
Kayarian ng pang-uri worksheets for grade 6

Uri ng Pangnglan Ayon sa Kayarian\_1; Mga sagot sa uri ng Pangngalan ayon sa Kayarian\_1; Mga sagot sa uri ng Pangnglan Ayon sa Kayarian\_1; This 40-point sheet has two parts. The first part asks the student to say whether the given noun is payak, maylapi, inuulit, or tambalalan. The second part asks students to classify this noun into the same four categories. 2.
