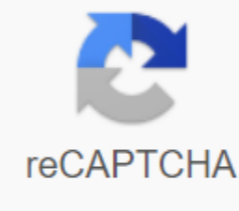

## Southern high school guam

Guam is a small island of 50 miles and 11 in width, located in the northern Pacific Ocean between Hawaii and the Philippines. Guam is a U.S. territory with a large U.S. military presence. In addition, the Guam Human Resources Management Company Chapter maintains the job-sourcing, and sometimes there are positions available as a civilian employee of Andersen Air Force Base or Raytheon Technical Services guam at the Naval Base. The U.S. Navy's Marianas Human Resources Office also hires retired or current civil servants. Construction work is often available temporarily on Guam. In addition, hotels on the island hire hospitality workers, although wages can be low. Other typical jobs on Guam are those in agriculture, manufacturing, public services, retail, contract and government. Government jobs are available through the Guam Government Administration Department. The Guam Department of Labor also maintains a working bank listing many of these positions. One phrase you'll probably hear on Guam is hafa adai, pronounced like half a day. It is a greeting in the local chamorro language, but it is also a symbol of the culture and spirit of Guam. Companies are working to show hafa adai spirit -- and recruit employees who can do the same. If you want to find a job in Guam, it is useful to adopt this philosophy, which means that you must be warm, open and friendly to everyone, whether you know them personally or not.
