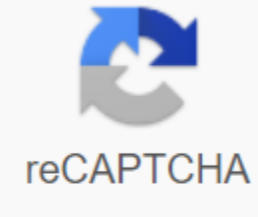

Obituaries The number of Wisconsinites coming up with the flu has increased dramatically over the past two weeks, especially versions of the bug that targets chil-dren, and the list continues to grow hospitals re-stricting children's visitors. The state has seen 459 hospitalizations for influence-za this season, the Ministry of Health Services announced Friday, up three times from last year at this time. More than 150 of them were reported in the week ending December 28, according to the state's weekly respiratory virus surveillance report. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention this week updated Wisconsin's influenza activity level to high. At that time, in 2018, the level was low. Eleven residents died as a result of complications of the disease. Although no paediatric deaths have been reported this season, the severity of influenza in children is a concern, said the state's flu surveillance coordinator, Tom Haupt. Two types of flu, the flu and A-H1N1, by-ticularly affect children, Haupt said, and influenza B continues to be the prominent flu virus in Wisconsin. Although an increase in cases at children's hospitals played a role in the rise - and forced Milwaukee and Fox Valley hospitals to nearly 12-tunes - hospitals across the state reported higher numbers during the holiday season, Haupt said. On Friday, the hospital Sisters Health System in Green Bay, Sheboygan and Oconto Falls also moved to restrict visitors under the age of 12, as well as people of all ages with flu-like symptoms. Bellin Hospital in Green Bay said Friday that it had not implemented specific restrictions on visits. The peak is earlier than the state usually sees, Haupt said. In recent years, peaks in activity have been reported in February or March. This year it could peak at the end of January, he said, but there is no real way to say. And, usually, flu seasons come in two waves, so this might just be the first. We're not sure what's going to happen, Haupt said. It's very difficult to predict the flu. DHS says that anyone who is able should get the flu shot, Haupt said. Reports on vaccine effectiveness will not be
