now. When you use your phone, you start a number that calls *67, just as the phone number starts with three digits. The important thing to remember is that you need to put 1 in front of the area code because the cell usually doesn't require 1, for example, if you type *6719175551212 before pressing the torque button, it will lead you to read that the recipient sender ID is limited. On my phone, caller ID uses this method to turn on private calls. It seems like a smart way to keep your number to yourself if you don't want to let the world know.
