Constitution crossword puzzles basic

A clue will always be written in the same part of the speech as the answer. Check for call clues for answers ending in S, ED, EST or INT. Often these can be penciled in at the end (but not always). Checking the crossers of these answers can help verify what ends. For example, if both across and below leads to two answers which cross over the previous letter is plural, the possibility is that the letter is 's'. Foreign words will be flagged directly, Friends: Fr. = Ami or indirectly, Friend, in France. Short answers are directly indicated, with a brief word as part of whistletop (Abbr.) = STA or indirectly leads, RR stop = STA. These cluing conferences are acceptable ideals for American-style puzzles. A crossword puzzle is a game of words where the player is given a hint and number of letters. The player then fills in a grid of boxes by finding the right words. Liverpool journalist Arthur Wynn invented the first crossword puzzle. Arthur Wynn was born on June 22, 1871 in Liverpool, England. He moved to the United States at the age of nineteen. He previously lived in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and worked for the Pittsburgh Press newspaper. One interesting side note was that Wynn also played the violin at the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. Later, Arthur Wynn moved to Cedar Grove, New Jersey, and started working for a New York City-based newspaper called New York World. He wrote the first crossword puzzle for the New York World published on Sunday, December 21, 1913. The editor had asked Wynn to invent a new game for the Sunday entertainment section of the paper. Arthur Wynn's first crossword puzzle was initially called word-cross and diamond-shaped. The name later changed to cross-word, and then as a result of an accidental typo the hyphen was dropped and the name became crossword. Wynn based his crossword puzzle on a similar but very old game played in ancient Pompeii that was translated from Latin to English called Magic Square. In Magic Squares, the player is given a group of words and arranges them on the grid so that the words read the same way and below. A crossword puzzle is very similar, except that the words given to the player are given clues. Arthur Wynn added other innovations to the crossword puzzle. While the first puzzle was diamond-shaped, he later invented horizontal and vertical-shaped puzzles; And Wynn invented the use of adding blank black squares to a crossword puzzle. The crossword puzzle in a British publication was published in Pearson magazine in February 1922. The first New York Times crossword was published on February 1, 1930. According to the Guinness Book of Records, the first collection of crossword puzzles was published in the USA in 1924. Cross word puzzle book called A New Formed by Dick Simon and Lincoln Was the first publication by Compiling crossword puzzles from the newspaper New York World, the book was a quick success and helped continue publishing giant Simon & Schuster, who produced crossword books to this day. In 1997, crossword weaver was patented by Variety Games Inc. Crossword Weaver was the first computer software program that created crossword puzzles. Puzzle.
