According to Ashley Poland Weather apps drain the battery of your Android phone not because of their visual design, but because of the way they collect and report data. More minimalist apps with fewer features will attract less power, but you can customize most weather apps to attract less power. The main feature that affects your Android phone is the GPS feature that affects multiple apps - not just the weather. Weather apps affect battery life in how they determine your location and how they are updated. Most weather apps use your phone's built-in GPS to determine your location, although they can also use your cellular connection to pin down where you are. Especially when you travel, this constant search and refreshing drains your battery. If you turn off your phone's ability to track your location, it reduces the load on the battery. Your Android device has a weather app built in: it's part of the Stock Watch app and gives you basic weather information based on Weather Channel reports. If you don't need constant updates or warnings about local weather, this may be the way to go. You can set your location rather than with GPS to determine your location - thereby reducing the GPS leak on the battery. You can also set a low upgrade interval, from half an hour to one day. This setting allows you to update manually when you need an update. What makes a good Android weather app varies among users. Swipe right to visit different sections, such as forecasting, graph viewing, radar, and more - each with their own individual tabs that set up the view (such as hourly or 10-day predictions). It also comes with several themes, so you can customize its look to your heart's desire. Where it falls short although the design of 1Weather is better than most weather apps that often feel very cluttered- I feel like its design can still be better. Yahoo Weather, for example, puts everything in one, simple, vertical scrolling view, which is better than switching between tons of different tabs. Similarly, Apple's default weather app on the iPhone allows you to expand certain parts of the interface for more information rather than putting everything in front of you. Small touches like this can make a big difference in usability. However, 1Weather is better for most of its competition. The Yahoo Weather competition is my personal favorite bunch and it solves most of my design issues with 1Weather. All you need is on the same screen, with less (but still readable text), as you scroll, you see the panels you want in descending order of total necessity (although you can change them). Weatherbug has improved a lot since it was our best choice, but it just didn't surpass the more well thought out apps out there. Weatherbug suffers from overload clutter, making it difficult to read at first sight as 1Weather. The Weather Channel aims to mimic the great design of Yahoo Weather for the first time, and it does the job well. Its biggest annoyance, however, is the unnecessary material between useful tile-giant ads, news and videos from the weather channel, and what's called Social Weather, which I can't imagine I ever want. And, you can't move these tiles around, so I see little reason to use this over any of the others. AccuWeather has a similar problem, giving priority to graphics and gimmicks that will put in the way of the actual information you want. If you want a different paradigm in general, there are a few other interesting apps out there too, like Nice Weather with its flat, minimalist look, eye in Sky Weather, which is about as easy to read as they come (but doesn't give you much more than basic temperatures and forecasts).
