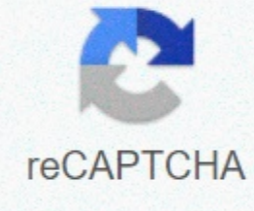

At all times, marines must appear clean, clean and, overall, professional. Uniform controls come with some restrictions that every Marine must comply with. Each season or occasion prescribes a different uniform with its own set of guidelines that can be found on the Permanent Marine Corps Uniform Board. 1 The general rules of the Marines retain the duty to appear dignified and respectable at all times. Uniforms may not be interchangeable. Athletic exercises and different field operations require different types of clothing. A commander sets the uniform of the day based on the duties and weather conditions of the day. Marines cannot mutilate their bodies in any form, including tattoos, marks or piercings, although female marines are allowed earrings. In addition, hairstyles, jewelry and glasses may not be eccentric or faddish as they diminish the uniform and identity of the team. A conservative style of clothing is recommended. 2 Grooming for men Hair must be natural in color. Nails must be cleaned and cut. Enamel for male marines is not allowed. Hair should be cleaned and cut up close. Faces should be shaved clean unless you have a mustache, which must be cut. Mustache hair should not exceed 1/2 inch. 3 Grooming for women Hair can touch the collar but cannot extend under the bottom edge of the collar. Eccentric hairstyles are not allowed. Combs bars, elastic can be worn if hidden by hair. Cosmetics can also be worn, but they must be applied conservatively. Nail polish in red tones can be worn, but marines prohibit the use of nail polish with the utility uniform. The Corps does not require female navies to remove leg hair unless they are unpleasant and can be covered with hosiery. 4 Designation of uniforms Authorized uniforms for Marine officers are designated as evening wear, blue dress, blue-white dress, service and service uniforms. Blue dress and blue-white uniforms with the exception of the blue A dress and the white blue A dress, and service uniforms can be prescribed for leave and freedom within the United States. 5 evening dress uniforms Officers A evening uniform can be worn for formal official evening functions in which civilians normally wore evening dresses or white tie during both winter and summer. Evening dress A contains dark blue with black trousers or dark blue trousers with skirt and a white for male officers and a long skirt for female officers. The B evening gown for black tie events is the same uniform but with a scarlet vest or scarlet cummerbund. Females wear a long or short skirt. 6 Blue Dress Uniforms Marine Corps designates blue uniforms for formal or semi-formal fashion shows, ceremonies, and social functions. Blue dress A and B are the same except blue dress B B ribbons to wear instead of medals. The blue dress comes with a blue coat and blue pants/skirt/pants. The blue C dress defines a long khaki shirt without a coat and tie for male marines and tongue for women's marines. The D blue dress is a short sleeve khaki shirt without a coat. Women's Marines can wear pants with blue uniforms. 7 blue-white uniforms The white-blue dress can be worn during the summer season and for official military/social occasions for which the blue dress uniform is normally prescribed. The blue-white A dress is the same as the blue A dress except that the trousers or skirt are white. The blue-white dress A and B are available with blue coat and white pants/skirt/pants. With white trousers or white pants, female officers and SNCO wear black, pumps, black oxford or black dresses with dark tubes or black stockings, gold or pearl earrings (optional) and a white shirt with black necktab. If they wear a white skirt, female officers can wear the same shoes as trousers, but they must wear a leather nylon tube and a white shirt with red necktab (officers) or black necktab (SNCO). 8 Service uniforms A uniforms can be worn for parades, ceremonies, social events and as a uniform of the day. The A service uniform contains a green coat and service pants/skirt/pants. Females wear the khaki shirt with long or short sleeves and the green tab with this uniform. A service coat is not worn with the service B uniform, which contains khaki short-sleeved shirt with blue pants/skirt/pants. Short-sleeved khaki shirts with proper green service pants or skirts/pants can be worn as a service C uniform. 9 utility uniforms This is a Marine's work uniform. Features a camouflage coat and pants with a sweater or sweatshirt underneath depending on the weather. The Corps authorizes the use of the service uniform during commuting to and from work to include all journeys on board DOD-owned/controlled aircraft. 10 uniforms for physical training A standard uniform for physical training consists of green trunks for general use and the standard bright green t-shirt. Footwear or headgear with PT uniforms are discretionary according to the commander. The PT cold uniform consists of an olive green sweatshirt and olive green sweat pants with USMC lettering and Marine Corps emblem on the left chest of the shirt and the upper left of the pants.
