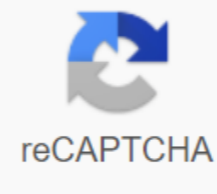

Clayton's Way Farm products include over 50 varieties of bar soap, our own felted soaps, Shea butter, natural pumice stones. The property in Gunn is set among preserved acres of farmland, fields and peaceful forests in central New Hampshire. CWF Soaps are made using the cold process technique. Much time, research and testing has gone into the combination of base oils we use, which gives us confidence that our soap will provide the best possible benefit to your skin. To the soap base we add 100% pure plant essential oils, natural ingredients, beneficial herbs & flowers, many of which are grown and harvested from our own gardens. A small part of our soap varieties are made with fragrance oils that are synthetic. These are listed in their own category for your consideration. No dyes, oxides, preservatives or animal fats are used. We don't test on animals (apart from our own - Lucky Dog). Soaps can vary in color from batch to batch due to oils, ingredients, and even certain conditions at the time they are made. Yellowing over time is a natural event and does not affect goodness. Our bars weigh a generous 4.5-5 ounces, and is cured a full 3 weeks before being sold. Click the Order Details page at the top to understand how to order with the best savings. About Us The well-known image used on the website, soap bands, and other media associated with CWF is one of Clayton Gunn and his father George, taken at the Gunn estate in the late 1930s. The Gunn property, located in Weare, was originally bought in 1896 by Richard's great-grandparents Barney & Mary Gunn. Barney died in 1916 and Mary in 1936. The property was then taken over by their son George and his wife Hazel, Rick's grandparents. This was during the Depression era, when only their strength, determination and hard work carried them through. In 1936, a tragic fire destroyed the Gunn farm, the barn and everything they owned, including cattle and workhorses. The years 1936 & 1938 also brought hurricanes & floods to the area, creating more hardship for many. A house and barn were dis-assembled and brought to the property from nearby towns where they were reconstructed. Together George, Hazel and young Clayton carried out farm life and a milking business selling to The Hood Company. After returning from the War in the Pacific, Clayton took over the work on the farm. He married Edith and raised three children together, Rick and his 2 older sisters Cathy & Carole. The adoption of Clayton Gunn in the mid-1990s left a bit of time when Edith maintained the Weare property before Rick & Sheryl bought part of the land in 2010, and over the next several years built a new home, raised a barn, added livestock, established gardens, and has become as self-descating as possible. They also grow and harvest many of the herbs and flowers used in their soap. The memory, spirit and integrity that Rick possesses of his father Clayton, and the legacy of 3 generations before him have been the inspiration behind the Clayton's Way farm and the development of Clayton's Way Farm Soaps. It's a shared family business, with Rick being the soap maker of over 50 varieties. Sheryl enjoys creating the finished look of the product, setting up wholesale accounts, marketing, and being responsible for booking shows, and keeping up with the website. Edith (Edie) Gunn Chase In the early years of the business, Rick's mother Edie was responsible for wrapping nearly 100% of soaps before walking out the door (she referred to as the wrapping). She also loved attending events, making sales and proudly sharing the story of the Gunn family. Edie has an insatiable love of life and is an inspiration for who meets her. Edie continues to provide support for the company, but we're sure are happy to have a back seat view, and don't have dozens of boxes of soap at her feet waiting to be packed. It was previously assumed that CBD in its isolated form was more effective than a full spectrum [Extract]; But in 2005, this theory was debunked by a study from the Lautenberg Center for General Tumor Immunology in Jerusalem. In the study, the researchers found that subjects administered with full spectrum [Hemp Extract] were provided with higher levels of relief, compared to subjects administered with CBD isolate. Additionally, the results showed that full spectrum [extract] yielded improved effects with higher doses, while the effects of CBD persisted consistent with increased doses. * ** doses. * **
