And although commissioned public works of art have been part of our culture for centuries, they now seem more ubiquitous than ever. The meaning, and therefore, the impact of a commissioned work can change the fabric of a street corner or a city (think of the famous Bean of Chicago or the iconic Knotted Gun of New York). From the bustling streets of major American cities to the quieter corners of the globe in Howick, South Africa, and Las Colinas, Texas, Architectural Digest surveys 28 of the world's most fascinating public sculptures. While some museums and interior galleries have slowly begun to reopen at reduced capacity, outdoor sculpture gardens filled with art and art parks across the country, some attached to larger interior museums, and some focused on the outdoor experience. Some are in cities, while many are in more rural environments, offering acres of wide open spaces in the middle of nature. Here are the 15 best outdoor sculpture gardens in the United States that are worth a visit. Detour. From 15 to just an hour's drive north of New York City is 500 acres of outdoor space dedicated to large-scale modern sculptural art. Storm King features rolling hills, lush green forests, grassy meadows, glazed ponds and bubbling streams, with modern sculptures dotted across the landscape. Sculptures by artists such as Henry Moore, Andy Goldsworthy, Sol LeWitt, Alexander Calder, Louise Bourgeois and Tomio Miki are scattered everywhere, and some works are built directly into the landscape, such as Maya Lin's undulating wavefield. There is a large permanent collection (more than 100 pieces) as well as rotating sculptures in some regions. Because the site is so big, be prepared for a lot of walking. 02 of 15 Expect to cross some farmland before arriving at Glenstone, even though it is still considered to be in suburban Washington, D.C. The nearly 300-acre space, which began in 2006 with a single interior art buildings in late 2018. Visitors are guided along multiple carefully landscaped trails through forests, along streams, and through flowering meadows, with a highly organized selection of 20th and 21st century art strategically placed along the path. Jeff Koons's huge Split-Rocker, covered in flowers, is hard to miss, but don't forget to look for three andy goldsworthy structures, two raw metal sculptures serra imminently, and the creepy, spider-like aluminum Smug by Tony Smith. The architecture of the buildings that house the interior collections rises from the gardens as works of art themselves, with carefully placed reflective pools. If you can do it indoors, you'll catch pieces by the likes of Brice Marden, Cy Twombly, Roni Horn, and Lorna Simpson. 03 of 15 Courtesy of New Orleans and Society Nestled in new Orleans City Park, the Sydney and Walda Besthoff Sculpture Garden, part of the New Orleans Museum of Art, underwent an expansion in 2019, more than double its size. The garden now houses more than 90 sculptures amidst the unique vegetation of the Surrounding area, including tree awnings, wide lawns, cypress islands and a 2-acre lagoon, all connected by pedestrian bridges designed to complete the landscape. Some pieces are placed in the water, such as Katharina Fritsch's Schel (Skull) and Kenneth Snelson's Virlane Tower, while Elyn Zimmerman 'Mississippi Meanders' is a tempered glass bridge that extends over the Jean-Michel Othoniel's Tree with Collars also uses the terrain, with strands of glass and stainless steel hanging from a living oak tree. 04 of 15 New England's largest outdoor art venue, deCordova is about 20 miles west of Boston and sits on the old 30 acres collectors Julian and Elizabeth de Cordova. The couple donated the property to the city of Lincoln, as long as it became a public art museum. Today, the sculpture garden in a wooded area near Flint Pond houses works by Nam June Paik, Andy Goldsworthy, Jaume Plensa, Dorothy Dehner and Ursula von Rydingsvard. Don't forget to interact with Paul Matisse's musical fence and pose in front of Jim Dine's Two Big Black Hearts, which is particularly evocatively covered in snow. Visitors can expect about 60 sculptures on display outside, as well as a small indoor museum. Continue to 5 out of 15 below. 05 of the 15 Indianapolis Art Museums in Newfields / Getty Images The sprawling Newfields campus includes the Indianapolis Museum of Art, the Lilly House and this 100-acre sculpture park, with walking and cycling trails and a lake. Most of the works encourage interaction, such as the iconic Funky Bones by Atelier Van Leshout (composed of 20 fiberglass benches that look like a skeleton from afar) and visiondivision's Chop Stick, an interactive playground made of a fallen tree. The Newfields campus also includes formal gardens and a beer garden, so it's easy to spend a whole day here. 06 of 15 Richard Cummins/Getty Images Opened to the public since 1976, this 105-acre park combines nature and art about 15 miles west of downtown St. Louis. Visitors can explore multiple trails and see the eye of Tony Tasset, the Alpha of Beverly Pepper, Walking Roots by Steve Tobin, the concrete of Donald Judd Untitled (1984), the Laumeier Project by Jackie Ferrara and multiple works by Ernest Trova, whose initial donation of 40 works helped start the museum. 07 of 15 Richard Cummins/Getty Images Opened by the Seattle Art Museum in 2007 on a former industrial site along the Elliott Bay waterfront, this 9-acre park is now the largest green space in the city. Views of puget sound and the Olympic Mountains provide a magnificent backdrop for the 20 works of art. Visitors can zigzag along the way and see pieces by Louise Nevelson, Ginny Ruffner, Roy McMakin, Ellsworth Kelly, Mark di Suvero, and one of Jaume Plensa's huge heads, modeled after a 9-year-old girl. 08 of 15 Raymond Boyd/Getty Images Created through a partnership between the Walker Art Center and the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board, this 11-acre park opened in 1988 next to the museum. It houses some of the world's most famous sculptures, including Claes Oldenburg's iconic Spoonbridge and Cherry and Coosje van Bruggen. Other famous works include Alexander Calder's The Spinner, Roy Lichtenstein's Salute to Painting, Sky Pesher, 2005 by James Turrell, and Rapture by Kiki Smith. In the summer of 2019, the garden unveiled its new addition, a commission from local artists Ta-coumba T. Aiken, Rosemary Soyini Vinelle Vinelle and Seitu Jones called Shadows at the Crossroads. Continue to 9 out of 15 below. 09 of 15 Raymond Boyd/Getty Images In 1986, the Hall Family Foundation acquired 57 pieces from Henry Moore, and acquired ten more in 1989. In 1992, the foundation launched a modern sculpture initiative, adding pieces such as the famous Claes Oldenburg and Coosje van Bruggen specific to the Shuttlecocks site, and in 1996, the foundation donated all of their 84 acquisitions to the Nelson-Atkins Museum in Kansas City. Other works in the 22-acre park near the museum include Magdalena Abakanowicz's Standing Figures (Thirty Figures), Roxy Paine's Ferment and Robert Morris' The Glass Labyrinth, commissioned to mark the park's 25th anniversary, when it was renamed Donald J. Hall. 10 of 15 Robert Alexander/Getty Images Although small, the Sculpture Garden of the National Gallery of Art contains iconic pieces by some of the world's greatest sculptors, including Claes Oldenburg and Coosje van Bruggen's The Four-Side Pyramid, Louise Bourgeois's Spider, Robert Indiana's Amor, Roy Lichtenstein's House I, Roxy Paine's Graft and Marc Chagall's Orpheus, a 10-by-17-foot mosaic made of glass and stone. Interestingly, the garden also features one of the original entrances to the Paris Art Nouveau metro by architect Hector Guimard, which was cast iron in 1913 and restored by the museum. 11 out of 15 While Storm King in New York is getting a lot of recognition, this outdoor art park just a little further north is also worth a visit. Art Omi is spread over 300 acres of open fields and forests in the Hudson Valley. There are more than 60 works of art and architecture, including sculptures by Oliver Kruse, Tony Tassett, Donald Lipski, Beverly Pepper, Dewitt Godfrey, and Will Ryman. A separate part of the park is devoted to architecture, which facilitates projects exploring the intersection of architecture, art and landscape by architects, including pieces by Cameron Wu, professor of architecture at Princeton University, and Steven Holl, of Steven Holl Architects, whose piece made from robotically cut CLT serves as a solar gauge. 12 out of 15 Courtesy of the Hammer Museum There are about 70 modern sculptures in this 5-acre sculpture garden on the grounds of the University of California, Los Angeles, including four bronze bas-reliefs by Henri Matisse. Supervised by the Hammer Museum, the collection consists mainly of 20th century pieces, with the exception of a 2006 Richard Serra curved steel piece. Other artists represented include Auguste Rodin, Hans Arp, Joan Miro, Anna Mahler and Isamu Noquchi, whose mingle with rolling lawns and perfectly placed trees. Frank Lloyd Wright's Fallingwater House is also nearby. 14 of 15 bauhaus1000 / Getty Images The 9,100 lush and wandering acres of Brookgreen Gardens near Myrtle Beach contain one of the largest collections of outdoor figurative sculptures by American artists in the world. The land is also a wildlife reserve and contains the Lowcountry Zoo and several gardens about them. It was previously the site of four rice plantations. Archer and Anna Hyatt Huntington of Connecticut purchased the plantations to create gardens to showcase Anna's sculptures. When it opened as a public garden in 1932, it was the first public sculpture garden in the country. Today, there are more than 2,000 pieces in the collection, with works by Anna Huntington as well as Karl Gruppe, Cornelia Van Auken Chapin, Edith Howland, Donald De Lue, Marion Sanford and Augustus Saint-Gaudens. The Lowcountry Trail features a restored rice field from the plantation, four structural archaeological remains from the time, and signs describing the life of slaves on the plantation. 15 of 15 Courtesy of Nathan Manilow Sculpture Park Affectionately called the Nate, this art park about 40 miles south of Chicago contains 30 large-scale sculptures spread over 100 acres of Prairie landscape. Visitors can see pieces such as Tony Tasset's first major piece, the 30-foot-tall lumberjack Paul, Bruce Nauman House Divided, James Brenner twisting Passage, and Bodark Arc, set in the earth by artist Martin Puryear. It is so large that it can only be seen from the air. Air.
