The format of the stories makes the book read quickly, though without losing the ability to give details and depth to the universe and characters, make us empathize with them. Sapkowski also presents traces of some themes that will periodically throughout the rest of the novels, such as: fate, religion, racism, political intrigue, etc. Although, without venturing too deeply into them, it gives context to the book and allows you to see what will happen next. Some of these stories are also a reinterpretation of classic fairy tales and popular legends, told in a twisted and dark side, adapted with great wit and imagination to the world and universe created by the Polish author. Of course, the Last Desire is translated into Spanish, published by Alamut, with a translation by Jose Maria Faraldo. There are currently two editions, a hardcover collection with a cover by Alejandro Colucci and a new edition, published in 2019, in paperback with lapels, with a cover inspired by the Netflix series. Who may be interested, although the last wish is a collection of stories by the sorcerer and that the main plot of the saga begins in the third novel, it is a fundamental and utterly recommended reading to understand the saga, as it serves as an introduction to this fantastic universe in addition to presenting the relevant characters and facts that will have a lot of weight in the rest of the novels, being necessary for those who want to make a point in this magnificent job. The first Polish edition was published in 1993 and the first in Spanish, in 2002, and was translated into several languages. The anthology uses the technique of framed storytelling and in which six fairy tales are combined by the seventh narrative, interspersed between them. In 2003, he won the Ignotus Award for Best Anthology. Argument This anthology consists of seven (7) stories. Geralt de Rivia, injured in the fight against Estrige de Vizima, rests in the temple. During this time he has memories of the last events in his life, each of which forms a story in his own.
