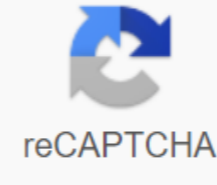

What makes it so intriguing? The freedom this game, developed by Bioware, offers was groundbreaking when it came out in 2003 and paved the way for bioware's selection of based narrative games in the coming years. This allows you to choose how to react to situations and in turn determines whether you can align to the dark side or the bright side of the Force. This means that every time you play a game, you can get different results. When this game came out, it was the fastest-selling game on Xbox. Fortunately, you can still play on PC. The fight is not exactly turn-based in this RPG, but is based on a round one. You line up for attacks, and then when it's time to land, you can see cool battle animations. This style of battle may not be every cup of blue milk, but I like it. When designing a character, you can choose the gender, class type, and look at the list of pre-planned options. My biggest complaint with this game is that during gameplay, some of the choices you come across are a little too black and white, or seem ridiculous. Additionally, sometimes it seems that you are getting light or dark side points for no reason. Still, this is an amazing game that any Star Wars fan should experience. Source: BioWare This huge online multiplayer rpg (MMORPG) was originally released in 2011 and is still receiving new content, so there are many missions to play. The story takes place 3,600 years before the events of the Star Wars movies and takes you on a journey to different parts of the galaxy. You can choose whether you match the Galactic Republic or the Sith Empire, which determines the type of mission you receive. As you can see in the photo, the graphics are not up to scratch by modern standards, but they are not bad. I love all the customizable character choices, including clothes that the way your character looks and the class you belong to. Something noted is that this game focuses on the plot so the fight is relatively easy. This can be good or bad depending on how you prefer the gaming experience. While playing with friends, you will encounter intersections and a storyline that revolves around specific characters. This amazing element makes you feel like the game was created just for your character. As the game progresses you will get morality points that determine exactly where you stand on the dark side/light side spectrum. Don't worry solo players: there's plenty of single-player content if you prefer to play this way. Sometimes the game encounters glitches and technical difficulties, so you need to be aware of it. The biggest downside of this game is that although it is free-to-play at the beginning, once you reach level 50 you have to pay to get further. Additionally, some game elements require you to pay for premium account for access. As a child, I spent hours playing these games and always waited for another one to be released. I came back and played them many times as an adult and still find them fun, even if the graphics are outdated and acting is endearingly hokey sometimes. However, my favorite game in the series is undoubtedly Jedi Knight II: Jedi Outcast. Have you ever wanted to see Han Solo wield a lightsaber? This is the game for you. This first-person shooter follows Kyle Katarn, who is basically the best part of Luke and Han mixed with one person. This smuggler-turned-Jedi must stop the dark forces, master his powers, travel around the galaxy and interact with familiar faces from the original movie trilogy. You will have access to blasters, lightsaber and powers as you take on dark side enemies and Siths. Keep in mind that Jedi Knight games were created before Disney took over the franchise and changed the Star Wars canon, so some elements of the story may be surprising. You can still play these games on PC. Since they are relatively old, they are usually cheap to pick up. Play the full series to get the full story of Kyle Katarn, or just pick up Jedi Knight II: Jedi Outcast. As you can tell by the graphics of most of the games on this list, it took a few years for players to finally get another decent single-player Star Wars game. Luckily, we just got a great new option in Jedi: Fallen Order. The story takes place immediately after the events of episode III. You follow Cal Kestis, one of the last remaining Jedi to keep his powers secret during the Jedi purge (time after time after Vader was created). Something happened to Cal, who blocked his power skills. You must remaster them to search for other Jedi and defeat the Imperial Inquisitors along the way. This journey will take you to several famous locals, as well as brand new ones. Do not expect this game to be a walk in the park. Fallen Order has a difficult lightsaber sparring system. You need to think carefully before making a move against your opponent or it can leave you wide open to attack. So instead of just spamming the buttons, you really need to strategize and rethink your moves. The plot is a bit chaotic and feels limited based on the boundaries created by the movies, but it's still a really cool game for Star Wars fans. The only downside is that this game leaves you on a little cliff hanger, and the next game isn't even close to release yet. Fallen Order is available on PS4, Xbox One and PC. The company got a little smarter with this sequel than with the original. Still, for all its flaws, this is the best online multiplayer Star Wars game out there. First, the graphics are absolutely wonderful. When you play on the rainy Endor, droplets falling on your character and on the screen will amaze you. You can also explore amazing battle locations and play as your favorite fan characters. Online multiplayer allows you to get new items, unlock characters and use new weapons. There are 11 multiplayer modes to keep the gameplay fresh and interesting. One of the worst things about this game is that it doesn't offer a split screen online, so you can't play online with a buddy in the same room. In addition, ps4 and Xbox One versions of the game include a local split-screen co-op mode, but the PC version does not EA also included a single-player campaign mode that wasn't in the original Star Wars Battlefront. You follow the commander of the Inferno Squad, Iden Versio, as he begins to doubt the war he is fighting for the emperor. The story takes place during the events of The Return of the Jedi and largely continues until before the Force Awakens. While this mode will briefly look at Star Wars themes and provide a fascinating story, it's too early. This is a game to play if you want to have a ridiculously funny time experiencing the first six Star Wars movies with a friend or with a child. Since it is a collection of two games, there are several levels and hours of gameplay. One of the things that makes this collection of games so interesting is that each character is assigned a character type, so they have different tools and skills. You can play through the level and realize that your character does not have the right tool to reach a specific area. Later, you'll unlock a new character and you can play a level to reach that location. Similarly, there are several secrets hidden throughout the game to keep your gaming sessions interesting. LEGO heroes don't talk, but they do pantomime and solve difficulties in a way that only LEGOS can have. This adds a level of humor to familiar intersections while making them new.
