


Job description for instructional aide special education

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Special education assistants work with special education teachers and/or therapists to teach children with emotional and behavioral disorders, mental disabilities, communication problems or physical disabilities. Special education assistants work with children individually or in small group environments. Working under the supervision of a therapist or special education teacher, assistants use techniques such as games and exercises to help children develop physically and behaviorally. One of the main functions of a special education assistant is to provide support to the teacher in the classroom. While other assistant responsibilities may vary depending on the needs of students, all assistants can expect to work directly with teachers on tasks such as lesson planning and paperwork. Special education assistants also rely on helping students in the classroom with physical demands such as food, care and toilet. Most importantly, assistants provide a safe environment and prevent students from harming themselves or others. Career growth is expected to increase career growth for all teaching assistants, including special education assistants, at 9 percent. Special education assistants who have two or more years of post-secondary education and those with diverse work experience are more likely to have better career opportunities. Aides who speak a foreign language will have the advantage as well. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the average salary of all teaching assistants, including special education assistants, is \$24,000. With experience and additional education, career opportunities will be possible. Special education assistants can move forward more quickly by seeking specialized training that will better prepare them to support students with disabilities. Educational requirements Students are interested in becoming special education assistants must complete the associate degree program. Some states require additional skills tests for individuals who work with special needs of students. Potential assistants should have a general understanding of physical, cognitive and developmental disabilities. Employers generally prefer to hire assistants with at least two years of experience with children, but this experience may be formal or informal. Training out of work for assistants will include immersion in the rules and operations of the school where they work, as well as a full

Knowledge of different cultural traditions is a plus, especially if the assistant plans to work in an urban area. In most states, assistants must pass a background check before being hired. Special education teachers' assistants directly support both special education teachers and students in inclusive classrooms. This role balances direct student assistance with everyday tasks such as meals and bathroom use, and educational tasks such as developing a curriculum and adapting lesson and learning plans to meet the specific needs of students. Special education teachers' assistants also ensure that their classrooms and lessons follow a curriculum developed by a school district or state and, in collaboration with a special education teacher, keep records of students. They can also teach special education classes if the teacher is absent, and lead classes in the classroom to build social and behavioral skills. Special Assistant Teacher Education responsibilities and the duties of assistant teacher special education may vary day by day, but most share several basic responsibilities: Developing a curriculum and lesson plans From the most important duties of a special education assistant teacher collaborates with teachers to develop lesson plans that meet the educational standards and specific needs of students in the classroom. According to the BLS, teaching assistants receive a median annual salary of \$26,260. The highest-paid teacher assistants earn more than \$39,780 a year, while the lowest-paid 10% earn less than \$18,460. The BLS also notes that about a third of teaching assistants work part-time. The BLS expects teacher assistant employment to grow by 8 percent by 2026, which is about as fast as average.
