Middle and High School: All clothes must be neat, clean, and in good repair condition. You may not wear clothing with inappropriate, suggestive or derogatory images or phrases. Garments designed to be worn as underwear may not be visible. No headwear should be worn in the building during the school day. This includes, but is not limited to: hat, bandana, scarf, earmuffs, sunglasses, or any other headgear, including hoods. (Exception: Any headgear worn for religious beliefs with appropriate documentation) Shirts and blouses that leave the midriff naked are prohibited. All shirts must have sleeves. Heavy, bulky jackets, or coats, as determined by the administration, should be placed in lockers. Shorts and skirts are to be respectable and medium length. Trousers and shorts should be worn in the middle and a belt is recommended. (Pyjamas are prohibited) Clothes with frayed edges or visible holes are not allowed. (Unless there is a layer of clothing under the frayed item) Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times (slippers are not allowed). Students who wear jewelry or accessories that may be considered unsafe or unsuitable for the learning environment may be subject to review by management. Any other garments or accessories that would be a distraction in the smooth educational process are prohibited. Students who violate the dress code policy will take disciplinary action and be discharged from the classroom until they comply with the dress code. They must not include offensive or overt, covert or suggesting messages relating to sexual innuendo, alcohol, drugs, tobacco products or weapons. Shorts Should: Measure more than the tip of the middle finger and/or fall over the lower part of the knee. Leggings/Jeggings: It can be worn, but T-shirts and/or blouses must be at least the length of the tip of the fingers to be suitable over leggings/jeggings. Pants and shorts should not: Contain writing on his seat trousers or shorts. You have holes, fissures, cuts, tears, fraying, or fringes. Sit low enough for underwear to show over the top of the pants or shorts. Skirts: The length should measure more than the tip of the middle finger when the hands are fully extended to the side. The top of a slit in a slit skirt should be under the middle finger. No underwear or skin can show over the top of the skirt. There's no room or writing on the skirt seat. Shoes should not be: Shower shoes, plastic or rubber slides, or bedroom slippers/home shoes. NOTE: Sandals are allowed, but must have a strap around the heel for safety reasons. Without being solved or unsafe? Velcro straps and cords must be fastened. It is worn with the tongue of the shoe outside or above the bottom of the pants. Jewelry: Body piercing that distracts is unsuitable for school and school-related activities. Perforation of the face will be limited only to the ears. Ear measurement is not allowed. It is forbidden to pierce the area of the eyes, eyebrows, lids, forehead, scalp, cheeks, nose, lips, tongue, chin or neck. If the jewelry presents a safety risk, it must be removed. Hair: No colored hair spray or glitter; natural hair color only (i.e. not pink, blue, purple, etc.). There's no facial hair of any kind. Hats/Covers: Not allowed anywhere on campus except H/F or Sports. They should not be worn attached to any type of clothing (i.e. not attached to a belt loop). Visible tattoos are not allowed.
