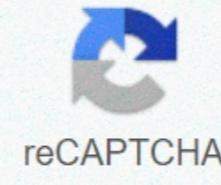




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Compound subject worksheets with answers

From the worksheet This subject and the predicates worksheet instruct the student to underline complex topics in the following sentences. If a sentence has two or more subjects, it is called a compound subject. The complex theme involves everyone that does something or the sentence. Each subject in a complex subject is often joined by words like and, or not, or not. This complex subject worksheet provides good practice for finding a complex topic in the context of a sentence. This composite subject worksheet can be used for different fall levels. This worksheet is suitable for 6. Read the sentence below. Identify the entire subject and the entire predication.
