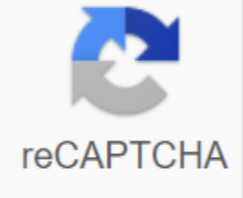

But when it comes to reading out loud for young children, I've learned not to ignore chapters of books and novels. It may seem daunting to open a hundred-plus pages of volume when your audience has a concentration in the length of an episode of Peppa Pig, but the experience of taking it through a story can be deeply rewarding. In a reddit commemorative thread, one father shared what it was like to read The Hobbit to his six-year-old son within two months. I've been waiting to read The Hobbit to my son since he was born, but I had to wait until he was old enough to appreciate it. This was my first time reading it, too. He loves everything he has to do with knights, castles and dragons, so I knew it was going to be a great success. For two months, for about 30 minutes a night before going to bed, I acted as best I could, the adventures of Bilbo Baggins and company. I really enjoyed voicing different characters and could slip into The Hobbit, Dwarf, Elf, Smaug, and, most pleasantly, Gollum on a whim. We finished last night and today I overheard my son singing the song Missy Mountain (I got a few requests to repeat this part and I was able to sing well thanks to YouTube). This experience brought us closer together, and it warms my heart to know how much he valued our Hobbit time every night. Reading chapters of books and novels out loud requires young listeners to use their imagination without directing funny illustrations. When they are able to do so, they are hooked. In the weeks after my husband and I finished reading Charlie and our then-four-year-old daughter's chocolate factory, she brought up various descriptions and scenes. I wondered what other books she was ready for. If you want to start reading chapters of books and novels to your preschooler or kindergarten, go for it. But is there a general plan. (You can't just open war and peace and say, OK, here we go...). Here are some tips: Choose your first novels wisely. Sarah McKenzie, founder of the Read Aloud Revival podcast and author of Read-Aloud Family, says the most important thing to look for is short chapters, lots of dialogue and memorable characters. Some great examples she gives include Pippi Long stocking Astrid Lindgren, a bear called Paddington by Michael Bond, a mouse and a Beverly Cleary motorcycle and a Mrs. Piggle-Wiggle series by Betty McDonald. Here we have collected 14 chapters of books for preschoolers that librarians continue to recommend. Let them fidget. Don't expect your kids to sit there, your legs crossed, your hands on their knees hanging on your every word. Fighting a massive novel is a great effort, but if you look at how to string 10 to 30 minute reading sessions, it's manageable. When going through romances with my daughter, I could read a short chapter and then pick up a separate picture book afterwards, just to mix it up. It's really about traveling with your kids, which shouldn't end once they learn to read. Bibliophiles are right - a book can change your life. Immersing yourself in a fictional story can lead to changes in brain function for up to five days, according to a recent study published in Brain Connectivity. Reading a novel can transport you to the body of the main character. Researchers at Emory University asked students to read Pompeii, a historical thriller about a man who tries to save a woman he loves from the eruption of Vesuvius in 79 AD for 19 days, participants came to the lab for MRI scans of their brain activity. During the first five days, their basic activity was recorded, after which they were instructed to read the novel in sections for nine evenings. In the mornings after they had completed each section, participants showed an increased brain connection in the left temporal cortex, an area associated with language processing. Take the book. It can enlarge your brains. Students also showed an increase in connectivity in one of the sensory areas of the brain's engine. The neural changes we found related to physical sensations and motion systems suggest that reading a novel can transport you to the body of the main character, said neuroscientist Gregory Burns, lead author of the study. We already knew that good stories could put you in someone else's place figuratively. Now we see that something can also happen biologically. Like muscle memory, the brain displayed shady activity caused by reading long after the book was installed. Although the sample was fairly small- only 21 students, no independent control group- change in brain connectivity persisted for several hours after participants had completed their reading assignments, and were still visible during an MRI scan five days after they had finished the novel.
