What percentage of questions are there for each area? Circulatory diseases: 5 - 10%: Structure and function, Composition and function of blood, and terminology. Sample collection: 45 - 50%: Review and clarification of orders, Patient Communication, Patient Identification, Patient Assessment/Preparation, Site Selection, Techniques, Joint Test, Order of drawing, Complications/Considerations, Equipment and Terminology. Handling, transport and processing of samples: 15 - 20%: Types/suitability, accession, marking, quality, transport and storage, equipment and terminology. A non-refundable fee of \$135. What are test dates and locations? This exam is offered by appointment, year round, at various locations in the United States. You must take the exam within 3 months of your registration date. What is the most convenient way to enroll in the exam? Sign up online. What should I do on exam day? Bring a valid, non-expired form of identification. It must include your name, signature, and a picture. A calculator will not be required for this exam. Some items that are banned from being brought to the test area include: Food/drink, test preparation materials, cell phone, smart watch. What happens after I graduate? Within four days of taking the exam, you will receive an email informing you that you can review your score. In addition, within 3-5 weeks of receiving the email that your score is ready, you will receive a wall certificate. How do I know if I passed the exam? A pass score is at least 400. What happens if I don't pass the exam? If you do not pass the exam, genetic testing information will be included in your score report. You will be allowed five exams under the same route. If you do not pass after the fifth time, you must re-register to take the exam under a different route. If you do not meet the requirements of other routes, you will not be allowed to take the exam again. The ASCP Certification Board is accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). Below are answers to frequently asked questions about ASCP. Obtaining PBT credentials through the ASCP Board of Certification exemplifies your dedication to maintaining standards and skills as a laboratory professional. PBT credentials can result in better job opportunities, higher wages, and a career path within the medical profession. Am I eligible to take the ASCP exam? There are seven routes to meet eligibility requirements to sit for PBT credentials. All routes include having a high school diploma and clinical experience. Before applying to take the exam, you must review qualification requirements and collect the necessary documents. What's on ASCP? The certification exam consists of 80 multiple choice questions. The exam is provided by computer and you have two hours to complete the exam. Questions can be theoretical or procedural. Theoretical your ability to use knowledge. Procedural issues measure your ability to perform tasks and Protocols. All content areas include terminology, quality control and regulatory applications. The PBT exam assesses your skills and knowledge in six areas of content: questions in this area of content consist of five to ten percent of the exam and cover the structure and function of the circulatory system and the composition and function of the blood. The majority of the survey draws questions from this content area. 45 to 50 percent of the questions will test your knowledge in venipuncting, skin puncture, collection procedures, website selection, common tests, types and order of the draw, and complications and considerations. Sample handling, transport and processing 15 to 20 percent of the PBT survey assesses your skills and knowledge in accession, marking, assessment of sample quality, marking, transport and storage, equipment and sample type and suitability. Waived and point-of-care test Five to ten percent of this content area tests your knowledge of urinalysis, hemoglobin and hematocrit, clotting, glucose, and kit tests. This content area consists of five to ten percent of the total question of the exam. Skills and knowledge assessed include physiology, patient preparation, patient collection and treatment and management. Fifteen to twenty percent of exam questions come from the following topics: quality control, quality control, interpersonal relations, professional ethics, safety, infection control, coding and billing, and patient confidentiality. How do I sign up for ASCP? Before you can enroll in the actual exam, you must apply for permission from ASCP. You will submit your documentation and \$135.00 application fee. Your application is reviewed by an evaluator at ASCP. Notification that your application is a success is done by e-mail. Once you've received a recording message, you can sign up to take the exam. You have three months from notice to register and take the exam. Test appointments are made by contacting the Pearson Testing Center within the three month window. If you do not register during the window, you must register again and pay the application fee again. Test centers are located nationwide. What should I expect on test day? Follow the instructions specified by the test center for the test day schedule. Arrive with enough time to find parking and complete pre-test paperwork. Leave personal belongings at home as they are not allowed in the test center and everything you need for the exam is provided. At the end of your exam, the computer will tell you if you have passed. Within four working days of taking the exam, your official results are sent to you. If you haven't passed, wait for the official results before you can schedule a re-take. You can take the exam five times under one eligibility path. How will the test be scored? The consists of 80 multiple choice questions using a computer adaptive test format. Computer adaptive means that with each question you answer correctly, the computer chooses your next question with a slightly higher difficulty level. If you answer a question incorrectly, the next question will be a little less difficult; the more difficult the question, the greater the emphasis this issue is assigned. The maximum weighted score you can receive is 999, with 400 required to pass. How should I prepare? That's a good question. We have divided the answer into three parts. Do yourself a favor and study.
