

[44] Live performance of the MTV Video Music Awards Kicking off Sunday night's performance with her new single, 'Gimme
More, 'Spears looked bleary and unwilling - just like the recent tabloid exploits on the streets of Los Angeles. She lazily walks through her dance moves with a little gusto. It appears he has forgotten the whole art of lip-syncing; And, perhaps most unforgivably given that he once framed a link, he looks

was confirmed on September 6, 2007, that Spears would open the 2007 MTV Video Music Awards at the Pearl Theater at the Palms Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada, on September 9, 2007. It was also announced that he would perform Gimme More, with magic deeds from the illusion criss angel

February 2007. Within the first 24 hours of her post, the video collected more than 2 million views. [53] Leave Britney alone! made Crocker an internet celebrity, and was shown on television shows such as The View and The Tonight Show with Jay Leno. He was also spoiled by dozens of other YouTube
users, most famously by actor Seth Green. [53] [54] An editor for YouTube said the melodramatic two-minute clip made Crocker an immediate YouTube star and named him one of the top videos of 2007. [55] Berwayar named it the top video of 2007. [56] Spears' other performances did the track during
the Las Vegas residency show, Britney: Piece of Me. During Spears' 2009 concert tour The Circus Starring Britney Spears, Gimme More's LAZRtag Remix was used in an inspired self-defense art interlude between the first and second acts. [57] On March 25, 2011, Spears performed a special
performance at the Rain Nightclub in Las Vegas. The show's set list consists of three songs from his seventh studio album, Femme Fatale, including Hold It Against Me, Big Fat Bass and Till the World Ends. During the Performance of Big Fat Bass, Spears wore a latex bodysuit and elements 3, Gimme
More and I a servant of 4 U were also included. [58] On March 27, 2011, Big Fat Bass was also checked out at the Bill Graham Civic Auditorium which aired on March 29, 2011, and the same day, Spears performed on set on Jimmy Kimmel Live!. [59] Spears also presented

the song at his residency show, Britney: Piece of Me (2013-2017). [64] Covering versions and samples of Gimme More along with Rihanna's
umbrella cover in her YouTube account. Both became hits, with Gimme More getting more than 300,000 views in two weeks. Shortly thereaf afterwards, Digby became the eighth most subscribed artist on YouTube. He joked about the situation saying, I could do a karaoke video to ['Gimme More'], but I
just had my sledging pole taken off the other day from my living room, and it wouldn't be the same. [66] That same year, Australian pop singer Sia released an acoustic version of the song. [67] Swedish metal band Machinae Supremacy covered the song on their third studio album Overworld, released on
February 13, 2008. Matthieu De Ronde of Archaic Magazine commented [it was] one of the most unexpected covers of all time, ... This track has been given a fairly comical but fun makeover, but who says that metal can't be fun?. [68] American singer-songwriter Christopher Dallman played the cover of
the song during much of his concert in 2007. [69] Two years later, he showed his version to his publisher Rachel Alina, who prompted him to release the EP cover of Spears. [70] The EP, titled Sad Britney, was released on November 9, 2009, and also contained the cover of Radar, Toxic and ... Baby
Another time. [69] It became Dallman's first record for the charts on iTunes. [70] He also released a music video for Gimme More, criticised by Spears fans who thought Dallman made fun of it. He explained, There are some people who have been mistaken for what I did and thought that I somehow made
fun of him, which really didn't happen. I have such a place in my heart for Britney. [69] Gimme More was sampled in many songs, including Girl Talk talk 'Give Me a Beat (2008) and Satan in Light Pink Dress (2009). [72] In an episode of Michael Scott Paper Company television series The Office, Michael

Music Video Awards performances. [79] The single will.i.am 'Scream & Shout (featuring Spears herself) attempted Britney's phrase bitch!. Rapper Jay-Z tries out the line It's Britney, bitch! in the BBC, a song on the 2013 album Magna Carta Holy Grail. The song appeared in the 2019 American crime

he has been described as a master of lyrical slurrical art. [6] Born in the South Jamaica neighborhood of Queens, Jackson began selling drugs at the age of 12 during the 1980s crack epidemic. He then began pursuing his music career and in 2000, he produced the Power of the Dollar for Columbia
Records, but just days before the planned release he was shot and the album was never released. In 2002, after Jackson released a compilation album Guess Who's Back?, he was discovered by Eminem and signed to Shady Records, under the auspices of Dr. Dre's Aftermath Entertainment and
Interscope Records. With the help of Eminem and Dr. Dre (who produced his first major label album Get Rich or Die Tryin'), Jackson became one of the best-seller rappers in the world and rose to stand out with the G-Unit East Coast hop hip group (which he led de facto). In the year he founded G-Unit
Records, signing G-Unit associates Young Buck, Lloyd Banks and Tony Yayo. Jackson has the same and critical success with her second album, Animal Ambition, in 2014 and as of 2019 is working on his sixth studio album, Street King
Immortal. He produced executives and stars in the Power show, which aired on Starz. [7] Jackson has sold more than 30 million albums worldwide and won several awards, including the Grammy Awards, thirteen Billboard Music Awards, six World Music Awards, three American Music Awards and four
BET Awards. [8] He has pursued acting careers, appearing in semi-autobiographical films Get Rich or Die Tryin' (2005), iraq War Movies Home of the Brave (2006) and Righteous Kill (2008). 50 Cent ranked sixth best artist of the 2000s and third best rapper (behind Eminem and Nelly) by Billboard. [9]
Rolling Stone ranked Rich or Die Tryin' and In da Club on the list of 100 Best Albums of the 2000s and 100 Best Songs of the 2000s at numbers 37 and 13. [11] Jackson's early life was born in the Queens boast, New York City, and grew up in the South Jamaica neighborhood[4] by his mother Sabrina. A
drug trafficker, Sabrina raised Jackson until he died in a fire when Jackson was 8 years old. [13] After his mother's death and the departure of his father, Jackson was 14, a neighbour opened a boxing gym for local youth.
When I didn't kill time at school, I posed at the gym or sold cracks on strips, jackson recalled. [15] He sold fractions during primary school. [16] I'm competitive too... I think the rappers' own situation is like boxers, so they all kind of feel like they are champions. [17] At the
age of 12. Jackson began dealing with narcotics when his grandparents thought he was in the after-school program[18] and brought weapons and drug money to school. In the tenth grade, he was caught by a metal detector at Andrew Jackson High School: I was embarrassed that I got caught like that...
After I was arrested, I stopped hiding it. I told my grandmother [publicly], 'I'm selling drugs.' [19] On 29 June 1994, Jackson was arrested for selling four cocaine vials to an undercover police officer. He was detained again three weeks later, when police searched his home and found heroin, ten ounces of
crack cocaine and a starting pistol. Although Jackson was sentenced to three to nine years in prison, he served for six months in a boot camp and got a GED. He has said that he does not use his own cocaine. [14] [20] Jackson 50 Cent nickname as a metaphor for change. [22] The name was inspired by
Kelvin Martin, the 1980s Brooklyn robber known as 50 Cent; Jackson chose it because it says everything I want it to say. I'm the same kind of person 50 Cent. I prepare for myself in any way. [23] Career 1996-2002: Rise shooting, and Jackson's early mixtapes began raging in the basement level of a
friend, where he used turntables to record more instrumentals. [24] In 1996, a friend introduced him to Jam Master Clock. Jay taught him how to count bars, write corus, structure songs and make records. [26] Jackson's first appearance was on
React with Onyx, for their 1998 album Shut 'Em Down. He credited Jam Master Jay for improving his ability to write grafts, [17] and Jay produced Jackson's first (not released) album. [13] In 1999, after Jackson left Jam Master Jay, platinum sales producer Trackmasters signed him to Columbia Records.
They sent him to Upstate's New York studio, where he produced thirty-six songs in two weeks; [12] Eighteen were included in the 2000 album Power of the Dollar. [27] Jackson founded Hollow Point Entertainment with former G-Unit member Bang 'Em Smurf. [29] Jackson's popularity began to develop
after the success, the underground controversy of the single How to Rob, which he wrote on a half-hour car trip to the studio. [22] The track is comicly depicting how he would portray famous artists. Jackson explains the rationale of the song: There are a hundred artists on that label, you have to separate
yourself from that set and make yourself relevant. [22] Rappers Jay-Z, Kurupt, Sticky Fingaz, Big Pun, DMX, Wyclef Jean and Wu-Tang Clan avenged the track, [30] and Nas invited Jackson to join him on his Nastradamus tour. [31] Although How to Rob intended to air with Thug Love (with the Son of
Destiny), two days before he was scheduled to film the music video Thug Love, Jackson was shot and hospitalized. [32] On May 24, 2000, Jackson was attacked by a gun outside his grandmother's former home in South Jamaica. After getting into a friend's car, he was asked to return home to get some
packing; her son was in the house, and his grandmother was in the front vard. [passage required] Jackson returned to the back seat of the train, and another train was towed nearby; an assailant walked and fired nine watershed shots at close range with a 9mm pistol. Jackson was shot in the hand, arm,
hip, both legs, chest, and left cheek. [13] [19] His facial injuries resulted in a swollen tongue, loss of wisdom teeth and a slightly blurred voice; [19] [31] [34] his friend suffered a hand injury. They were guided to the hospital, where Jackson spent thirteen days. The alleged attacker, Darryl Baum, a close
friend of Mike Tyson and his personal bodyguard, [35] was killed three weeks later. [36] Jackson recalled the depiction: It happened so appropriately you don't get a chance to shoot back.... I'm scared all the time ... I was looking in the rear view mirror like, 'Oh unclean, someone shot me in the face! It's
burning, it's melting, it's burning.' [19] In his autobiography, From Pieces to Weight: Once in Southside Queens, he was After I got shot nine times at close range and didn't die, I started to think that I must have a purpose in life ... How much more damage can the shell do? Give me an inch in this direction
or that one, and I go. [14] Jackson used the walker for six weeks and fully recovered after five months. When he left the hospital he lived in Poconos with his girlfriend and son, and his workout regime helped him develop muscle physique. [19] [37] At the Jackson hospital signed a publishing agreement
with Columbia Records before he was dropped from the label and was semented by the recording industry because of his song, Ghetto Qu'ran. Unable to work in a U.S. studio, he went to Canada. [39] With business partner Sha Money XL, Jackson recorded more than thirty songs for mixtapes to build a
reputation. In a HitQuarters interview, Marc Labelle of Shady Records A&R said that Jackson used a mixtape circuit to his advantage: He took all the hottest beats from each artist and released them with a better hook. They then get into all the markets in the mix and all the mixed mixtape DJs mess with
them. [40] Jackson's popularity increased, and in 2002 he released a mixture of Guess Who's Back?. He then released 50 Cent Is the Future backed by G-Unit, a mixtape reviving material by Jay-Z and Raphael Saadiq. [27] 2002-2007: Mainstream discovery, Get Rich or Die Tryin', and 50 Cents
Massacre in 2006 In 2002, Eminem listened to Guess Jackson Who Returned? The CD received from Jackson's lawyer (who works with Eminem's manager, Paul Rosenberg). [32] Impressed, Eminem invited Jackson to fly to Los Angeles and introduced it to Dr. Dre. [13] [25] [32] After signing a record $1
million deal,[25] Jackson issued No Mercy, No Fear. Mixtape featured a new track, Wanksta, which appeared on the soundtrack of 8 Stone Eminem. [27] Jackson was also signed by Chris Lighty's Violator Management and Sha Money XL's Money Management Group. [citation required] Jackson released
his debut album, Get Rich or Die Tryin' (described by AllMusic as perhaps the most hyped debut album by rap artists in about a decade), in February 2003. [41] Rolling Stone expressed a dark synth groove, a busy keyboard and a constantly funky bounce, with Jackson completing production in an invalid
rear flow. [42] It started at number one on the Billboard 200, selling 872,000 copies in the first four days. [43] The main single, In da Club (noted by The Source for its blaring horns, funky organs, guitar riffs and sparse claps), [44] set a Billboard record as the most listened song in radio history within a
week. [45] Olivia, Lloyd Banks, Young Buck, and 50 Cent (left to right) in Bangkok, February 2006 Interscope gave Jackson his own label, G-Unit Records, in 2003. [46] He signed Lloyd Banks, Tony Yayo and Young Buck as members of the G-Unit, and the Game signed in a joint venture with Dr. Dre's
Aftermath Entertainment. In March 2005, Jackson's second commercial album, Murder of The Crowd, sold 1.14 million copies in the abbreviation sales cycle[43]) and number one on the Billboard 200 for six weeks. [47] She was the first solo artist with three billboard top
five singles in the same week as Kedai Candy, Disco Inferno and How We Do. [48] According to Rolling Stone, the secret weapon of the 50s was the sound of his mosquitoes - the tenor croons that rang the amateurs he used on almost every corus. [49] After the game Jackson signed Olivia and rap
veteran Mobb Deep to G-Unit Records, with Spider Loc, M.O.P., 40 Glocc and Young Hot Rod later joining the label, all of which eventually took off the label.

[54] It was sold behind Kanye West's Graduation, issued on the same day; The result of a highly publicized sales battle between Jackson and West has been accredited to the commercial deterioration of gangsta rap and the bling style of the era that
previously dominated mainstream hip-hop. [55] On september 10, 2008, jackson's number of live requests said his fourth studio album, Before I Myself Damaged, would be performed and released in November. He released Ok, You's Right, produced by Dr. Dre for Before I Self Destruct, on May 18, 2009
and is scheduled to appear in the fall episode of 2009 VH1's Behind the Music. On September 3, 2009 Jackson broadcast a video [56] for the Soundkillers' Phoenix–[57] producing the track, Flight 187, introducing a mixtape and his book (The 50th Law). The song, with lyrics inspiring speculation about

when she returned from the Tour of the Invitation in 2010, shelves black Magic. [60] On September 3, Jackson supported Eminem at his Home Tour, performing Bottle Cracks with Eminem and Dr. Dre amid rumours of tension between Jackson and Dre. [63] He recorded 20
songs to the concept of different albums before setting aside them,[64] wanting his new album to have a Get Rich or Die Tryin invasion'. [65] Jackson tweeted that the album was 80 per cent done and fans could expect it in the summer of 2011. It was eventually delayed a year due to disagreements with
Interscope Records, with Jackson saying he would release it in November 2011[67] with a different title than the Black Magic. [67] Eminem will appear on the album, and Jackson said he was working with new producers such as Boi-1da and Alex da Kid. [68] Cardiak, who produced Lloyd Banks' Start It
Up, confirmed that he produced a song for his upcoming album. [69] Jackson released a song, Outlaw, from his fifth album on the Internet on June 16, 2011. [70] Single, produced by Cardiak, was released on iTunes on July 19[71] (although Jackson tweeted that it was not the album's first single). [72]
The rapper plans to write a semi-adult semi-autobiographical novel about bullying, in contrast to his previous books focused on his life and power rules. According to the book's publisher, the first person novel (about a 13-year-old school bully who found redemption as he faces what he did)[73] is
scheduled for publication in January 2012. In a series of tweets Jackson told that the postponement of his fifth album was due to a disagreement with Interscope Records, [67] then suggesting that it would be released in November 2011 with its headphone line (SMS by 50). [67] He speculated to MTV
News about not renewing his five album contracts with Interscope: I don't know... Everything will be clear in the negotiations following I turned on this real album. And, of course, the performance and how they really treat the work will determine whether you still want to remain in that position or not. [74]
On June 20, 2011, Jackson announced the release Before I Myself Spoiled II after his fifth album, I'm On It, on June 26[76] the video was never filmed. [77] Jackson told Shade45, I performed four songs in Detroit with
Eminem. I did two with Just Blaze, alongside Boi-1da, and I did something with Alex da Kid. We made two definitely singles and the other two were the kind of records we made, more aimed at my core audience, more aggressive, more different types of energy for him. [78] He released the Street King
Energy Track #7 in September 2011 to Street King, his charity-based energy drink. [79] An announcement that Jackson had shot the music video for Girls Go Wild, the lead single for the fifth album featuring Jeremih, was made on September 28, 2011. [80] Jackson's fifth album, Street King Immortal, is a
scheduled for summer 2012 output and suspended until November 13. [82] A dispute with Interscope Records over its output and promotion led to its temporary cancellation. Her first promo single, New Day with Dr. Dre and Alicia Keys, was released on July 27. The song was produced by Dr. Dre, mixed
by Eminem and written by 50 Cent, Alicia Keys, Royce da 5'9 and Dr. Dre. A solo version by Keys has been leaked by her husband, Swizz Beatz. My Life, the album's second promo single (with lead singer Eminem and Maroon 5, Adam Levine), was released on November 26, 2012. In January 2014,
Jackson said he planned to release Animal Ideals in the first quarter of this year, followed by Street King Immortal. [84] On February 20, she left Shady Records, Aftermath Entertainment and Interscope, signing with Caroline and Capitol Music Group. [86] According to Jackson, although she was indebted
to another album she was released from her contract due to her friendship with Eminem and Dr. Dre. My special circumstances and circumstances and circumstances and circumstances and circumstances. It is also because leverage has a strong relationship with Eminem and Dr. Dre. They don't want me to be uncomfortable. They appreciate our friendship to
the point that they won't want [to affect] less money. [87] On that day, he announced that animal ideals would be released in 3 June[88] and released with a video Forbes.com. Produced by Jake One, it is a continuation of 50 Bars from the previous
album; two more tracks are scheduled for release on March 18. [89] At South by Southwest in Austin, Texas, Jackson stockpiled Hold On from the new album. [90] The song and Don't Worry 'Bout It were released with the video included on March 18. [91] According to Jackson, prosperity would be the
theme of the album: This project, I had to find a concept, a really good concept, in my perspective, and it was prosperity, positivity and negativity [for animal ideals]. [92] 2015-present: Street King Immortal, bankruptcy, and departure from Interscope 50
Cent on May 14, 2015, Jackson revealed in an interview that the first single from Street King Immortal, will be prewatched on Memorial Day weekend and will probably be released in June. [93] Jackson released Get Low on May 20, 2015, as the intended first single from his sixth studio album, Street King
Immortal (2015). The song, produced by Remo the Hitmaker, features vocals from fellow American rappers 2 Chainz and T.I., as well as American singer Jeremih. [94] He announced bankruptcy on 13 July 2015. [95] On March 31, 2017, Interscope released the last album 50 Cent for the label, the
biggest hits album titled Best Of. On June 25, 2019, the New York Times listed 50 Cents among hundreds of artists whose materials were destroyed in a Universal 2008 fire. [96] In 2020, Jackson described the executive producer's duties for the first album of a late rapper pop, Shooting for Stars, Goals
for the Moon, having become one of Pop Smoke's biggest inspirations. The album was released on July 3, 2020. Jackson cured the album, who wanted to finish it after Pop had died. He contacted many of the artists involved, and also features on one of the album's tracks, The Woo, which became the top
ten singles. [97] [98] Major Article Awards: List of awards and nominations received by 50 Cent Artistry Jackson quoted Boogie Down Productions, Big Daddy Kane, The Juice Crew, EPMD and KRS-One as her rapping influence, while citing LL Cool J as the inspiration behind her writing 21 Questions.
[99] Jackson also stated that he drew influence from Nas, Rakim and The Notorious B.I.G. while working on Animal Ambitions. [101] Jackson's business career. He is financially invested in a very diverse range of industries. Jackson is currently engaged in the
management of artists and talents, records, television, and film publications, shoes, clothing, fragrances, liquor, video games, mobile apps, book publishing, headphones and health drinks and supplements. [102] Its extensive business and investment portfolio contains investments in various sectors
including real estate, financial market investments, mining, boxing promotion, vodka, fragrance, consumer electronics and fashion. [104] He established his own record label G-Unit Records in 2003 following his mainstream success. [105] In November 2003, he signed a five-year deal with Reebok to
distribute the G-Unit Sneakers line for the G-Unit Clothing Company. [106] In an interview, Jackson said his business had a habit of doing good because he saw all his past and present efforts as spinning around the ego of his changes. [108] Jackson also began publication of the imprint book, G-Unit
Books on January 4, 2007 at Time Warner Building in New York. [110] He wrote several books including a memoir, From Pieces To Weight in 2005 where it sold 73,000 copies in hardcover and 14,000 copies in paperback; a criminal novel and a book with Robert Greene titled The 50th Law, a city takes
48 Power Laws. [111] In November 2011, Jackson released 50 Cent's Playground, a young adult fiction novel about a boy who was bullied, violent and his gay mother. [112] One of Jackson's first business ventures was a partnership with Glacéau to create an enhanced water drink called Formula 50. In
October 2004, Jackson became drinks when he was given a minority share in the company in exchange for being a spokesman after learning that he was a fan of the drink. Jackson was well aware of the health stating that he first studied the product while at the gym in Los Angeles, and noted that they
did a good job good water taste. After becoming a minority shareholder and celebrity spokesman, Jackson teamed up with the company to create a new Formula 50 variant of VitaminWater and mention drinks in various songs and interviews. In 2007, Coca-Cola bought Glacéau for $4.1 billion and,
according to Forbes, Jackson, who is a minority shareholder, earned $100 million from the after-tax deal. [113] Although he no longer has an equity stake in the company, Jackson continues to act as a spokesperson for VitaminWater, supporting products including the cruel about it at the BET Awards and
expressing his excitement towards the company continuing to allow its input on the product. [114] He joined right Guard to introduce body spray (Pure 50 RGX) and supported the Magic Stick condom, [115] planning to donate part of their proceeds to raise HIV awareness. [116] Jackson signed a multi-year
deal with Steiner Sports to sell his memorabilia,[117] and announced plans for a supplements company in conjunction with his film Spectacular Regret in August 2007. [118] 50 Cent with Val Kilmer at the American Music Awards Jackson 2009 founded two film production companies: G-Unit Films in 2003
and Cheetah Vision in 2008. [120] Cheetah Vision produced a low thriller of budget action for foreign film markets around the world. [112] When the G-Unit Films, folded, he focused on Cheetah Vision and the company secured $200 million in financing in 2010. [123] In 2010, Jackson revived G-Unit Films,
renaming the company to G-Unit Films and Television Inc.[125] The company had joint ventures with production company Will Packer Productions and Universal Television. In over 18 months, Jackson has sold the project to six different networks. Among them is Power, a STARZ drama in
which he not only co-stars but also serves as a co-creator and executive producer. Power's August 2 season finale garnered a high rating through this season, more than doubing the premiere and it generated 71% of
African-American audiences of any scripted premium series since 2006. [126] Jackson served as a co-television producer, co-creator and executive network drama STARZ where he signed a 2-year contract with delegates coming from the Agency for the Performing Arts. Ratings have been successful
for Starz. with the second season premiere being the highest season with 1.43 million people tuning in live. [127] [128] [129] [130] Jackson also served as a producer executive for The Dream School for SundanceTV, a series that follows fifteen high school dropouts as it is taught by a series of celebrity
teachers. [126] In 2002, Jackson filed an application with the United States Patent and Trademark Office to register the term 50 Cent as a trademark for sound recordings, and live performances. The application was published in 2003, and the registration was issued in 2004. [131] He has filed additional
trademark registrations. In July 2011, Jackson launched a philanthropic initiative to provide food for a billion hunger people in Africa by 2016, joining Pure Growth Partners to introduce Street King. [132] Part of the proceeds from each Street King purchase will be used to provide daily meals to underage
children. The partnership coincided with Jackson's goal of feeding a billion people in Africa over the next five years. 50 Cent and I share the same vision: to address world problems through smart and sustainable business models, said Chris Clarke, founder and CEO of Pure Growth Partners. With
rampant famines in Africa and hunger befalling children around the world, we need socially responsible businesses that affect real change now more than ever. Jackson says I was inspired by Clarke's vision and an innovative approach to addressing serious issues. Our mission with Street King to really
change the lives of children around the world. [133] In 2011, he founded SMS Audio, a consumer electronics company that sells Street with 50 headphones, plying to donate a portion of their sales to charity. [135] In April 2015, SMS announced a new co-branding offer with Reebok and Marvel. It added
those with existing partnerships with Walt Disney Parks, Lucasfilm's Star Wars, and Intel. [136] [137] In 2014, Jackson became a minority shareholder at Effen Vodka, a vodka brand produced in the Netherlands, when he invested an undisclosed sum in the company Sire Spirits LLC. [139] He is
now[when?] supporting the product through live concert performances and social media. The rapper was asked to participate in two signings of promotional bottles, one in Oak Creek and another in Sun Prairie. Jackson made an appearance at the Liquor Warehouse in Syracuse, New York on April 25,
2015 where he reportedly sold 1,400 bottles (277 gallons) of Jackson's signature liquor brand. Liquor Warehouse owner George Angeloro reportedly kept 300 cases (1,800 bottles or 357 gallons) of Effen Vodka, which sold for $30 a bottle, before the event. [141] In December 2014, Jackson signed a $78
million deal with FRIGO Revolution Wear, a luxury pants brand. The joint venture was coupled between Jackson, basketball players Derek Jeter and Mathias Ingvarsson, a former president of the mattress company Jackson became chief fashion designer for single-
brand boxer Frigo. [143] In April 2015, Jackson invested in Jamaica, exploring foreign investment opportunities on the island when he met several local officials and held ongoing discussions on investment opportunities in the resort area of Montego Bay. [145] Investments Over the years, Jackson
Jackson from music support and celebrities in various privately controlled companies, real estate, and stocks and bonds. [122] In December 2008 he told Canadian newspapers that he had been affected by the recession, losing several
million dollars in the stock market. Unable to sell his Connecticut fare home, Jackson postponed Before I Self-Destruct due to the severity of the economic downturn. [146] His Farmington root house located at 50 Poplar Hill Drive that he tried to sell for years filed for bankruptcy in Connecticut in 2015 listed
the asking price for the property in 2012 at $10 million but was worth $8.3 million in 2015. He first tried to sell the house in 2007 for $18.5 million, and lowered the price several times over the next five years, when it was on and off the market. [147] In January 2011, Jackson reportedly made $10 million
after using Twitter to promote a marketing company he was part of shareholders. His support company G Unit Brands Inc. was revealed through control of a public SEC filing of 12.9 per cent of H&h; H Import, which is the parent company of TV GOODS - the firm in charge of marketing its network of
headphones, Sleek of 50 Cent. Jackson bought shares in the company on November 30, 2010, a week after it offered buyers 180 million shares at 17 cents each. Jackson then made the stock proposal on Twitter, causing the value of his shares to rise from four cents to nearly 50 cents (32p) each,
closing on Monday at 39 cents (25p). Jackson was later investigated by the Securities and Exchange Commission for violating securities laws following his tweets that may have been accusations of trading Insider through Pam and a pile of stock investment strategies. [148] [150] In 2013, Jackson
became a minority investor in Hang w/, a live video broadcasting mobile app used by dozens of celebrities to broadcast their daily activities and chat with fans. The app has been downloaded more than 1 million times since its launch in March 2013 and has more than 1 million users as of February
2015[update]. Other minority celebrity investors include former NFL player Terrell Owens and record producer Timbaland. [151] [152] [153] [154] Heavy mining and metals In 2008, Jackson visited platinum mine ambitions, palladium and iridium in South Africa, and met South African billionaire Patrice
Motsepe in talks on buying equity interest in mines. [111] After his meeting with Motsepe, Jackson considered buying equity at the mine and A self-branded platinum line-up of 50 Cent. [155] [156] Boxing Promotion On 21 July 2012, Jackson became a licensed boxing organizer when he established his
new company, TMT (The Money Team). Licensed to promote in New York, he is in the process of being licensed in Nevada (where most major fights are held in the United States). Former amateur a
midweek Olympic medalist Andre Dirrell. [157] On July 29, 2012, he and boxer Floyd Mayweather, Jr., signed IBF featherwear champion Billy Dib. They unveiled plans to challenge the box-office practicing of mixed martial arts and transform the boxing landscape with TMT Promotions. [158] Boxer Zab
Judah also expressed interest in making a deal with Jackson. [159] In December 2012, Mayweather and Jackson parted, with Jackson taking over the promotional company and founding the SMS Promotion[160] with Gamboa, Dirrell, Dib, James Kirkland, Luis Olivares and Donte Strayhorn in his stable.
Bankruptcy On July 13, 2015, Jackson filed chapter 11 bankruptcy protection at the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for connecticut District with a debt of $32,509,549.91. [162] [163] On July 17, 2015, the Court issued an order allowing creditors to proceed with the punitive phase of the trial against Jackson in a
New York state court, in relation to the alleged release of a personal video. [164] His assets were listed as between $10 million and $50 mill
similar assets. Later in the week, bankruptcy lawyer Jackson described court documents that legal and judgment fees in excess of $20 million over the past year were the main causes of filings. [166] Its filing lists the 32 entities it at stake. Bankruptcy came just days after a jury ordered him to pay $5
million to rap ex-girlfriend Rick Ross, Lastonia Leviston for intruding on her privacy by posting her online sex tapes and another man. [167] In addition, Jackson lost a dispute over a failed business deal to come to bear the result of his sleek headphones, in which Jackson invested [168] A former partner
accused Jackson of then stealing the sleek headphone design by 50, prompting a judge to award a partner more than $17.2 million. [169] [170] His Connecticut bankruptcy filing stated that he owned seven cars worth more than $500,000, including the 2010 Rolls Royce and coupe Chevrolet 1966. [171]
Its expenses of $108,000 a month include $5,000 to gardening along with a monthly income of $185,000, mainly from royalties and investment businesses. The court filing says she also owes money to her stylist, barber and her fitness coach. [172] Other details in the
bankruptcy document include information on two offers that sell the right to collect play his music in the air. Half the rights to his portfolio were sold to British independent music production company Kobalt Music Group for $3 million and the other half for another $3 million with sales sales allowing Jackson

[193] He credited his son for inspiring his career and becoming a
motivation to go in different directions. [194] Although both had endured fractured ties that began when Jackson and Tompkins separated in 2008. [195] Their feud was taken to social media many times, including in 2020 when Jackson revealed that he used to love his son. [196] Jackson had a Marguise
tattoo with an axe on his right biceps (Kapak was 'causing me a hero. I didn't want him to be one, though),[39] and had 50, Southside and The Cold World behind him: I'm the product of that environment. It was behind me, though, so it was all behind me. [39] Jackson dated model Daphne Joy and had
her second child, Sire Jackson, with her, on September 1, 2012. [197] [198] At the age of two, Sire modeled for Kidz Safe, the headphone brand for children, earning $700,000 through his contract. [200] In 2005, Jackson backed President George W. Bush after rapper Kanye West criticized Bush for a
slow response to Hurricane Katrina's victims. [201] If his felony conviction did not prevent him from he said he would vote for the president. [202] Jackson later said that Bush had less compassion than the average human being. By all means, I don't aspire to be like George Bush. [203] In September 2007
he told Time that although he would not support candidates 2008, he loved Hillary [Clinton]. [204] Six months later the rapper told MTV News that he had shifted support to Barack Obama after hearing him speak, but had lost interest in politics. [205] [206] Asked his opinion on President Obama's support
of May 9, 2012 gay marriage, Jackson said, I'm for that... I have encouraged the same sex activities. I've been involved in the fetish area a few times. [207] He has been criticized for anti-gay comments in the past. [208] [209] Despite having many songs referenced drug and alcohol consumption, Jackson
remained teetotal, citing a bad experience with alcohol as his main reason. [211] Forbes expressed Jackson's fortune in 2007, ranked second behind Jay-Z in the rap industry. [213] He lives in farmington, Connecticut, a mansion formerly owned by former boxer Mike Tyson, [214] listing him for sale for
$18.5 million to move closer to his son (who lives on Long Island with his ex-girlfriend). [215] The mayor of Bridgeport, Connecticut declared October 12, 2007 50 Cent Curtis Jackson Day, honoring rapists with declarations and keys to the city. [216] One of Jackson's New York homes, bought in January
2007 for $2.4 million and a lawsuit center between Jackson and Shanigua Tompkins, caught fire on May 31, 2008 while he underwent a shooting in Louisiana. [217] In December 2008, he told Canadian newspapers that he had lost several million dollars in the stock market and, unable to sell his
Connecticut mansion, had postponed Before I Self-Destructed due to an economic downturn. [218] Jackson won a lawsuit in November 2009 against Taco Bell over the use of his name fast food chain unauthorized. [219] In 2016, about his beef with Meek Mills, he commented, You know, he really wasn't
very bright. The easiest thing you can do is bring others into the statement you say, right, as you write music. [220] On May 4, 2016, after making fun of a teenager who, unknown to Jackson, had a disability, he donated $100,000 to Autism Speaks. [221] Jackson backed Democratic candidate Hillary
Clinton in a runoff event for the 2016 U.S. presidential election. [222] He rejected a $500,000 offer from the Trump campaign to make an appearance on behalf of the candidate. [223] However, he supported Donald Trump in 2020, for disliking Joe Biden's tax plan. [224] A week later, he withdrew his
support, saying on Twitter F-k Donald Trump, I never liked it. [225], and endorsed Biden. [226] Drug convictions and assaults on June 29 Jackson was arrested for selling four vials of cocaine to an undercover police officer. He was detained again three weeks later, when police searched his home and
found heroin, ten crack cocaine and a starting gun. Although Jackson was sentenced to three to nine years in prison, he served six months in a boot camp (where he got high school diploma). According to him, he did not use cocaine. [14] [21] Jackson and four members of his entourage were arrested
shortly before 2am.m on December 31, 2002, when police discovered a .25 caliber pistol and a .45 caliber pistol in a parked car (which they searched for The rapist was charged with two counts of possessing a gun. [228] Jackson was sentenced to two years in prison on July 22, 2005 for a May 2004
incident, when he was charged with three counts of assault and battery after jumping into audiences when he was hit by a water bottle. [229] Lawsuits Use of Jackson's image filed a lawsuit against an advertising company, Traffix of Pearl River, New York, on July 21, 2007, for using his image in an
alleged promotion threatening his security. He was informed by a staff member to an Internet advertisement on the Myspace page. According to court documents, the ad has cartoon images of rappers with shooting a rapper and you'll win $5000 or five guaranteed ring tones. Although the ad did not use
his name, the image allegedly resembled him and suggested that he supported the product. The lawsuit, calling the ad as The rather literal use of Jackson's image calls[ed] for violence against him, seeks unspoilt punitive damages and permanent injunctions against the use of his image without
permission. [230] [231] Name use In 2008, Jackson sued Taco Bell through an ad campaign in which it invited him to change his name for one day from 50 Cent, or 99 Cent, in line with the price for some of his goods, and they would donate $10,000 to his preferred charity. The case
was settled outside court. [232] The Janitor Incident while walking through Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport in May 2016, Jackson interrupted and insulted a janitor at the airport, accusing him of being under the influence. Janitor was a hearing-impaired, autistic teenager named Andrew
Farrell. The guarantor's parents have seen the viral video as disrespectful and want to sue Jackson for his actions against their son. The lawsuit was originally more than a million dollars, but parents completed a $100,000 donation to Autism Speak and his apology. [233] [234] [235] [236] [237] Bamba
Samples In 2016, a judge declared that Brandon Parrott gave Dr. Dre and 50 Cent the right to Bamba to song P.I.M.P. [238] Civil and criminal matters One of the New York homes, which was bought for $2.4 million in January 2007 and the center of a lawsuit between Jackson and Shaniqua Tompkins,
was arrested on Fire undergoing a shooting in Louisiana. [217] On August 5, 2013, Jackson pleaded not guilty to one count of domestic violence and four counts of vandalism in a Los Angeles County courthouse. If convicted of all charges, he faces up to five years and a $46,000 fine. Model-actress
Daphne Joy accused Jackson of kicking her and running her bedroom during a quarrel at her condominium in the Los Angeles Toluca Lakes neighborhood on June 23. She allegedly caused $7,100 of property damage, leaving the scene before police arrived. [239] Judge Ann Nevins had ordered Jackson
to return to court because of an Instagram message he made for several months. [240] He said Jackson was unclear about his funds and showed rapist posts showing a heap of his money. In March 2016, Jackson claimed that he no longer uses Instagram, choosing otherwise to have his profile page run
by others. [241] Feuds Ja Rule Before he signed with Interscope Records, Jackson was involved in a public dispute with rapper Ja Rule and his label, Murder Inc. Records, saying that a friend robbed jewellery from Ja Rule and who last accused him of committing the robbery. [242] Ja Rule says that the
conflict stemmed from the Queens video shoot, when Jackson didn't like seeing him get so much love from the neighborhood. [243] At the Hit Factory in New York in March 2000, Jackson had changes with associate Murder Inc. and received three stitches for stabbing wounds. [242] Rapper Black Child
demanded responsibility for stabbing, saying he acted defending when he thought someone reached the gun. [245] An affidavit by a Domestic Revenue Service (IRS) agent recommended a link between Murder Inc. and Kenneth Agung McGriff, a New York drug lord suspected of involvement in the
murder of Master Jay Clock and jackson shooting. The quote reads: An investigation has dismantled a conspiracy involving McGriff and others to kill a rap artist who has released a song containing lyrics about McGriff's criminal activity. The rap artist was shot in 2000, survived and afterwards refused to
cooperate with law enforcement about the shooting. Messages sent over the Murder Inc. page indicate that McGriff was involved in an ongoing plot to kill this rap artist, and that he was communicating with employee Murder Inc. about the target. [38] The end of the Jackson-Ja Rule feud was confirmed in
May 2011. According to Ja Rule, I'm cool. We're not beef yet. We're not going to work together. That's just what it is. You don't have to go to war, but we don't befriend either. But we can
coincide in the world. He did, and he didn't think of me, and I did me and I wasn't thinking about him. [246] On August 7, 2015, a feud between the two then ruled when Ja Rule gave feedback to social followers via Twitter about the same disagreement between Meek Mills and Drake. Enraged, Jackson
then replies with photos and comments via Instagram, simply siding with The feud repeated three years later on January 19, 2018, when Ja Rule took to Twitter, calling out 50 Cent on social media. [248] 50 cents responded by buying and emptying the first four lines of his concert. The game though
Jackson was close to the Games before the latter released his debut album. Documentary, they grew apart, After the release of the Documentary, Jackson felt that the Game was not cloistered for saving that he did not want to participate in the G-Unit feud with other rappers (such as Nas, Jadakiss and
Fat Joe) and his desire to work with artists for whom G-Unit was feuding. He says he wrote six songs for the album and did not receive the proper credit, which was denied The Game. [249] 50 Cent at a 2007 Jackson concert later sacked The Game from G-Unit on Hot 97. After the announcement, The
Game (guest in the early afternoon) tried to enter the building with its sourcing. After they were denied entry, one of his associates was shot in the leg in a confrontation with a group of men leaving the building. [250] As things increased, the rappers held a joint press conference announcing their
reconciliation, [252] and fans were unsure if the rappers had held a publicity stunt to boost sales of their recently released albums. [253] After the circumstances cooled, [254] G-Unit criticised The Game's street credibility and announced that they would not appear on his album. During the Summer Hour
performance the Games announced a G-Unit boycott, called G-Unot. [255] After summer's Clock Game performance recorded 300 Bars and Runnin', extended diss G-Unit and Roc-A-Fella Records, to mixtape You Know What Is Vol. 3. Jackson countered with music video Piggy Bank, with the Games as
Mr Potato Chief and another rival's parody. [256] They continued to attack each other, with the Games releasing two more mixtapes: Ghost Unit and mixtape-DVD, Stop Snitchin, Stop Lyin. Jackson replaced the Head of the Games on the body of a male boxer for the cover of Hate It or Love It (G-Unit
Radio Part 21) mixtape in response to a picture of the G-Unit Games dressed as a Villager. [257] The game, under contract to Aftermath Entertainment, signed with Geffen Records to terminate his contractual obligations with G-Unit (though it was alleged that Jackson pressed Dr. Dre to fire him). [258]
Members of the G-Unit Spider Loc were insulting the Games in the song, and the latter released 240 Bars (Spider Joke) and 100 Bars (Funerals) attacking G-Unit and Loc. Jackson's response was No Rich, Still Lyin', mocking the Games. [259] Lloyd Banks responded to the game on rap City's freestyle
booth segment, followed by a Game Diss (SoundScan) song topping 13 on Apple's Rotten Banks chart and a disappointing second week of sales. Banks respond to Mo' Money In Mix Bank Pt. 5: The Green Season Gang Continued with Showtime (The Game's Over), said that Jackson wrote half of the
Documentary and shrugged off the Game's suicide thoughts, [citation required] In October 2006, the Games made calm (which was not immediately answered) to Jackson, [260] but two days later he said on Power 106 that the peace deal was valid for just one day, [261] In several songs about Doctor's
Advocate, he implied that the feud was over. He said in July 2009 that the feud had ended with help from Michael Jackson and Diddy, [262] and apologized for his actions. [263] According to Tony Yayo, jackson nor the G-Unit received his apology [264] and the Games resumed its call for a G-Unot boycott
at the concert. Jackson released So Disrespectfully on Before I Self-Destruct, targeting Jay-Z, Game and Young Buck. [265] The game responded with Shake, fun at a music video for the Candy Jackson Store. On August 1, 2016, 50 Cent ended a twelve-year feud with the Games when both were at the
Ace of Diamonds Strip Club and The Game said What happened, the was 12 years ago. [266] Rick Ross Though Rick Ross began his strife with Jackson over the alleged incident at the 2008 Bet Hip Hop Awards, Jackson told news sources he did not remember Ross there. [267] Later that month Ross'
Mafia Music leaked on the Internet, with the lyrics apparently insulting Jackson. A few days later, Jackson released Officer Ricky (Go Head, Try Me) in response to Mafia Music. The following day, Ross appeared on Shade 45 (Sirius Eminem channel) and told Jackson to come up with something better in
24 hours. Before leaving for Venezuela, Jackson uploaded a video (Warning Shots) and the first series of Cartoon Officer Ricky. In early February, he uploaded a YouTube video in which he interviewed Tia, the mother of one of Ross's children; according to him. Ross was in fact a correctional officer.
[268] On 5 February 2009, the Games phoned Seattle radio station KUBE. Asked about the dispute between Jackson and offered to the mediate: Rick Ross, holla on your son, your man and your 50 meal, boy. [269] On his album Deeper Than Rap, Ross referred to
Jackson in Cold Blood and Jackson's olek funeral was part of the song's video. As the song was screened, Ross says he finished Jackson's career. [270] Rick Ross is Albert From CB4. You've ever seen a movie? She's Albert, Jackson replied in an interview. It's never been worse than this. You get a guy
who is a corrections officer out and his entire career on writing materials from the perspective of drug dealers such as Freeway Ricky Ross. [271] Their feud at the 2012 BET Hip Hop Awards, where jackson and members of G-Unit Kidd Kidd, Mike Knox, Tony Yayo were seen in the video attacking
Gunplay (members of the Maybach Ross Music Group). Gunplay's The diamond music necklace was stolen during a brawl, and a few days later Jackson showed up in the bowling alley of Washington, D.C. wearing the Gunplay chain. [272] On January 30, 2013, Jackson tweeted that Ross's
