Describe the types of glands in the skin. Sudoriferous glands- (sweat glands) - spiral tubes that stretch through the dermis and open on the surface of the skin in pores. Sebaceous glands (oil iron) - usually open in hair follicles; They produce sebum, an oil that keeps the skin and hair from drying out and brittle 13. What are the seven skin functions? Protection serves as a barrier to the sun's ultraviolet rays and the invasion of pathogens; it is also contained in moisture and prevents deep tissues from drying out. b. Sensory perception - nerves in the skin help the body respond to pain, temperature and sensory sensations. C. Regulating body temperature - blood vessels in the skin help the body maintain or lose heat. D. Storage - Skin as a tissue for temporary storage of fat, glitches, water, vitamins and salts. E. Absorption- Some substances can be absorbed through the skin, but it is limited f. Excretion - the skin helps the body eliminate salt, waste and excess water through sweat g. Production-skin produces vitamin D by combining ultraviolet rays from the sun with skin compounds 14. Name three substances found in sweats. Water, salt and some body waste 15. Erythema - reddish color, can be caused by burns or accumulation of blood in the vessels of yellowish jaundice; may indicate bile in the blood cells Bluish skin color caused by insufficient oxygen content; may be associated with heart, lung or circulatory diseases 16. Describe the six eruptions that occur in the skin and one cause of each type. a. Makula (macular rash) - firm raised areas such as pimples and some stages of chickenpox and syphilis c. Vesicles (blisters) - fluid-filled bags, as in chickenpox d. Pusholes-pus-filled bags such as those seen on acne or pimples e. crusts - areas of dried pus and blood, commonly called scabs f. Wheals-itch elevated area with irregular shapes such as hives or insect bites 17. What happens in the skin when the blood vessels expand, and how does it regulate the temperature? When the blood vessels expand (get more) excess heat from the blood can break out of the skin and the temperature? When blood vessels are compressed (becoming smaller), heat is stored in the body and the temperature rises. 19. Describe eight skin diseases, including the cause and treatment of each disease. a. Vulgar acne - inflammation of the sebaceous glands; the main causes include papules, pustules and blackheads; Treatment includes frequent, thorough cleansing of the skin, avoiding creams and heavy make-up, antibiotics or vitamin A ointments, oral antibiotics and/or ultraviolet treatment includes antifungal drugs and maintaining the area of clean and dry c. Skin cancer of various forms include basal cells, squamous cell cells and malignant melanoma; often develops from a mole or nevus, which changes in color, shape size or texture; exposure to the sun, irritants or radiation are common causes; bleeding or itching moles may indicate cancer; Treatment includes surgical removal of cancer d. Dermatitis- and skin imperviousness can be caused by many factors and often an allergic reaction to detergents, cosmetics, pollen, or certain products; contact with poisonous oak; Symptoms include dry skin, erythema, itching, swelling, macular papular rash and scaling; Treatment includes eliminating the cause as well as anti-inflammatory ointments, antihistamines, and/or e steroids. Eczema is a non-contagious inflammatory skin disease caused by an allergen or irritant; diet, cosmetics, soaps, emotional stress can cause Symptoms include erythema, swelling, itching, blood vessels, crusts and scaling; Treatment involves the removal of irritant and corticosteroids to reduce inflammatory reactions f. Impetigo- very contagious contagious contagious contagious usually caused by streptococcus or staphylococcus or kept dry; antibiotics, both topical and oral, are used by psoriasis- chromic, non-contagious hereditary skin disease; symptoms include thick, red areas covered with white or silver scales; Treatment includes charcoal/resin or cortisone ointments, ultraviolet radiation, and/or scale removal; no cure h. Verrucae- or warts caused by a viral infection; Symptoms include rough, hard, elevated, rounded surfaces from on the skin; some warts disappear spontaneously, but others must be removed with electricity, liquid nitrogen, acid or chemicals 20.
