Answer: Colossians 1:27 is a powerful verse: God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. Let us begin by clarifying that the Apostle Paul writes to believers in Jesus Christ, the you from which he addresses. He calls them the lord's people in the previous verse (Colossians 1:26). The nice guys are non-Jews. A mystery in the New Testament is simply something that was hidden in the past, but has now been revealed by God. The ancient mystery, now understood, is that Christ in us is the hope of our future glory. In the Old Testament, the Holy Spirit came across some people to give them the means to serve, but he returned. New Testament believers have a different experience, because the Spirit lives in us all the time. The permanent indwelling of the Holy Spirit given to New Testament believers was a mystery for Old Testament saints. After Jesus ascended to heaven, He sent the Holy Spirit to live in us, never to leave (John 14:16-17; 16:7). Jesus said to his disciples, On this day you will realize that I am in my Father ... and I am in you (John 14:20). The Holy Spirit seals us for the day of redemption (Ephesians 4:30). In other words, the presence of the Spirit in our hearts guarantees our ultimate salvation. Although we are in this world, we are not (John 17:16). God will continue to work in us until He has finished perfecting us (see Philippians 1:6). This forward-looking guarantee of perfection is what is meant by Christ in you, the hope of glory. The translation of J.B. Phillips of Colossians 1:27 says it this way: The secret is simply this: Christ in you! Yes, Christ by bringing you with him the hope of all the glorious things to come. The hope of glory is the fulfillment of God's promise to restore us and all the Romans 8:19-21 and 1 Peter 5:10). This hope is not a pious thought, but the confident, expectant and joyful knowledge that we are changed by God and that we will one day see Christ face to face, having been consistent with His image (Romans 8:29; 1 John 3:2). The hope of glory includes our resurrection: If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of His Spirit that lives in you (Romans 8:11). He understands a heavenly legacy: In his great mercy, he gave us new birth in a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and in a legacy that can never perish, spoil or fade. This legacy is kept in heaven for you (1 Peter 1:3-4). The Spirit of Christ in us is the guarantee our heritage (Ephesians 1:14). The presence of Christ in us is the hope of glory, and this truth is full of glorious riches. Our once dead and dark spirits are made alive. Christ is in our hearts, and we know that there is life beyond this earthly existence, a life that will be glorious beyond all imagination. To whom God would let know what are the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; who is Christ in you, the hope of glory (Colossians 1:27). The Christian is not a religious man, but a man in whom the fullness of Deity resides. If you are born again, God dwells in you. This should give you a new state of mind and confidence in life. There is a big difference between us today — the new creation — and the people of the Old Testament. God's plan was to be in them, but they could not enter his rest because of disbelief. When Jesus came, He came as Emmanuel, which means God with us, and so was with them until his crucifixion. After his resurrection, and the arrival of the Holy Spirit, the new creation-the Church saw the and now He lives in us by the Spirit. Hallelujah! He is no longer Emmanuel, God with us, but God in us. God was with the prophets of ancient times, but He is more than with us today. He is in us. It is the mystery that has been hidden for centuries and generations, but which has now manifested itself to its saints. This mystery is: is: in you, the hope of glory. So how do I know that my life is going to be glorious; because Christ is in me! This is my hope for a healthy, prosperous, dynamic and successful life! It is my confidence that I will never be defeated in life. The Bible says, When He died, I died with Him; when he was buried, I was buried with Him; and when God raised him from the dead, I was raised with Him. And now that I have been raised with Him, and made to sit with Him in the heavenly realms, no more death; no more defeat; more disease in Him, I live now and forever! Hallelujah. Remember, you are not an ordinary person; you belong to a special class of divine beings: Christ in you species! It is your hope for the transcendent life of the miraculous. Further study: Romans 8:10; Colossians 3:1-4 If you are a believer, Christ is in you! But do you know that it is in you as your hope for glory? In Colossians 1:27 Paul says: To whom God has the will to make known what are the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles, who is Christ in you, the hope of glory. What does it mean for Christ in you to be your hope of glory? It's definitely a mystery. But it is a mystery that God wants to make known... and not just to the privileged few, but to all believers in Christ. Why should you care? If your hope is elsewhere, for a better beyond that, you may find yourself waiting for years and missing out on what Christ wants to do in you today. But if you realize that He is such a hope that is now in you — a seed of divine glory — you might be encouraged to cooperate with Him for the growth and development of this divine seed. So, in this post, I will consider this mysterious hope and discover how Christ in you is your hope of glory in three stages. I will also reflect on how you can live this hope today. First, Christ becomes your inner hope of glory by regenerating your spirit In 1 Peter 1:3 Peter says: Blessed to be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who, according to His great mercy, has regenerated us in a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. What does this mean by we regenerated to a living hope? Footnote 4 on this verse in the recovery version says: Regeneration, as redemption and justification, is an aspect of God's complete salvation. Redemption and justification solve our problem with God and reconcile us with God; regeneration animates us with the life of God, bringing us into a life relationship, an organic union, God. Therefore, regeneration problems and results in a living hope. Such regeneration is accomplished by the resurrection of Christ from the dead. The resurrection of Christ, bringing the life and gift of the Spirit that gives life, is the one that potents the new birth to a living hope (Alford). So the first question you should yourself: Is Christ in me? If you believe in His name and confess that He is your Lord, He will immediately come into you as the divine seed to be your hope of glory. If you have not already done so, just pray: Lord Jesus, I believe you are the eternal Son of God who has become a sinless man, who died on the cross for my sins, and who rose from the dead to become a Spirit who gives life. Lord, I receive you as my Savior and my life. Come into my mind, regenerate me with Your divine life. Become my hope of glory. Lord, I love you. If you prayed to receive the Lord Jesus, He, as the seed of divine life, came into your mind as the life of glory, a life full of hope. This hope is similar to the hope that parents have for their newborns. They hope that their child will grow normally, develop and mature. Now that you have received the life of glory, Christ in you, you simply need to let it grow! Second, Christ gradually spreads his life of glory by transforming your soul After being regenerated by receiving the Lord Jesus, you must cooperate with His continuous work of transformation. In 2 Corinthians 3:18 Paul says, But we all have the face revealed, revealing and reflecting as a mirror the glory of the Lord, are transformed into the same image of glory in glory, even as of the Spirit of the Lord. Note 7 on this verse says: When we with the face unveiled are to see and reflect the glory of the Lord, He infuses us with the elements of what He is and what He has done. Thus, we are metabolically transformed to have its life form by its life power with its essence of life; that is, we are transfigured, mainly by the renewal of our spirit (Rom. 12:2), in His image. Transformation indicates that we are transforming. This process of transformation is an operation of a lifetime of Christ like the divine seed that spreads throughout your soul. As you see day after day, hour by hour and at the same time at times, Christ will transform you into His image from one degree of glory to another. One of my favorite hymns is about coming to the Lord to see him. It is good to train to come to the Lord every day, especially in the morning, just to see him in His word through prayer. For more appreciation of transformation and how to experience it, you can enjoy reading, The amazing process of transformation as revealed in the Bible. Finally, Christ will be the glory expressed from within you to the transfiguration of your body into Philippians. 3:21 Paul says, Who transfigures the body of our humiliation to conform to the body of His according to his operation by which He is able even to subject all things to Himself. Note 1 on this verse says: The transfiguration of our body is the ultimate consumption of God's salvation. In His God of Salvation regenerated our mind (John 3:6), now transforms our soul (Rm 12,2), and transfigures our bodies in consummate ways, making us the same as Christ in the three parts of our being. To review the point of this post, I will leave you with some stanzas and the chorus of an anthem that I enjoyed about Christ as the hope of glory, 1 Myst'ry hidden for centuries now revealed to me, This is the reality of Christ of God. He embodies God, and he is life for me, and the glory of my hope, he will be. Chorus Glory, glory, Christ is life in me! Glory, glory, what hope is it! Now, in my mind, it is the mystery! Then the glory That He will be for me. 2 In my mind, he has regenerated me, In my soul he transforms

me now. He will change my body like his, doing me the same thing as Him. From this post, I hope you will be impressed to pursue a progressive experience of Christ as your hope of glory, to focus on Him as the seed of glory in you and to let him grow every day until you meet him upon his return.
