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Smartphone games can be far from being at the level of the game console and PC. Things are getting better, however, with a number of excellent games that are released each year. In fact, it's guite awkward to play some of these newer titles on a touchscreen, and I'd much rather use a keyboard and mouse or a controller instead. Luckily, there are ways to play Android games on a PC! The best way to do this is to use an emulator. Although the selection is somewhat limited, some options are available. Let's step in and take a quick look at three such emulators that allow you to play Android games on your PC. Note: The system I use comes with a 10th generation Intel Core i7 processor, Intel Iris Plus graphics, 16GB of RAM, a 13.3-inch 4K display and Windows 10. Performance may vary depending on the configuration. Bluestacks 4/MSI App PlayerBluestacks was one of the first Android emulators I had used a few years ago to play Android games on my PC. It remains one of the best options even today, with the latest release released back in 2018 — Bluestacks 4 — still better. Getting StartedAll you need to do is download and install Bluestacks from the site to get started. Bluestacks 4 runs on Android 7.0 Nougat. Before you go back into horror about how old this Android version is, remember that it's pretty up-to-date as these types of emulators go. The good news is that you shouldn't have any problems running most apps and games. You'll need to sign in with your Google Account just like on any Android device. You can download apps from the Google Play Store by visiting the My Library section. However, after starting Bluestacks on your PC, you will see that it puts games in the center. The Game Center is packed with excellent recommendations, and you can also scroll through various collections and genres to find the best games. Bluestacks also made the MSI app player, which is another excellent emulator, but it's essentially the same thing with a different look. The interface is much cleaner, and you probably need to download beforehand. There are few game recommendations, but for the most part MSI products are introduced instead. FeaturesIt is not surprising that you get identical features with both emulators. The gaming controls and keyboard mapping are highly customizable, so you shouldn't have any problems replicating a PC gaming experience. The good news is that the keyboard mapping is guite without tinkering too much. Built-in modes for shooting and MOBA are also a great help in this regard. A multi-instance feature adds a new aspect to strategy and Gacha games by allowing you to play the same multi-account game. You can also play different games from different instances to avoid any confusion. The emulator also comes with a recording function and and Buttons built-in and easily accessible. As far as settings are concerned, Bluetacks and MSI App Player allow you to adjust the display resolution from qHD to Quad HD and 320. If your device supports this, you can also change the graphics mode and set it to use dedicated computer graphics. Performance I played Asphalt 9, Madden NFL Mobile and Fifa Mobile on both emulators and had a great time. There were a few cases of delay, but not enough to cause real problems with the gameplay. The emulators loaded pretty quickly, but starting a game took a while. But as soon as it started, it ran almost as fast as on my phone. Although I know that both are essentially the same, I felt like the MSI app player was the smoother of the two. Games tended to stutter noticeably more when playing on Bluestacks. This might be because the Bluestacks interface has a lot to do, but that probably wouldn't affect game performance. Either way, both Bluestacks and the MSI App Player are fantastic options if you want to play Android games on your PC. Nox Player is considered a really good alternative to Bluestacks and comes with similar skills. Like the contest, Nox Player also runs Android 7.0 Nougat and allows you to download games and apps from the Google Play Store. Getting startedEasily download the emulator from the Nox Player website and install it to start games on your PC. The Nox Player interface is similar to what you would see on an Android tablet, albeit an extremely old one. The screen opens with some pre-installed apps and it comes complete with navigation buttons (back, home and current apps) hidden in the lower right corner. You can find the Google Play Store in the Tools folder and download everything else after signing in with your Google Account. FeaturesThe Nox Player is not as packed with features like Bluestacks, at least at first glance. It comes with its own version of multi-instance, though, or multi-drive in this case. Keyboard mapping is also highly customizable. However, while Bluestacks has set up some pre-installed profiles, you need to start from scratch with Nox. That's fine, as most people will set everything to their liking anyway, but there's definitely a learning curve for a newcomer. Another aspect where Nox falls behind is the display resolution, which can be set to a maximum of Full HD. You can also select a performance mode to decide how graphically intense it will be. PerformanceI played Asphalt 9 and Sniper Strike with Nox Player. There have been some cases Delay and stuttering. The emulator starts fast enough, but a game takes quite a long time to load. During a game, it seems to take a little while to get going. For example, when a race on Asphalt 9 started, the backlog was very noticeable. However, it quickly got better after this initial stumble, everything went as smoothly as expected. Much better was the game, which was not particularly graphically intense, even if it took a while to load. GameloopGameloop, formerly known as Tencent Gaming Buddy, began as the official emulator for PUBG Mobile. This may seem confusing because PUBG Mobile is a mobile version of the original PC game. Getting StartedAgain, all you need to do is download and install the emulator. Like Bluestacks, you'll be greeted with a Game Center that hosts a number of excellent titles. Of course, PUBG Mobile will be presented, given the company behind it. However, you will also find many FPS, MOBA and strategy games. The app section includes some popular options like Whatsapp, Instagram, Youtube and more. However, the Google Play Store is not easily accessible. FeaturesGameloop comes with the least functions of the lot. There is no multi-sync feature, and in fact a non-cheating mode is automatically activated when you load a game. However, common features such as taking a screenshot, recording your gameplay, and carding keyboard mapping setup is one of the simpler ones. Something to remember is that the preset card is almost useless, at least with the games I tried first, so you have

to customize it yourself. I still prefer to do that, so it wasn't too much for me. For PUBG, however, everything is perfectly available. Includes options when it comes to display resolution up to only 1280 x 720. However, I was able to set it to Full HD manually, so this is an option. You can also switch the DPI between 160 and 480. Performancel of course played PUBG Mobile, but also tried asphalt 9 and Call of Duty Mobile. However, let's start with the emulator. Of the four options, Gameloop was the fastest to start and everything is really smooth when you scroll through the user interface. You can see the minimum system requirements when vou install a game so you have a good idea of whether your PC can run it or not. Gaming performance is everywhere. None of them are perfect, but I would recommend Bluestacks or MSI App Player for most apps and games. His smart control presets are the best of the lot and made the jump into a game immediately very easy. However, if you want to play Tencent games like PUBG Mobile or Call of Duty Mobile, Gameloop is by far the best option in this case. SINoALICE is free-to-play RPG with beautiful art, interesting and thought-provoking stories, incredible music and a fun fighting system. The only drawback is microtransactions. We don't often see staggered releases between Android and iOS these days, but It took Sky: Children of the Light nearly a year to get to the former. Good too, because it's a really fun game. It is worth installing if nothing else than to enjoy the beautiful art style, the beautiful world and the relaxing adventure. It's hard to describe Sky, but I'm going to try to be concise. After some time with the game, it is obvious that the focus is on exploration and conviviality. Their goal is to find lost stars and lead them home to their constellations; In return, they teach you new things. There is no fight in Sky, so anyone can be free without stress bouncing and enjoying. It is a very relaxing game with a lot to do for completionists and a lot for casual players to see. Sky's biggest attraction is his art style, world design and gameplay, all of which are simply breathtaking. Overall, I would say the biggest mistake with Sky is that it's very stressful on your phone. My OnePlus 6 heated like crazy and my Pixel 4 XL wasn't better off. There are also microtransactions to buy candles, which are an important item in the game. There is also a game currency called Hearts, which is how to buy cosmetics for your character. I've been plugged in for a few hours and haven't spent a penny, so they're not necessary or in your face. Sky is a beautiful adventure made by the developers of Journey. Despite some of the usual free-to-play cases, it's a very rewarding experience. I had trouble selecting only one classic RPG for this list as we have several to choose from. In the end, I went with Knights of the Old Republic, better known as KOTOR, for this list. For one thing, Star Wars is a very popular franchise and I think this is a game worth playing if you enjoy this universe. Originally created by BioWare in its heyday, KOTOR is a fantastic story. Ported to Android thanks to the people at Aspyr, KOTOR has new life on the phone and although it could be an expensive price for admission, it is worth every penny. From history to combat, this and its sequel are definitely the best Star Wars gamepad support, achievements, and a revamped user interface designed specifically for touchscreens. It's an excellent port and I haven't found any mistakes in the years I've played that. If you like Star Wars, do yourself a favor and look at KOTOR. KoTOR is a classic RPG that is considered one of the best of all time. It's worth asking for the price to get a fantastic story and excellent gameplay. Titan Quest was originally released in 2006 and helped fill the long gap that Diablo II had left before III came out. It is an isometric ARPG with tons of loot to kill monsters, and beautiful views to see. And while tho Nordic's Titan Quest Anniversary Edition still has a community on pc, Android users can experience this gem of gaming courtesy of a port from a few years ago. You are an unnamed hero, freshly landed on the shores of Helos in Greece, a village currently besieged by wild beasts and monsters of fairy tales and folklore. Once you have saved the village, go in search of the famous Leonidas and I leave the rest for you to discover. Spoiler: You'll see a lot of the old world. Titan Quest has a dual-specialty build system, which means you can combine two of the disciplines to create your own Demi God. If Loot is half the fun of Titan Quest, the other is definitely finding the build that suits your playing style. I would say that Port of Titan Quest has two major drawbacks. First of all, it's not a port of the Anniversary Edition and therefore all new content (additional specialties and enhancements) and improvements in guality of life are missing. Secondly, there is no controller support and the touch control can feel a bit twisted at points. Nevertheless, it is a mostly good port of one of my favorite games of all time and it definitely deserves a place in this list. This classic ARPG was ported to Android a few years ago and it's worth every penny. If you like old mythology, hack-and-slash ARPG gameplay and tons of loot, this game is definitely one you should pick up. Sometimes their opinion just doesn't suit everyone else, and that's fine sometimes. So is the case here with V4, I play I really enjoy, but has a ton of angry 1-star reviews in the Play Store at the time of writing. I wouldn't say that V4 is groundbreaking as an MMO, but because I'm mobile and game-free, I really like it. After it has just started, some start-up difficulties are to be expected. Some players have reported (over 1-star reviews) login problems, full servers and issues to get the character creator to spin. I've never had a single problem in my playing time. Despite a name that would imply a sci-fi setting, V4 is actually a dark fantasy MMO. Although there were launch problems, V4 offers 6 classes to choose from, explore a beautiful world, and do a lot of MMO loops. In the latest update, it now offers an excellent new 20 ys. 20 Battle Royale mode called Warfare. A big reason why the game plays so well is tencent games can be credited. Each card has its own attack and health statistics, and many have special abilities. There are also magic cards that have different speeds (some are instant, others take a round or two). These can be healing spells, barrier spells, etc. Cards break into offense, defense and support. The latter buffalo allied nearby with barriers, climbers to health/attack, etc. You have a mana system that determines which cards you can play. It builds up with each turn and some cards take multiple mana units to play. Even if you're not in League of Legends, Legends of Runeterra is a nice break from Hearthstone and still feels familiar. Adding more majesty to your life is worth the 3 dollars, in my opinion, and The Northern Expansion certainly delivers. It adds a new area, new enemies and new challenges. Not only do you need to look at mining resources to build your defense, but you also need to maintain and protect your supply lines - conveyor belts that deliver your mined resources from the drill to your core base and defense. towers. It took the entire tutorial to get a grip on the build controls and core game mechanics, and another hour of playing the game before I started developing some rudimentary strategies that worked for a while, but soon the AI opponents thought of my tactics, managed to bypass my defense, and absolutely destroyed my base. The solo mode only scratches the surface of everything Mindustry has to offer. You can set up a multiplayer game with custom servers or over a local network, create your own map with the included map editor, or create a custom game where the player gets full control over pretty much every aspect of the game. The best part is that you get this in a free-to-play game without ads.
