It's free to use and has all the tools you need to make powerful business presentations. It even allows the public to ask you questions and provides notes and a virtual laser pointer for presenters. Starting at \$24 per user per month, Slidebean will automatically create and format a presentation after you enter the text and images. The advanced version even offers analysis. The quality of these slideshows is high and gives an aesthetically pleasing look. It is our choice for businesses that want automatic help for creating distinguished presentations and that rise visually. Slidebean Pricing You can start building slidebean presentations for free, but you will have to pay to share presentations with other people. The plans cost either \$96 a year for the Starter edition or \$228 a year for the Premium version. Slidebean is expensive and the only platform we've looked at doesn't offer a free edition. Slidebean Features Starter Starter Edition gives you access to a basic set of tools slides. You can collaborate on projects with your teammates, present your content online, and access your company library of core templates generated by your colleagues. PowerPoint does not offer such community-made content. Then simply add the text and pictures and ask Slidebean to apply them to the layout of your presentation for you.
