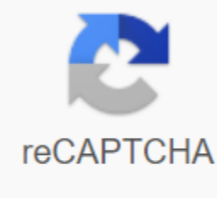

## Best countdown timer app for android

Photo: Daan Stevens (Unsplash)I've been thinking a lot about countdown timers lately, partly because I'm always curious about how long it's going to take until the next big holiday (like the debut of Star Wars: Episode IX), and partly because Lifehacker editor-in-chief Melissa stumbled across the Progress Bar app and I was curious if there's a cheaper way to do the same. For those who don't know progress Bar is a 5 dollar app that drops a nice little progress bar into your Mac's menu bar. Over time, the groin fills up. You select the interval, either the day, the month, the year, or your (estimated) lifetime. Whether you need a daily reminder of your own mortality or counting down the days until your fun weekend, it beats to pull up the calendar and do some mental math. Screenshot: Progress BarI has found many Pomodoro-like apps that allow you to set up a timer in your menu bar, useful if you're trying to take a break every half hour (or want a more explicit countdown for your workday). These include apps like the easy-to-use Horo I love. I wasn't able to find a perfect free match for Progress Bar – especially not one that will make you tick your whole life – but I found a reasonable alternative if you don't feel like coughing up 5 dollars (initially). The appropriately named app countdowns can be downloaded and used free of charge. Install it and you'll get a small icon in your menu bar. Click on it, select the Quick Add option, and you can choose from a list of pre-filled dates ranging from annual holidays to critical events (such as the Star Wars movie mentioned above):Screenshot: David Murphy (Countdowns)G/O Media can receive a pre-filled date from your first bag of 10 dollars from your first bag, or create your own, and a large text countdown will appear in your menu bar. You can cut out the seconds if you don't want to become too granular, but you still have to look at the days, hours and minutes. You can't replace the text with pretty graphics, but the countdown timer does everything you'd expect—no more and no less. Screenshot: David Murphy/You get a free countdown timer when you download the app. If you want more, you'll have to pay USD 2 per month for a subscription (don't do that) or USD 10 for a one-time lifetime subscription (much better). This makes this app more expensive than the progress bar, but at least you can customize what you're counting on – their great exit, that is. Whether it's ending your job or the rest of the 15 minutes you've given yourself to clean your inbox, it's handy to know how much time you've got left. This minimalist URL-based web timer provides just this service. The page on cd.justinj.com, which is paved by an unknown coder, pays attention to the text you insert by its root domain. Enter cd.justinj.com/5p and you will receive a countdown timer until 5 p.m. in current time zone, with a progress bar and a percentage that is displayed on the page. You can also enter specific timer numbers, such as cd.justinj.com/3h15m30s for a number of three hours, 15 minutes, and 30 seconds. For a raw number of minutes, simply enter cd.justinj.com/80. The live count is also preserved in the title of the page, visible in your browser tabs. There might be 300 JavaScript countdown timers out there, but this one just has our eye for its convenience and adaptability to catch. Thanks to j3st for the top! Sign in to the service with your existing TV cable provider information and get access to a range of Disney TV content. These include children's shows, cartoons and live action stuff, classic and new Disney characters, and even Radio Disney. Disney+ is an excellent streaming service, but you still get more daily Disney content from this one than you get from Disney+ and this still integrates with your cable TV provider if you still have one. Fandom of WikiaPrice: Free with adsFandom by Wikia is a community of enthusiasts who create these small wiki pages for different media objects. It used to be a collection of apps for different fandoms, but it's now a single app with each theme available. The app usually provides information about characters, movies, TV shows and even some games. It's a nice way to about basically learning any Disney movie, show or character. Of course, this includes a lot of Disney content. You can go with a station dedicated to Disney princess songs or just the standard Radio Disney for a great mix of music from Disney. Of course, the full version has all these stations as well as so current fans of iHeartRadio just need to press the search button to find these stations. The premium version adds unlimited skips and a number of other features as well. TV services such as Hulu, Sling TV, YouTube TV, PlayStation Vue and DirecTV Now all have a range of excellent child-friendly content. The service offers over 7,500 movies and that includes a lot of Disney movies as well as every Marvel and Star Wars movie. Disney will probably have all these movies on Disney+ when it comes out. Until then, however, this is probably the best place to buy and watch a Disney movie. The app is occasionally buggy, but it's otherwise pretty good. It also comes with Chromecast support. My Disney Experience / DisneylandPrice: FreeDisneyland and Disney World are two of the most popular resorts in the world. Both also have official apps. The My Disney Experience app focuses primarily on Disney World. You can use it to plan your holiday as an interactive map of the park, and you can even buy your tickets and merch there.
