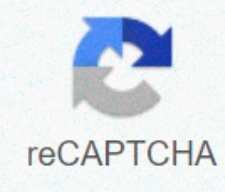




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Byzantine empire map worksheet

By the end of this mission, I will be able to: locate the Byzantine Empire and Constantinople. Explain how the Byzantine Empire grew as a commercial and cultural center along trade routes. Directions: Use multiple maps and step-by-step directions below to complete the map. ConstantinopleStep 3 - Follow the coloring instructions below. The color of the Western Roman Empire and the Eastern Roman Empire/Byzantine Empire are two different colors. Draw a red line or border between the Western and Eastern Roman Empires. Purple line for road.Using silk diagonal lines, color in Justinian-controlled area. (This area is specified on the map. This area will cover parts of the map that you've already painted.) BlueStep Water Color 5 - Make a key to select all of the colors/patterns used. Place a compass and address somewhere on your map. Step 6 - Answer map analysis questions below in the space available in the map worksheet. The area controlled by Emperor Justinian. How did the site and trade affect the Byzantine Empire? Compare the relative size with the location of the Roman Empire and the Byzantine Empire controlled by Justinian. Which is bigger? What important geographical features do they control? The great idea: Empires in Africa (Ghana, Mali, Songhai) and Asia (Byzantine, Ottoman, Mongol and China) grew as commercial and cultural centers along trade routes.
