Your smartphone can double as a voice recorder. Put your phone on the speaker and you can record meetings, lectures and interviews. Google Play has many great apps to record voices, but Cogi rises to the top, recognizing the basic needs of recording speech better than other apps. Cogi - Notes and Voice Registrar Platform: Android Price: Free download of PageSimple tap to the recording and click on the pause interface allows you to record highlights. Can be set to always listen without recording. Can record endlessly until you run out of phone storage. Rewind 5, 15, 30 or 45 seconds with click time, so you grab what was said before you knocked. You click first to start a new session, after which Cogi listens in the background. This dedicated audio clip will also include the last 5, 15, 30 or 45 seconds of audio, depending on what you choose in the app settings. Click again to stop recording. So you can use the app for lengthy recordings without worrying about launching from space, and more importantly, capturing only the bits that you want to listen to later. In addition, he recognizes that the audio does not cover everything in a meeting or lecture, so he has built-in tools to record notes in a session or grab a board with a phone camera. Once you're done, you'll view each highlight separately, or play the entire session. The session can also be marked with labels or assigned contacts from the address book for easy categorization - contacts for your link only if. Each session and individual dedicated audio clips can be renamed and distributed in different services. Perhaps most importantly, Cogi offers it all for free, without any conditions. Where it falls Short Cogi is not without problems. It only records high-quality sound and does not allow you to choose formats or beatrate. It can't save external memory cards. It doesn't sync with cloud services like Dropbox. All of this could lead to a space crisis on phones with limited Memory. In addition, searching by hashtag or contact is a bit confusing and can be easier in the interface. Finally, while notes and photos are fantastic features, they don't carry timestamp for easy references. Teh Teh Hi-I MP3 Voice Recorder (free \$3.99 Full) is your best choice if you want more traditional, free voice recording apps. The simple interface has three clear buttons: Record, Pause, and Made. It only supports the MP3 file format, but you can choose a bitrate to control quality and size. If the camera and phone use different microphones, you can choose whether to use the rear or front microphone; and you can record in stereo. Hi-I also lets you know where your files are stored and the minimum amount of free storage space. You can also start recording from the notification box. If you want to write someone in stealth, you can change the icon to something less suspicious. The only limitation of the free version is that it limits each entry to 10 minutes. The full version has unlimited records as well as a widget for a quick run. If you don't want an MP3, the Easy Voice Recorder (free \$3.99 Pro) has similar features like Hi-I and recordings in AAC, AMR and PCM audio formats. But yes, he has ads. Easy Voice Recorder Pro removes ads, recordings in the stereo, saves external memory cards, supports external microphones, adds folder control and brings notification bar shortcuts, as well as a handy widget. Skyro Voice Recorder (Free - \$1 Pro) is a great app that has nothing that none of the others do: synchronization of cloud storage. Install it from your Dropbox account and it will automatically transfer your records to the cloud; and it can save files for external storage, so you never have to worry about space constraints. Skyro also organizes your notes in chronological order, geo-tags them automatically, and allows you to assign text tags for easy links and searches. In case the app drops, Skyro also automatically saves the record. The Pro version opens up more synchronization options and the ability to install MP3 bitrate. Our previous winner, Tape-a-Talk (free \$1.32 Pro), is still a good voice recorder, especially for its ability to automatically save and repair records if the app falls or your phone shuts down. Those who want high-quality FLAC records, RecForge II (free \$3.99 Pro) is a good app. You can schedule recordings, skip the silent parts, and it has basic sound editing tools too. There are quite a few other recorders on the Play Store such as AL Voice Recorder, Voice PRO (\$13.21), Sound and Voice Recorder - ASR, PCM Recorder, All That Recorder (free \$3.99), Smart Voice Recorder, eRecorder - Voice Memo Recorder, and more. But we believe that one of the aforementioned picks is best for the basic needs of the voice recording application.
