaido opened with daily service between Otaru and Sapporo. In July 1899, an Imperial decree established Otaru as an open port for trade with the United States and the United Kingdom. [3] The city developed as a financial and business centre in Hokkaido, as well as as the commercial port of southern Sakhalin, which was ruled by the Japanese until the 1920s. Otaru was renamed the city on August 1, 1922. On December 26, 1924, a freight train loaded with 600 cases of dynamite exploded at Temiya Station, damaging the warehouse, port facilities and surroundings. Local officials said at least 94 people were killed and 200 wounded in the disaster. During World War II, Otaru hosted a prison camp for the Aleuts, who were taken there after the Japanese invasion of Attu. [4] Since the 1950s, as the coal industry around the city has declined, the state of the economic centre has shifted from Otaru to Sapporo. Geography Otaru is a port city on the shores of the Sea of Japan in the northern Shiribeshi Subprefecture. The southern part of the city is characterized by steep slopes of various mountains (especially Tenguyama), where the height of land falls sharply from the mountains to the sea. The land available between the coast and mountains has been developed almost entirely and the developed part of the city on the mountain slopes is called Saka-no-machi, or Hill city, including hills called Hills amizaka (Boat-view Hill) and Jigokuzaka (Hell Hill). But in winter, Otaru is very snowy, getting 6.6 meters (within 260) of snow from November to March, almost constant snow and the sun level extremely low. The average maximum snow cover is 1.22 meters (48 in). Extreme temperatures vary from 34.9 °C (94.8 °F) on August 1, 2000 to −18.0 °C (−0.4 °F) on January 24, 1954, when the highest snowfall occurred at 3.1 meters (within 122) on January 24, 1954. [5] A record monthly rainfall totals dating back to 1943 ranged from 379.8 millimeters (within 15.0) in August 1962 to 12.0 millimeters (within 0.5) in June 2007. The city attracts a large number of Japanese tourists as well as Russian visitors. A popular attraction on the west side of the city is Nishin Goten (herring lodge). This large wooden building was built in 1897 and was once the home of Fukumatsu Tanaka, a boss of the herring fishing industry. It was originally built in the nearby village of Tomari and moved there in 1958. Visitors can clearly see the difference between miserable conditions and the luxury of the boss's rooms in a quarter of the 120 workers sleeping on the first floor. Another important building is the Sakaushi residence, built by Frank Lloyd Wright's student Yoshiya Tanoue. [6] [7] The Catholic church of Tomioka is also a popular place. Most of the buildings are historically architecturally defined. [8] [explanation required] A new Boutique Resort is located in the nearby village of Asarigawa Onsen and at the top of the Asari Ski Resort and offers outdoor entertainment activities. Another Wisbey Brothers Build, currently under development by LENKEN, is scheduled to be completed in 2018. Otaru is well known for its beer and Otaru Beer, next to the canal, is a popular restaurant with a medieval theme. Otaru is also known for its sushi freshness. Another food attraction unique to Otaru is rainbow tower ice cream. The town also has important shopping halls and bazaars, but less than nearby Sapporo. Otaru's leading industries are arts and crafts such as studio windows and jud boxes. Otaru protects the Music Box Museum. Tenguyama Otaru Tenguyama Ski Resort is an important port for Otaru Sapporo and part of this hilly city is located on the lower slopes of Tenguyama, a good place for skiing and other winter sports and accessible via the Otaru Tenguyama Ropeway.
