Each program covers one issue and studio guests participate in discussions. Debut history in 1995,[1] Insight began as a domestic current affairs program primarily covering Australian issues, while Dateline dealt with international issues. It was hosted by Gail Jennings from 1999 to 2001. After that, Jenny Brockie, who came from ABC, started hosting the program. Shortly after, the format changed to a discussion forum focused on one issue, with the participation of a studio audience. Over the course of the program, there are sometimes live satellite links to experts from around the world, but the main focus in recent years (as of 2019 [update]) is on studio guests talking about their personal experiences on various issues, along with contributions from selected audiences. Recent episodes have focused on more personal issues and the challenges faced by ordinary people. Topics include Aboriginal issues, endometriosis, school bullying, ME/CFS, transgender people, etc.[2] Jenny Brockie ended the program in October 2020, with the immediate announcement of a new host in 2021, although it is stated that the show will continue.
