(WHSV) – Shenandoah County Public Schools (SCPS) will open August 31st with completely virtual training for all students for at least the first nine weeks of the 2020-2021 school year, according to a news release from SCPS. The health and safety of our staff, our students and their families has always been our highest priority, said Superintendent Mark Johnston. After consulting the School Board, although not unanimous, the majority support that this is the only way to safely open our school community safe and healthy. According to the SCPS, COVID-19 data will be monitored daily and the school board's decision will be re-evaluated weekly. The earliest return to a mixed learning model with some learning about a person would be at the 9-week mark, but the school board says that parents will be given at least two to three weeks' advance before the official change. I know that it will be difficult for many families, but our number one goal is to keep our school community safe and healthy. On July 9, the Shenandoah County School Board adopted a phase three plan resume that included opportunities for some in-person learning along with virtual learning. Johnston said that since then the number of infections, hospitalizations and deaths in Shenandoah County remains a concern. COVID-19 data will be monitored daily and the decision will be assessed on a weekly basis. Are they left behind? It works for older children, but what about the little ones that are already behind, and this is their only option bc they've aged out of public assistance? Preschool class offers many unique conditions and toy exchange is definitely a concern. The CDC recommends they don't share toys unless they are washed and sanitized before they are moved from one group to another. We will be sure to work with Mrs. Mingle (and all teachers) to implement appropriate procedures that protect the student's health while maintaining appropriate learning environment. What is the purpose of sending out surveys if the school is not going to take our feedback? The main objective of the recent survey, which asked about the different options for the next school year, was to help us plan possible at some point in the school year. Why does it have to decide to be one way or another directly? One way or the other? Why can't you be offered the option of x days of weekly physical attendance and x amount of virtual or e-learning? Other countries have this model for various reasons. At this time, the DOE and henry county health board believe that five days a week is the best option. We are preparing for other options if they become necessary, but hope to have a thermometer so it's just about the honor system. Don't temp check at the door or something? The DOE does not recommend daily temperature checks for everyone because it creates a log yam in which health individuals could be inadvertently exposed and could contribute to other safety hazards. They recommend home screening so that individuals take their temperature and check for symptoms every day before graduation. We are all together and we have to rely on each other to do our part. My only concern is that we will close the school for two weeks every time a child has a cough and a fever? They'll probably do E-learning all winter if that's the case! I hope they're just close if there is an actual POSITIVE case, not just a supposedly positive because of a cough or fever. Decisions on whether part of the school or all schools will be closed will be made in consultation with the local health department as part of the contact and track case investigation. These decisions will depend on how many students were cohorts and individual movements. The CDC says schools may need to close for 2 to 5 days, but the case investigation will ultimately determine the most appropriate course of action. Here are instructions from the Department of Education on symptoms: If a student should be sent home and presumably covid until the healthcare provider detects the disease caused by something else and makes a note. The CDC requires students to be excluded from school if they test positive for COVID-19 or exhibit one or more symptoms... this is not otherwise explained. This will depend on the individual situation, but the cold should not lead to the need to be out of school for 10 days. So if we have a note from our children's doctor stating that they should not wear a mask, then you will honor that and allow them to come to school? Not all parents can stay at home and homeschool their children, but we also don't want our kids to take any risk from wearing... it's losing, losing.. so what do you recommend? We followed the guidelines set out in the Indiana Department of Health, henry county health department, and CDC. The Department of Education encourages parents (children who may not be able to wear a mask for health reasons) to talk to their health care provider about whether returning to school is personally medically appropriate. I'm required to know what action the mask should wear all day. Is school work? Waking up to the medicine? Etc. I'm asthmatic. Also, can they wear fabric masks? Students with health needs who may not be able to wear a mask whenever they can't socially in the distance. Yes, fabric masks are ok. What about lunch and specials for elementary school? Will they be kept in a normal way? Is done in class? Each building will have to make adjustments. You want to check with Dr. Kinsey (bkinsey@shenandoah.k12.in.us) to get specific information about elementary. Not sure if this is the best place to ask questions or not, but is it possible to start school online and then move to school later? If we wanted to pilot online for a while and then decided to send our kids to school later, is that an option? It's not really logistically possible to go back and forth, so we'll ask for a semester commitment from high school students. Where can we find information about how the online option will work? This information will be sent out later this week (week 13 July). Will there be more specific information omitted? Most schools got 12+ pages of information becomes available, the state will send updates. Will the school provide my child with a mask? Parents should plan to have fabric masks as part of their back-to-school supplies. Schools will have face coverings available to office students, but supplies will be limited. I don't want to wear a mask, do I have to wear it? We know that there are strong opinions on the use of masks. The Indiana State Department of Health cited a 40-60% reduction in COVID-19 transmission when masks are used by everyone, so we request them for a few servings a day. This is particularly important as some carriers of COVID-19, expose school staff and adults at home who may be more at risk. What happens if my child has covid symptoms?
