humanities and creative arts. The selective two-vear living learning program combines a small liberal arts college environment with the resources of a large research university. Gemstone is an interdisciplinary four-vear research program for students of all majors who have chosen a faculty. Under the guidance of faculty
mentors and Gemstone staff, a team of students will explore the interdependence of science and technology with society and design and conduct research directly. Integrated Life Sciences (ILS) is an equal program for students interested in all aspects of biological research and biomedical science. The University of
Computers, Mathematical and Natural Sciences has partnered with the Honorary University to create an ILS program that provides nationally recognized innovations in life sciences and interdisciplinary training of pre-medical students. The purpose of the ILS experience is to prepare students for success in graduate
school, medicine, dentistry, or other vocational schools. [70] University Honors (UH) is the largest living learning program at Honors College, allowing students maximum independence in shaping their education. And other undergraduates are committed to a broad and balanced education. [71] Students will choose from
more than 130 seminars exploring interdisciplinary themes in three areas: contemporary challenges and challenges, the art and science of the world as a classroom. The College Park Scholars Program is a two-year life learning program for first and second graders. Students are

work in the field of linear programming. Physics professor Michael Fischer was awarded the Wolf Prize (with Kenneth G. Wilson and Leo Kadanov) in 1980 and the IUPAP Boltzmann Medal in 1983. James A. York, a distinguished university professor of mathematical physics and chair of the mathematics department
won the 2003 Japan Prize for a chaotic system. In 2013, Professor of Physics Sylvester James Gates was awarded the National Medal of Science. [82] Study On October 14, 2004, the university added 150 acres (61 hectares) in an attempt to create the largest research park inside known as the Washington, D.C. Capital

facility. The Joint Quantum Laboratory conducts theoretical and experimental research on quantum and stomic physics. The institute was established in 2006 in collaboration with the University of Maryland and the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). The Technology and Systems Management Center
(CTSM) is intended to advance the state of technology and system analysis for the benefit of people and the environment. It focuses on conducting investigations into reliability, risk, uncertainty and decision analysis. The Joint Institute for Global Change was founded in 2001 by the University of Maryland and the Pacific
Northwest National Laboratory. The institute focuses on an interdisciplinary approach to climate change research. The Center for Advanced Life Cycle Engineering (CALCE) was established at the University of Maryland in 1985. CALCE is dedicated to providing a knowledge and resource base to assist in the
development of electronic components, products and systems. The National Consortium for Terrorism and Counterterrorism Research (START) was launched in 2005 as one of the Centers for Excellence supported by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. START focuses on scientific studies of the causes and
consequences of terrorism in the United States and around the world. Admissions to Maryland are rated more selective by U.S. News & amp; World Report. The university received 28,301 applications for its class of 2019 (entering autumn 2015), acknowledging 12,637 (44.7%) with 3,937 enrolled and an admission yield
of 31%. In the class of 2019, the mid-50% range of SAT scores for freshman enrollment was 590-690 for critical reading and 620-730 for math. The average score average (GPA) in high school was 4.22. From the 2017-18 admissions cycle, the University of Maryland uses applications provided by the Coalition for
Access, Affordability and Success [92] joining more than 130 top public and private university applications fees for U.S. military veterans and current service members applying for the 2019-2020 fiscal

ranked 43rd in the world in 2015. The 2017-2018 Times Higher Education World University Rankings ranked Maryland 69th in the world. The university ranks among the Peace Corps 25 top volunteer producing colleges for the seventh year in a row in 2018. [108] The University of Maryland ranks among the top 20
colleges and universities in the U.S. that will produce the most graduates for faculty and staff in 2017. Kipinger's Personal Finance 100 Best Value at Public College 2015 ranks ninth in college for students in the state. For the fourth consecutive year in 2015, the university ranked first in the United States in the number of
bohren scholarship recipients, with nine students receiving awards for intensive international language studies. The university is ranked by the U.S. Department of Education and Culture as the top producing institution for Fulbright U.S. students and scholars for the 2017 2018 year. [113] In 2017, the University of
Marvland was ranked among the top 50 universities in the 2018 Best Global University Rankings by U.S. News & amp; World Report based on its high academic research performance and global reputation. [115] [116] In 2018, the university was ranked Top 10 universities in the Princeton Review's annual survey of top
schools for innovation and entrepreneurship. This was the third consecutive year of rankings. [117] [118] The Campus Walkway University campus for its red brick Georgian buildings and its large central lawn, named McEldin Mall and nicknamed The Mall, the largest
academic mall in the United States. [119] The white pillars adorn many buildings, with about 770 rows on campus. The planting of 1,500 trees and gardens spanning 1,250 acres (5.1 km2) of the university leads the American Public Gardens Association to designate the campus of the Maryland State Botanic Gardens.
The designation allowed the university to display seeds and gardens, including native plantings. There are arboretum tours, including a centralized tree walking tour around McEldin Mall, with 56 specimen trees. In addition, there are nearly 400 acres (1.6 km2) of urban forests located on campus[122] and the Arbor Day
Foundation has named the university on its Tree Campus USA list. Like Paint Branch Stream, a branch of the Northeast Branch Anacostia River, it cuts through the campus. [124] McEldin Mall functions as the center of the campus. The academic building surrounds McEldin Mall at the northern and southern ends and is
home to many departments of the School of Behavioral and Social Sciences, the Faculty of Arts and Humanities, and the University of Agriculture and Natural Resources. West of McEldin Mall was the North Hill community, and south of McEldin Mall were Morrill Hall and Morrill Quad, the original center of the campus.
South of the Morrill Quad is the South Hill and South Campus Commons communities, and southwest is southwest to McEldin Mall to the north is Campus Drive, the main thorough fare through campus .Adele H Stamp Student
Coalition sits along Campus Drive near the center of the campus and shuttles UM (university bus service) and city buses to pick up and drop off passengers as a transit center for campuses. Hornbake Plaza, home to the Hornbake Library, and several buildings housing the academic department are also on Campus
Drive, east of The Stamp. Stamps will function as a center that includes a food court, bowling alley, bookstore and space available for major events such as freshman orientation and career fairs. Route 1, known locally as Baltimore Avenue, Most of the campus is located west of Baltimore Avenue, but fixtures such as fraternity lines and the Lecold Armory, and the
Rossborough Inn, built between 1798 and 1812, is the oldest building on campus (older than the university itself). [127] The campus drive, features a gatehouse called Northgate, an ornate gateway honoring the university's

The office has promoted several initiatives, including a 17 percent in 2008, the recycling rates from 37% to 54%, with some Feed the Turtle program for home football games. While campus-wide recycling rates are increasing,
some areas of the campus have high pollution rates, so not all bins can be recycled. For example, as of 2017, the Stamp Students Union had a 54% pollution rate in the bins, meaning that more than half of the waste in stamp bins had to be trashed. In November 2007, 6,000 people attended the PowerShift, the National
Youth Climate Action Summit, at the University of Maryland. The night hall, the university's first lead gold building, opened in April 2010 as the new home of Philip Merrill College of Journalism. [135] The university plans to add solar panels to the rooftops of the diner canteen on its North campus in spring 2010 and to the

Starting in 2010, the University of Maryland
Department of Systems and General Services launched three projects that would continue for the next 20 years [three project in West Virginia. The first of these projects, the solar project, is 16Project.
The first wind project is 10 megawatts and the second is 55 megawatts. The project will allow universities to receive 15% of the energy purchased from these renewable energy purchased from the energy pu

In 2011, the Maryland team won the U.S. Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon. [143] The team designed and built a solar-powered house with a split butterfly
roof in a project called WaterShed [the house was inspired and guided by the ecosystem of the Chesapeake Bay, connecting the house with its landscape and guiding residents towards a more sustainable lifestyle. More than 200 students contributed to the project. Maryland's design beat submissions from 20 other
universities from around the world, including China, New Zealand, Belgium and Canada, In the 2017 Solar Decathlon, a team from the University of Maryland won first place in the University of Maryland won fi
largely inspired by the environmentally conscious traditions of the Nanticoke people and other local Native American tribes in Maryland has been a canteen (OZZI container) since officially launching the program in August 2011. Promote the use of
reusable containers in [149] students first pay a $5 fee to use the container, but they receive coins when they return it to the dispenser. With coins, the use of containers is free. In January 2011, Maryland installed occupancy sensors in nearly all of its 300 general-purpose classrooms. [150] These occupancy sensors

collection by nearly 450 percent since 2010 [efforts are being made to add compost collection sites to academic facilities and residential halls on campus, while many have been removed due to high pollution rates.] Some Greek lifehouses and some of the apartments on campus were composted, but in 2017 and 2018

every 5 minutes in the fall and spring semesters (every 10 minutes in summer) and takes visitors to the campus (stops before the Stamp Student Union). Metrobus and Prince George's County TheBus bus services also stop on campus. In early 2012, TheBus service on Route1Ride (Route 17) was launched in
Washington, D.C. It was free for all University of Maryland students and staff on Route 1 from the C border to Ikea in College Park, stopping at the University of Maryland metro station. [168] [169] There is an additional service called Night Ride, which is available every night from 5:30 p.m. to .m:30 p.m. The service is
designed to service areas of the campus that are not part of the nightly service route. More than 21,000 parking spaces are located on campus in parking lots and garages. There are a total of 16 free, publicly available electric vehicle charging stations on campus, [171] and plans to add additional stations [zipcar services
on campus] will be available to UMD students, faculty, and staff. [173] The university plans to introduce a bike-sharing program and add bike lanes on campus in an attempt to make campuses more bike-friendly by installing covered bike parking lots and bike lockers on campus. As of spring 2011, the university was
encouraging cycling on campus by installing covered bike stores and mawat lane garage security lockers outside newly built Oakland dormitories. [176] In addition to the increase in storage options, the university allows students to learn how to fix their bikes and keep them on their own, and operates a campus bike shop
Since 2014, the University of Maryland has been selected as a gold-level bike-friendly university by the American Bicycle Federation. [179] As of fall 2019, electric scooter stations were installed on campus to facilitate the introduction of electric scooters, hybrid bikes and manual bike sharing systems. During the
semester, private scooter companies were introduced, slowly increasing the number of scooters and bicycles that can be rented on campus. Bicycles and scooters for paid rental are only available daily from 5am to 9pm. In the fall of 2019, personal scooters have also increased significantly on campus. Under the
administration of former President C. Daniel Mote Jr., the university was the main cause of Prince George's County's opposition to the installation of one or more light rail stops on campus as part of the Maryland Department of Transportation's Purple Line proposed out of concern for student safety, protecting sensitive
lab equipment. [181] This sentiment is similar to previous transit positions taken by the university of Maryland College Park Station

[184] Under President Wallace Law's vision in 2011, the administration recognized past transit mistakes and accepted having a Purple Line on campus to significantly increase transportation access for students, faculty
and staff, and encouraged more walkable transit-oriented development in downtown College Park[183] The Purple Line route, scheduled to be completed in fall 2022, has five stops on and around the university campus: M Square, college park subway station, the front door to the Campus on Route 1, near the Stamp
Student Union on Campus Drive, and on the other side of the campus on Adelphi Road. [186] [187] Diamond Back's main story: The Stamp Student Union's Diamondback, is an independent student newspaper. Founded in 1910 as the Triangle, it was renamed in 1921
in honor of the diamondback terrapin, a local reptile that became the school's mascot in 1933. Newspapers are published daily Monday through Friday in the spring and fall semesters, with a print circulation of 17,000 and annual advertising revenue of more than $1 million. There are four sections: News, Opinion, Sport
and Diversion. The 2008-2009 Diamondback received an Excellence Award from the Professional Journalists Association and finished second in the same category. [190] Three years ago, the newspaper finished third nationally in
the Best All Around Daily Student Newspaper, finishing first in the region. Notable journalists who have had him in the paper include David Simon from HBO's The Wire and NBC's Murder: Life on the Street. The disgraced Jason Blair, editor-in-chief in 1996 (he did not graduate and instead got a job with The New York
